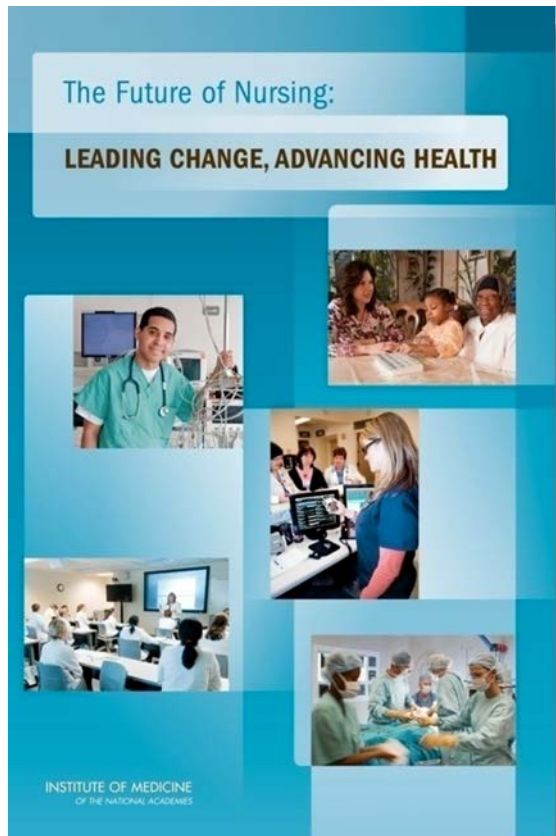

# Key Message #1



Nurses should be able to practice to full extent of their education and training.



# Key Message #2



Nurses should achieve higher levels of education and training through an improved education system that promotes seamless academic progression.



# Key Message #3



Nurses should be full partners, with physicians and other health professionals, in redesigning health care in the United States.



# Key Message #4



Effective workforce planning and policy-making require better data collection and an improved information infrastructure.

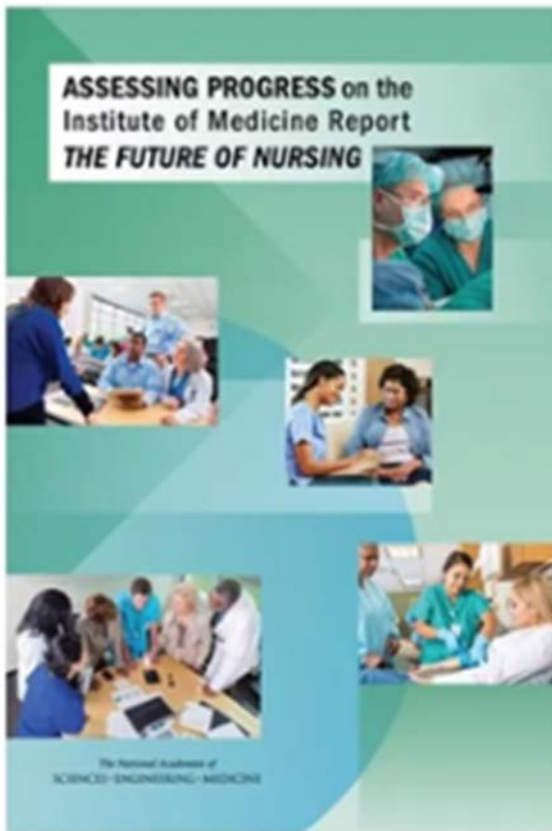
