Introduction

The National Open University of Nigeria is an Open and Distance Learning (ODL) institution renowned for providing functional, flexible, accessible, costeffective education adequate for flourishing in the 21st century and beyond. Right from our inception in July, 1983, our mandate has remained to deliver quality university education at the doorstep of every interested Nigerian. The government of Nigeria envisioned a university with the capacity to admit and meet the education and skill needs of citizens no matter their status and circumstances. Driving this vision was the realisation that a sustainable democracy, functional economy, happy and prosperous people depend on knowledgeable citizens. Meeting the educational needs of such citizens in a highly populous country like Nigeria was beyond the capacity of Nigeria's brick and mortar higher institutions.

For some reasons, the Act establishing the University was suspended on 25th April, 1984 by the then Federal Military Government. It was resuscitated in 2002 by the civilian government headed by former President, Chief Olusegun Obasanjo. As a faithful trustee of the Nigerian people, NOUN leverages on Information and Communication Technology (ICT) to deliver an education tailored towards the globalised economy as it offers exceptional academic programmes that meet the specific needs of all sectors of the global economy, in the Arts, Education, Health, Law, Physical, Social, Agricultural and Management Sciences.

As an ODL institution poised to ensuring equal educational opportunity, the university is determined to meet the following objectives that necessitated its establishment in Nigeria. To:

• make provision for Education for All and promotion of lifelong learning;

- fill the gap created by the closure of outreaches/satellite campuses;
- provide cost-effective education;
- ensure improved economies of scale;
- ensure flexibility of instructional delivery system.
- ensure maximum utilisation of academic personnel;
- provide on-the-job teacher training opportunity;
- eradicate poverty and provide vocational and lifelong education;
- provide functional non-formal education;
- change national orientation towards better patriotism among the citizenry.


NOUN does not offer part-time programme, rather it provides flexible and full-time study to learners. The regulation in the University permits students to carry full-time course credit load. The minimum period required for a first degree with Unified Matriculation Examination qualifications is eight (8) semesters, or six (6) semesters if the student is admitted with NCE, or A'Level equivalent qualifications.

The postgraduate work can also be carried out fulltime by carrying a full load per semester or flexible at your own pace. The period for the flexible mode is usually three (3) semesters or six (6) semesters.

All our academic programmes are subject to the accreditation profiling of the National Universities Commission (NUC).

FOREWORD



For people who have kept tabs with the goings on in NOUN as the largest open and distance learning university, not only in Nigeria, in West Africa sub-region and indeed Africa as a whole, you must have discovered that there is a whole hog of developments within the last one year. History was made on 11th February, 2021 when I took over the mantle of leadership as the Vice-Chancellor from Professor Abdalla Uba Adamu.

Since then, we have mapped out strategies towards consolidating the achievements recorded by the immediate and previous administrations and reinvigorated the system to ensure that we achieve further milestones which would set us apart as a leading open and distance learning institution.

In my maiden interview, I had promised to improve student enrolment to achieve a mark of one million (1,000,000) before leaving office in 2026 by ensuring students' satisfaction and staff welfare are made a top priority. We shall ensure at least 75 percent of the flagship programmes identified by the immediate past Vice-Chancellor are delivered through online delivery model; improving the literacy level of all Nigerians wherever they are and also to train them to acquire more skills in various trades leading to award of certification, diplomas, degrees and PhD. The presence of Africa Centre of Excellence for Technology Enhanced Learning (ACETEL) in NOUN shall be tapped for the benefit of not only NOUN, but Nigeria and indeed the African continent. ACETEL shall be mandated to develop necessary software protocols that will help us to understand more science concepts not just for our own undergraduates but also at post-secondary school level. This administration is determined to improve staff welfare through enhanced allowances, training and development of NOUN staff. On training, it has been observed that many staff (both academic and non-academics) don't really know what ODL is all about, they don't understand the concept of ODL, they don't know what our relationship with our students should be, they don't know what the students expect of us/them. Effort will be made to give training of staff a priority attention. In the same vein, we shall vigorously improve student enrolment through implementation of the recommendations contained in the NEEDS Assessment Survey championed by the Governing Council Chair, Professor Emeritus Peter A. Okebukola. These promises have started yielding fruits as the number of fresh and returning students who registered during the 2022 1 semester stood at one hundred and six thousand eight hundred and six (106,826) as at 30th April, 2022 up from ninety-eight thousand five hundred and fifty-five (98,555) in the 2021 2 semester showing an appreciable increase of thirty thousand five hundred and one (30,501) i.e. $(106,806 - \{98,555-$ 22,250}). This increase represents the fresh students admitted into the University during the 2022 1 semester.

Our law graduates commenced their programme at the Nigerian Law School, thanks to the Assent of the Amended NOUN Act in November, 2018. We are happy to report that they are doing very well in their studies and it is expected that the perception of the Council on Legal Education would change after the completion of their programme at the Nigerian Law School. With that one put behind us, it is now time to focus attention on getting our graduates who are 30 years and below accommodated in the National Youth Service Corps scheme.

The 2021_2 pen on paper (POP) and e-examinations were seamlessly held between 19th November to 3rd December, 2021 and 7th and 22nd December, 2021 respectively. An innovation introduced was to allow students who passed the examinations but failed to attempt their TMAs to re-register for the course only and DEA would then merge the two components to obtain the results for each of their courses. An innovation based on the principle of flexibility without compromising the sanctity of examinations was introduced to accommodate and allow students attend to TMAs, thus reducing number of students with incomplete results. Also, the maiden examinations conducted at ACETEL was seamless and a world class example. 46 students from Nigeria, Cameroon and Uganda participated in the six postgraduate courses offered at the Centre for both M.Sc. and Ph.D. students.

It is my pleasure to present to you a brief report of our activities in National Open University of Nigeria and to request that you feel free to constructively engage us by providing observations, comments, and suggestions that would facilitate improvement in our service delivery to all stakeholders. Please feel free to take advantage of NOUN's existence to provide Nigerians and those in diaspora quality service delivery.



The University motto "Learn at any place at your pace" underscores the flexibility of options open to different learners to study what they want, when they want and where they want.


ADMINISTRATIVE FRAMEWORK

The University Act of 1983 as amended in 2018 is the legal basis for the operations of the re-born NOUN. The Act provides amongst others, that the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria is the Visitor to the university. This is similar to the custom in the conventional public universities in the country. In addition, there is a Governing Council headed by the Pro-Chancellor whose members are constituted by the Visitor through the Honourable Minister of Education. Currently, the Council of NOUN is made up of appointed members from the public; internal members from the university comprising the principal officers, representatives of Congregation and senate; and, representatives of designated agencies of government. The academic activities of the university are run through Senate which has the Vice-Chancellor as its Chairman and all Professors, Deans and Heads of Departments as members. THE LAGOS CAMPUS

The Lagos Campus

The Lagos Campus is situated at 14/16 Ahmadu Bello Way, Victoria Island, Lagos served as the Headquarters/Main Campus of the university till 2016 when the main campus was relocated to Abuja. It is a 13storey building which houses the University's Regional office and some Study Centres: Lagos, Lagos Mainland 1 (former Special Study Centre for the Nigeria Navy, Apapa) and Mushin Study Centres.





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
INSTRUCTIONAL MODES





Figure 2: Main processes leading to delivery






NOUN INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY ARCHITECTURE




NOUN SERVICE AND CONTENT DELIVERY MODEL, NSCoDeM






ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND GENERAL STUDIES

STRATEGIC PLAN

The concept and practice of Open and Distance Learning (ODL) in Nigeria has taken new dimensions within the last decade especially with the resuscitation of the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN). This calls for a strategic plan that entails a complex paradigm shift from the traditional mode of learning to a combination of face-to-face, learner-centred, technology-assisted, interactive, just-in-time learning, with no social bias or hindrances. The NOUN strategic plan focuses on five major areas. They are to:

- > Enhance student enrolment in programmes being offered in the university
- > Create demand-driven academic programmes relevant to the needs of the society
- > Create linkages with other universities and industrial concerns
- > Achieve staff competencies in ODL
- > Deploy the use of innovative technologies in the delivery of her operational services.

Our vision is that when the plan is successfully carried out, NOUN will be able to justify its leading role as a leading ODL centre in the world.

For our learners, this means an opportunity to experience a flexible, interactive and student-centred learning environment, of a well-coordinated and integrated set of instructions that will lead to awards of certificates, diplomas and degrees and acquisition of competencies that will equip them to face the world with confidence.

For staff, the vision means their competencies will be empowered via provision of appropriate tools and methodologies that will accommodate the integration of the various delivery methods available for modern provision of learning in an ODL setting.

For the university as a whole, the vision implies improved administrative efficiency and service, greater expansion and collaborative opportunities, and making the university an exemplar in the demonstration of the deployment of ODL to knowledge and skill acquisition in all its programmes and activities.

EXPECTATIONS FOR CLIENTS

Certain expectations are required of NOUN as it offers its services and products. These are hitch free admission for all candidates into the appropriate programmes of the university according to individual qualification and/or professional standing and experience, attainment of delivery target of service delivery within one week of the respective target period, prompt response to enquiries from learners through the respective organs of the university such as the call centre office, public affairs, e-mail and internet, and not the least; producing well-grounded graduates found fit in learning and character for self-realisation and the labour market.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

NOUN would seek collaboration with professional bodies/organisations to develop learning materials and produce instructionally well-designed course materials as study packs for students. Due to the special features of ODL, NOUN would have to ensure provision of learner support services through the use of study centres at various locations in the country; employ competent instructional facilitators to impart instructions at these study centres; and encourage the use of appropriate multimedia technology to achieve delivery of instructions. In order to attract robust participation of the stakeholders, part of the strategy would be to be conducting workshops, seminars, short term courses, conferences for groups and individuals at educational institutions and various work places and to engage in strong advocacy.

STRATEGIC AND OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES

The immediate priority is maintaining the provision of instructional materials to the students in any of the delivery formats at the respective study centres and the continuing re-appraisal of the relevance of the various programmes to meet prevailing demands of the society. To achieve this operational strategy, the reward system will accommodate increases responsibility for staff. The university will also improve the work environment for its staff and provide them with modern and effective working tools to enable them achieve job actualisation and satisfaction.

STRATEGIC DIRECTION

Our strategic direction is to implement the following:

- Offer new and locally relevant programmes, attain full development of the ICT network within and amongst the NOUN systems, and provide the best possible learning experiences for our students through the use of a range of contextually relevant media and technologies;
- (ii) Build upon the e-learning initiatives already begun with a gradual expansion to full delivery courses online by the end of the Plan period;
- (iii) Encourage increase use of student support services through the completion of on-going renovations and refurbishment of the first phase of study centres while the second stage of study centres' development to include all states and selected study centres reflecting concentration of students will be embarked upon;
- (iv) Lay the foundation for quality research and the identification of research priorities essential for a new and growing open university; exhibit excellence in the design, development and provision of instructional materials and tutorial facilities to be comparable to any ODL institutions anywhere in the world; and

To collaborate with institutions and organisations within the West African sub-region for training and development in ODL through the activities of RETRIDOL, and enhance the growth and development of NOUN and its staff through partnerships with international development partners and professional organisations and other open and distance learning institutions worldwide such as Commonwealth of Learning (COL), United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO), New Partnership for Africa's Development (NEPAD), West African Distance Education (WADE), African Council for Distance Education (ACDE), International Council for Open and Distance Education (ICDE), University of South Africa (UNISA), Open University of United Kingdom (OUUK), University of Southern Queensland (USQ), Open University of Hong Kong (OUHK), Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), India, Association of African Universities, Association of Commonwealth Universities to mention a few.
