- Information below was gathered by an extensive review of <u>content</u> presented in 47 websites promoting NH Rail Trails. The sole purpose of the lines presented below is to help the reviewer see what <u>content</u> could be placed in their website. How this list is organized might be of help also.
- Typical website navigational structure involves a hierarchical navigation so your site's content should be organized in an intuitive manner easily understood.
- It is best to keep the first tier navigation items as few as possible (they are in red below). Subsequent navigation tiers will be increasingly more specific.
- Most websites have their own unique organizational/navigational idiosyncrasies in addition to these baseline options presented below. Please consider what is presented here as a good starting point since other Rail Trail groups have considered these entries of value.
