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

### **A Landmark Report**



High-quality, patient-centered health care for all will require remodeling many aspects of the health care system, especially nursing.



### Key Message #1



Nurses should be able to practice to full extent of their education and training.



### Key Message #2



Nurses should achieve higher levels of education and training through an improved education system that promotes seamless academic progression.



### Key Message #3



Nurses should be full partners, with physicians and other health professionals, in redesigning health care in the United States.




