Developmental/Intellectual Disability Services generally refers to services provided for individuals living with disabilities characterized by significant limitations both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and adaptive behavior during the developmental period or prior to the age of 18.

Help ADMH

- Support individual in their communities where friends and families are located.
- Assist individuals with obtaining employment.
- Increase opportunities for independent living.
- Encourage community integration.
- Provide services before individuals are in crisis.

Services that best support people in their home & community, including but not limited to:

- Residential, Day, and Respite (In and Out of the Home)
- Remote Supports, Companion Services, Personal Care, and Supported Living
- Assistive Technology, Employment Services, and Self-directed Services
