Information on the page limit of PhD dissertations and on co-authors' declarations

Page limit of the thesis

Point 17 (4) c) of the BME Doctoral and Habilitation Regulations (DHR) states that the volume of the dissertation may not exceed 250 thousand characters including the lines occupied by figures (but excluding character counts of amendments and annexes if there are any). In some cases, the conversion method has been ambiguous, so we add additional regulation to the allowed extent.

Lines occupied by tables also count towards the 250k character limit.

The dissertation shall be formatted with *line spacing 1.5*, *font size 12* (the headings may be larger, footnotes smaller). The width of the left and right margins shall be 5 cm in total. The entire dissertation (except for appendices and attachments) into which the table of contents, the theses, the bibliography, and possibly a list of figures and a list of symbols is included, *shall not be more than 110 pages*. This limit shall be respected in addition to that of the character count.

Co-authorship Statements

The PhD candidate can attach two types of declarations on co-authorship.

The *first type* is to be attached if the candidate's authorship differs significantly from the share obtained by dividing 1 by the number of co-authors (not including the supervisor). In this case all co-authors (except the supervisor) must sign the declaration. There are two versions of this declaration: one where the supervisor is also a co-author and one where he/she is not. Please use the appropriate one.

The *second type* of statement should be attached if one of the publications supporting a thesis has a co-author *in Hungary* (apart from the supervisor). This is required even if the authorship of the candidate is the inverse of the number of co-authors.
