### **I. SITUATION OVERVIEW**

#### **A. CHRONOLOGY AND TRACKING**

##### **23 December 2019**

At 5:00 AM, Tropical Storm (TS) "PHANPHONE" entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (AOR) and was named "URSULA". It slightly intensified as it moves west-northwestward towards Eastern Visayas with maximum sustained winds of up to 85 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 105 kph.

##### **24 December 2019**

TS "URSULA" slightly decelerated while moving west-northwestward. It intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) with maximum sustained winds of up to 95 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 115 kph and affecting the Northeastern Mindanao and Eastern Visayas, Bicol Region, and portions of Central Visayas. STS "URSULA" intensified further into a Typhoon (TY) as it endangers Eastern Visayas with maximum sustained winds of up to 120 - 130 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 150-200 kph. The eyewall of TY "URSULA" brought very destructive winds and intense rainfall to the area. However, the passage of the eye in some areas brought calm condition but as soon as the eye moves out of the area, violent conditions will resume as the trailing eyewall passes.

##### **25 December 2019**

TY "URSULA" was now over the Visayan Sea and was headed towards the northeastern Iloilo area. It maintained its strength while moving generally westward off the coast of Capiz with maximum sustained winds of 140 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 195 kph. At 11:00 PM, "URSULA" slightly weakened while moving west-northwestward towards the West Philippine Sea.

## 26 December 2019

TY "URSULA" slightly weakened as it moved west-northwestward over the West Philippine Sea with maximum sustained winds of up to 120 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 150 km/h. At 11:00 PM, "URSULA" slightly maintained its strength as it continues to move away from Luzon and no longer causing significant heavy rainfall across any part of the country. However, the surge of the Northeast Monsoon and the formation of a tail-end of a cold front brought light to moderate with intermittent heavy rains over Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, Aurora, and Quezon.

## 27 December 2019

At 5:00 PM, "URSULA" weakened into an STS and was no longer directly affecting the country. However, the Tail-End of a Cold Front brought moderate to occasionally heavy rains over most of Northern Luzon and Aurora. This may trigger flooding and rain-induced landslides, especially in areas that are highly to very highly susceptible to these hazards.

## 28 December 2019

At 5:00 AM, "URSULA" weakened into TS and exited the Philippine AOR at 9:50 AM with maximum sustained winds of up to 65 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h.

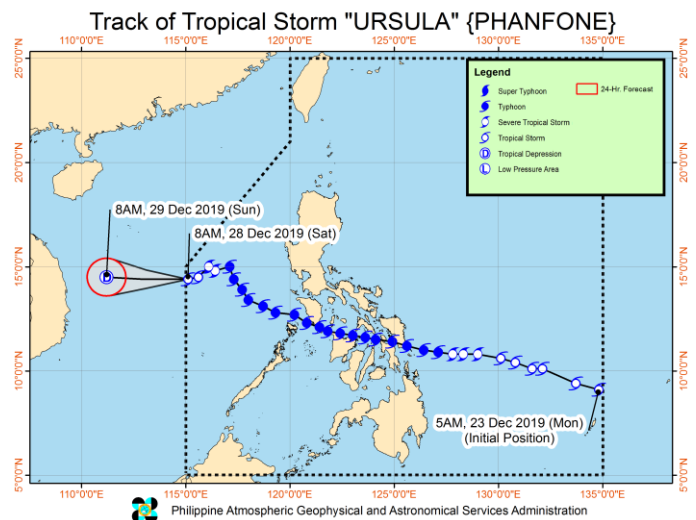
## B. TROPICAL CYCLONE ANALYSIS

An LPA outside the PAR was developed on 19 December 2019 southeast of Micronesia. Owing to the favorable environment, the system developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) on 21 December 2019 while moving westward along the southern periphery of an STR. On 22 December 2019, the system intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) and was given the international name "PHANFONE".

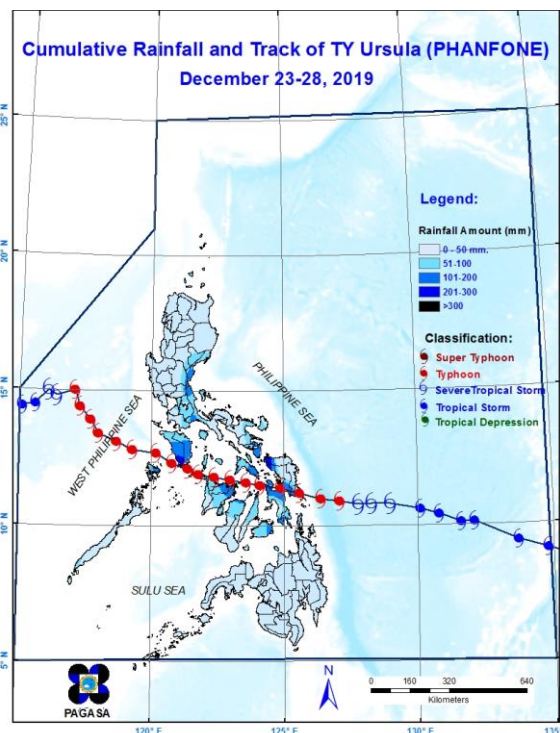
On 23 December 2019, "PHANFONE" entered the Philippine AOR and was named "URSULA". "URSULA" slightly intensified as it moves west-northwest towards Eastern Visayas. The environment was favorable for continued development.

On the morning of 24 December 2019, "URSULA" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) as it continues to move closer to the eastern Visayas. At 2:00 PM on the same day, the system further intensified into a Typhoon (TY). At 4:45 PM, "URSULA" made its first landfall over Salcedo, Eastern Samar. At 7:30 PM, it made its second landfall over Tacloban City, Leyte. At 9:15 PM, it made its third landfall over Cabugcayan, Biliran.

At 2:00 AM on 25 December 2019, "URSULA" made its fourth landfall over Gigantes Islands, Carles, Iloilo. "URSULA" continued to move westward and it made its fifth landfall over Ibajay, Aklan at 8:40 AM. At 1:00 PM, it made its sixth landfall over Caluya Island, Antique. The system made its seventh landfall over the southern tip of



Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro at 3:00 PM before heading towards the west Philippine sea.



On 26 December 2019, the system slightly weakened. because of the cooler sea surface temperature, dry air entrainment is associated with the cold surge. The system continues to move away from Luzon and is tracking along the southern periphery of a subtropical ridge.

On 27 December 2019, because of the unfavorable environment, “URSULA” weakened into an STS. On 28 December 2019, “URSULA” further weakened into a TS and exited the PAR. The system weakened further into a TD as it drifts towards Vietnam. Strong winds and heavy rains caused by Ursula were experienced over Visayas and some parts of southern Luzon.

DOST-PAGASA issued a total of 30 Severe Weather Bulletins, 22 International Warning for Shipping, and 2 Tropical Cyclone Advisories for “URSULA”.

## II. EFFECTS

### C. Incidents Monitored

#### FIRE INCIDENT

1. On 24 December 2019, 8:57 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. 66, Paseo de Legaspi, Tacloban City. Investigation revealed that an unattended candle due to a power outage caused the incident. A total of 24 families/99 persons were affected while a total of 10 residential houses made of light materials were damaged. The affected families temporarily stayed in Anibong Elementary School in Brgy. Anibong, Tacloban City. One person was reported injured due to 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> degree flare burns.

#### CAPSIZED INCIDENTS

2. On 25 December 2019, 3:45 AM, a motorbanca named “MARVIN KRISTOPHER” with 14 crew, capsized in the vicinity of Brgy. Maujao, Bulalacao, Oriental Mindoro due to strong winds. The 3 crew members were reported dead while the 11 others managed to swim towards the coast of Brgy. Maujao.

3. On 25 December 2019, 11:00 AM, fishing boats namely “ATHAN 3” and “ATHAN 4” were last seen in the vicinity of Brgy. Caminawit, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro with three (3) personnel on board. The said fishing boats were believed to have been damaged during the onslaught of “TY URSULA” and three (3) personnel were reported missing. One (1) victim was found dead in the vicinity waters of Brgy. Ansiray, Ilin, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro while the two (2) other victims were still missing.

4. On 25 December 2019, a fishing boat was reported capsized in the vicinity waters of Odiongan, Romblon with six (6) fishermen on board and residents of Brgy. Maybato, San Jose, Antique. All victims were rescued by MDRRMC San Jose.

5. On 25 December 2019, a fishing boat named Kristel Joy (Trawl Fishing) with seven (7) crew members was reported capsized in the vicinity waters of Brgy. Manlot Island, Carles, Iloilo. One (1) crew member was reported dead while trying to secure their boat.

6. On 25 December 2019, a fishing boat named Reyziel (Trawl Fishing) with two (2) personnel on board was reported capsized in the vicinity waters of Brgy. Pantalan, Binuluangn Island, Carles, Iloilo. The said victims were reported missing while trying to secure the boat.

8. On 25 December 2019, 12:00 PM, the victim was trying to repair his house when accidentally hit by a falling branch of a tree which caused his sudden death.

9. On 25 December 2019, 12:00 PM, the victim was seen inside his house when "URSULA" hit Brgy. Bubog, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro. At 6:30 PM on the same day, the victim was found lifeless by his father, covered by debris of the damaged house due to "TY URSULA".

- Provided constant updates, advisories, and information to all DILG ROs and FOs regarding the development of TS URSULA through texts and emails.

## 4. Department of Social and Welfare Development (DSWD)
