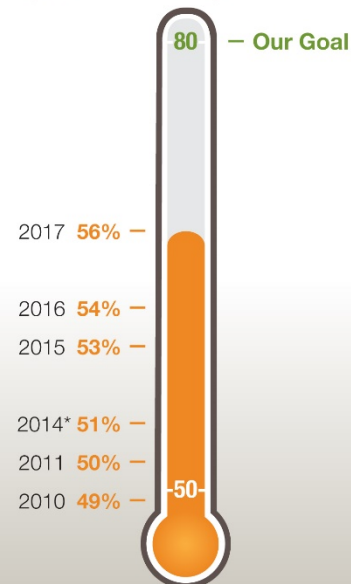

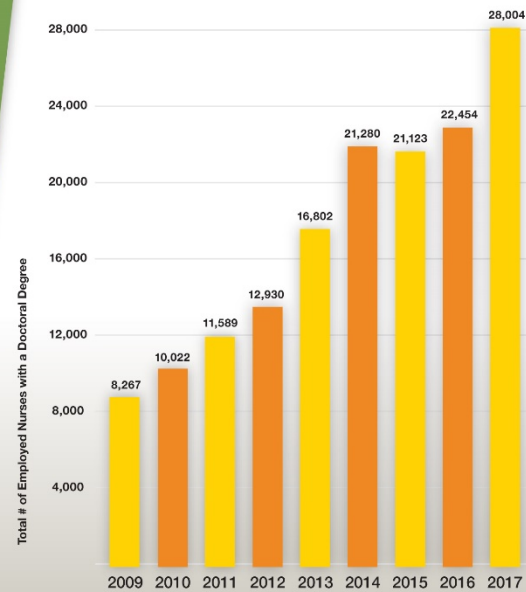
Indicator 2: Doctoral Degrees

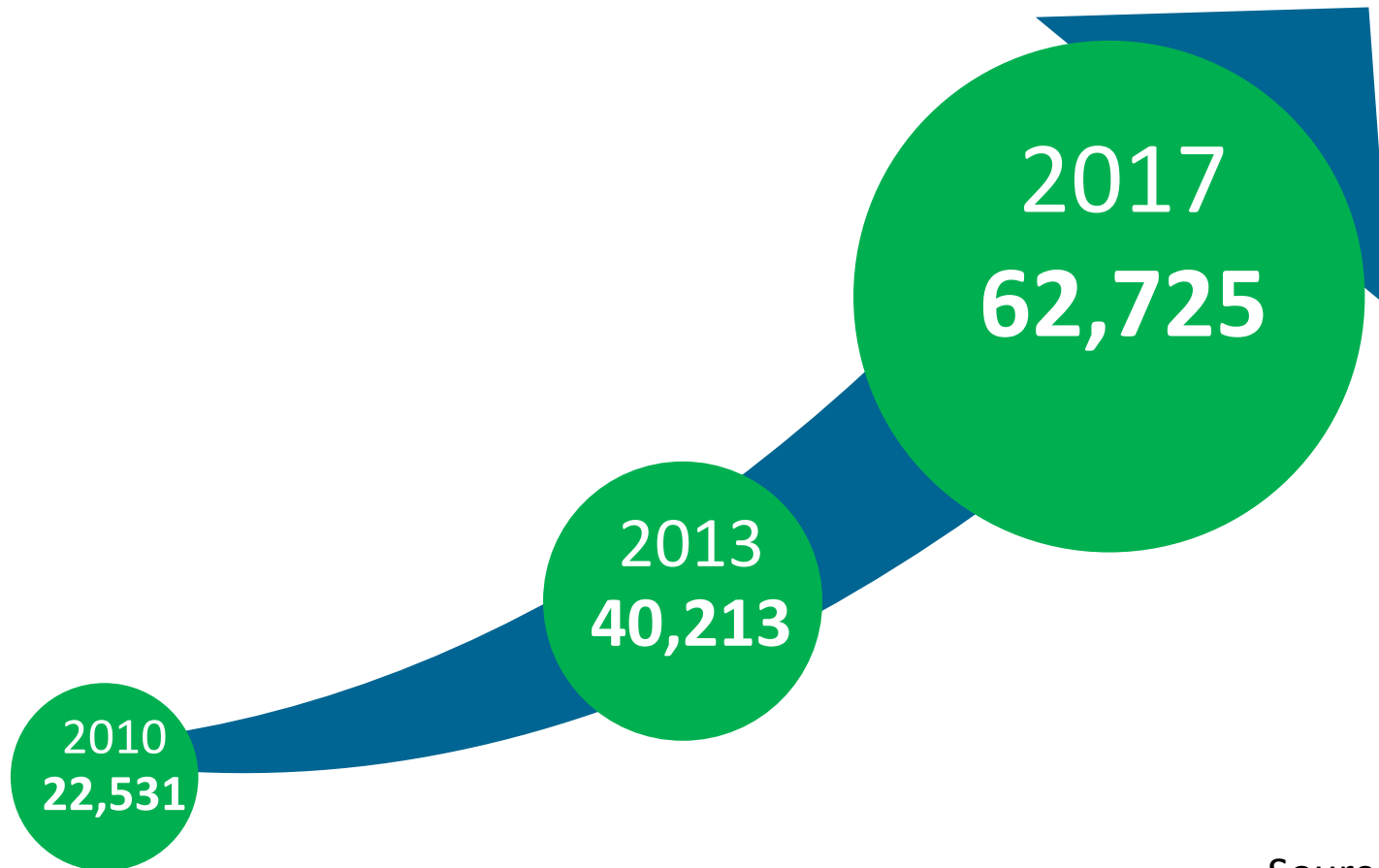
Number of employed nurses with a doctoral degree

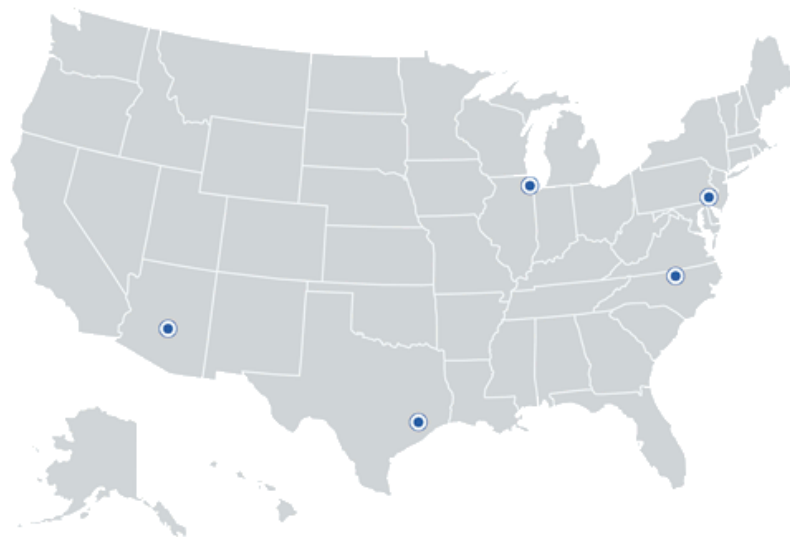
Graduate Nurse Education Demonstration

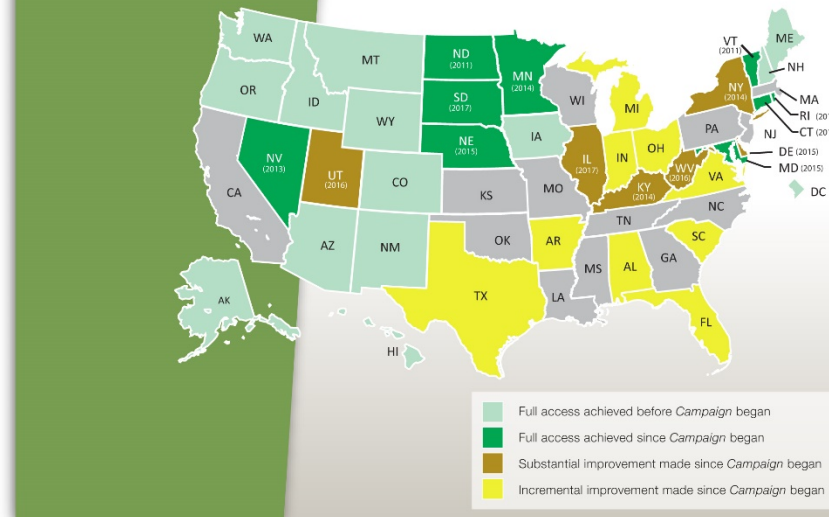

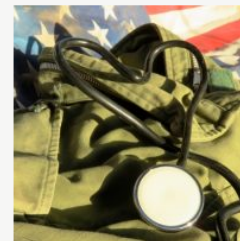

Big Win for Veterans: VA Lifts Restrictions on Nurses



The Department of Veterans Affairs has issued a final ruling on the proposal to allow advanced practice registered nurses to provide care to the full extent of their education and training to veterans in VA facilities.

The ruling on a proposal made early this year allows nurse practitioners, certified nurse-midwives, and clinical nurse specialists full practice authority. However, it does not allow certified registered nurse anesthetists (CRNAs) full practice authority, a part of the original proposal.

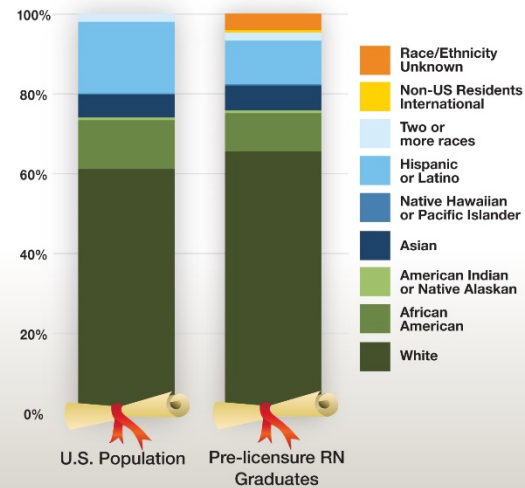

IOM Recommendation:
Make diversity in the nursing workforce a priority

Pre-licensure registered nursing program graduates by race/ethnicity and by gender compared with the U.S. population



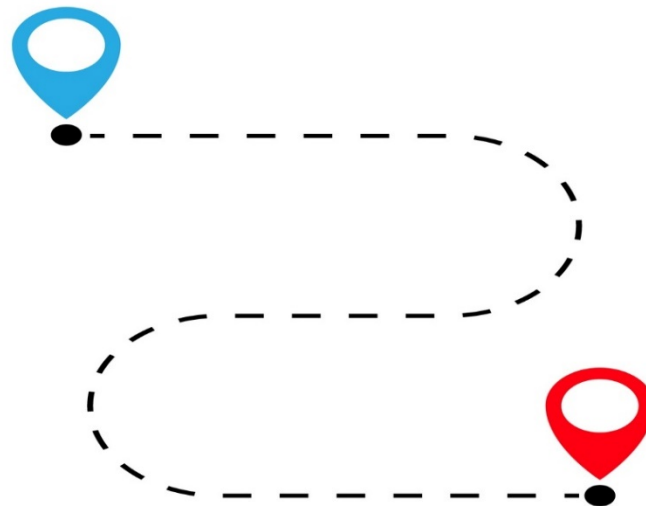
In the U.S., the female/male population is **50.8% female** and **49.2% male**.
In 2017, pre-licensure RN program graduates were **85.6% female** and **14.1% male**.
