Just Keep Swimming owner, Melanie Stanbury says, "The kids improve so quickly over the two weeks, coming each day and having the opportunity to keep practicing the skills they are learning is such an advantage. We often have kids who are visiting grand-parents or other family, and friends enrol in these lessons. It has become a ritual for many families."

Trial Opens For Farm Firefighting Tool

Farmers are encouraged to nominate their vehicles to take part in a fresh trial now underway to help first responders fight bushfires.

As of Friday, private farm vehicles used for firefighting purposes known as Farm Fire Units – or Farm Fire Fighting Vehicles (FFFVs) – can be used unregistered under certain conditions, as part of a NSW Government trial in place until 31 March.

NSW Farmers Business Economics and Trade Committee Chair John Lowe said the scheme had come as welcome news to farmers across the state, who relied on Farm Fire Units to respond to bushfires quickly and effectively.

"Stopping fires as soon as we can is essential, and Farm Fire Units play a key role in these firefighting efforts in rural communities," Mr Lowe said.

"These vehicles are often first on the scene to fight a fire, and so there's no underestimating just how essential they are to first responders during bushfire season in NSW.

"Farmers need to be able to use these vehicles legally on the road when moving between farms and under the protection of third-party insurance, and we hope that through this trial, we can secure a permanent solution to make that possible."

With bushfire season now well and truly underway, Mr Lowe urged farmers in NSW to nominate eligible vehicles to participate in the trial before it concluded on 31 March. "If you've got a vehicle that's in a safe operating condition and has firefighting equipment permanently attached, then we strongly encourage you to nominate it for the trial as soon as possible," Mr Lowe said.

To nominate a vehicle for the trial, submit the digital form and declare that your vehicle is in a safe operating condition at https://www.transport.nsw.gov.au/farm-fire-fighting-vehicle-nomination.

Chase Milton Living Life In The Fast Lane

Local Cargo based competitive Junior Kart Racer, Chase Milton is living life in the fast lane on the back of a successful, yet challenging 2024 season.

This year saw Chase progress into the Junior category and into a larger and more powerful kart. In the first few race meets of the year, Chase managed reasonable pace in the mid packs but constantly struggled for rear grip. Investigation revealed a bent chassis, and once this was replaced Chase got a feel for how the kart should really behave and started to challenge for podiums.

Chase entered his first ever Karting Australia event in Albury, which attracts drivers from across the eastern states of Australia. In the qualifying session Chase managed to qualify second which was really promising, and finished that first event in fourth place. Since then, Chase has competed in a further five Karting Australia events in Albury and Dubbo, finding himself in the top three at every event.

Unfortunately, things did not go to plan for Chase in the NSW 2024 State Titles at Manning Valley, but he was really happy with his efforts at a track he had never been to before. Fighting for second place in the final, Chase had a mechanical failure which dropped him back to fifth place.

Another great result for 2024 was second

place in the NSW Junior Southern Stars Series, which consists of five rounds. This was a tough class, and coming second in the series was a massive effort. Chase has also achieved four first, three second and two thrid place podium finishes, and a large number of quickest laps recorded against some tough competitors mostly from Sydney and the larger cities.

Chase is excited and confident heading into 2025 and has his eye set on winning the Australian Junior Kart Title. However, to progress to this level of competition Chase will need to attract some major sponsors. He will be up against kids from all over Australia who have huge race teams.

"This competition is the feeder to a career in either V8 Supercars or Formula 1 which has been my dream since I could hold a steering wheel," said Chase.

"I am really proud of what just my dad and I have achieved so far. I really appreciated everyone's support throughout this year and in helping get me to a point in my career where I can start racing some of the best in Australia. Thanks to everyone who helped out"
