### **COLLABORATIVE ONGOING NAM PROJECTS: CIAC AND CIAC-RELATED**

*Collaborative projects are intended to: 1) identify issues of common interest and marshal needed leadership; 2) develop tools and networks needed for progress; and 3) develop joint leadership possibilities through individually-authored Perspective papers. Ongoing activities include:*

- *Community Health Needs Assessments Principles & Practices:* An NAM Working Group is developing a Special Publication to describe the emerging principles of the community health improvement process; how these principles can be used to further the goals of health equity; and opportunities for transformative assessment and improvement in population health that include perspectives from all stakeholders, including health systems, public health departments, and the community.
- *Technologies to Enhance Person, Family, & Community Activation:* An NAM Working Group comprising leadership from key stakeholder sectors to identify, prioritize, and advise on key issues related to the potential of technologies to make care more patient-centered, equitable, accessible and convenient for patients, while enhancing the quality of medical decisions. The Working Group is in the process of writing two NAM discussion papers on related sub-topics. January 17, 2019 [meeting summary](#).
- *Assessing Meaningful Community Engagement in Health & Health Care:* With support from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, this collaborative project seeks to review existing measures for evaluating community engagement in health care program and policy decision-making at the system, local, state, and nation levels and to establish a process for identifying an indicator or set of indicators that can be used to measure community engagement in a wide range of settings.

### **CIAC-RELATED COLLABORATIVE PROJECTS UNDER CONSIDERATION**

- The Leadership Consortium's stewardship of collaborative initiatives is dependent on: 1) the importance of the issue; 2) the interest and commitment of participants to take active roles; 3) the involvement of multiple organizations; and 4) clearly identified advantage for the Academies' role as facilitator.
