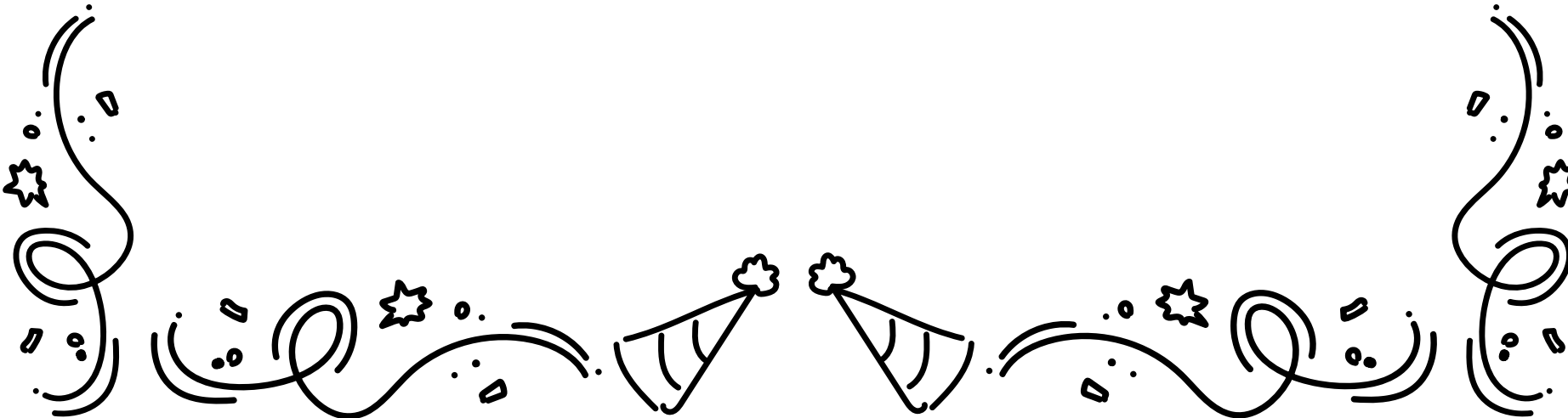

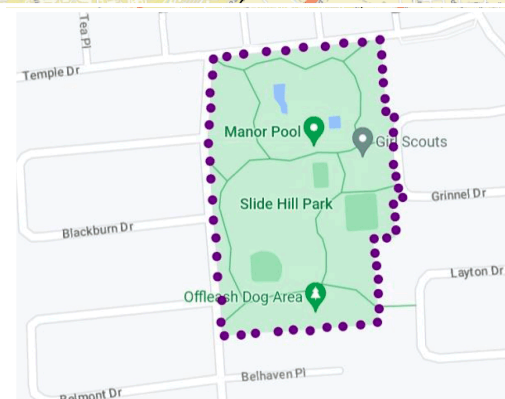
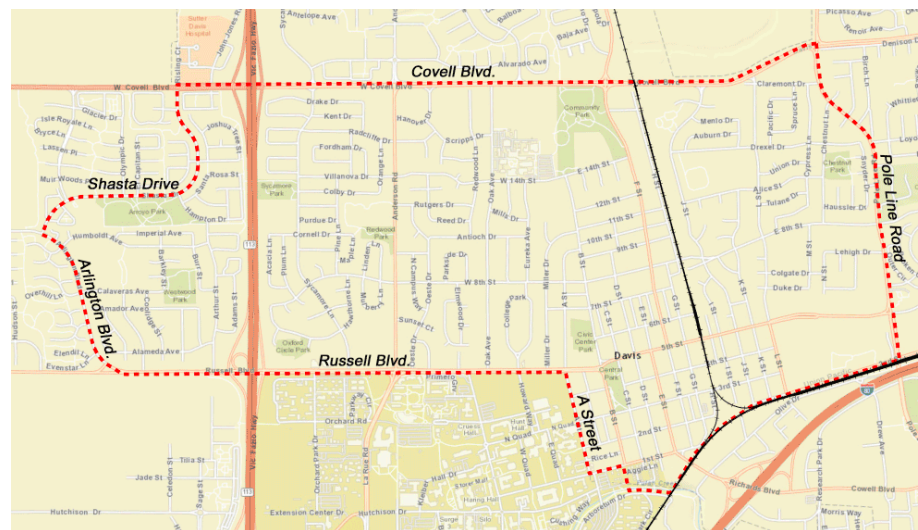


## SAFETY ENHANCEMENT ZONE

The City of Davis has established a "Safety Enhancement Zone" since 2011, covering the various parts of the City during Picnic Day. Within the boundaries of the zone, penalties (fines) for violations of certain Municipal Code sections are increased. The Safety Enhancement Zone will be in effect from 6:00 p.m. on Friday April 19 to 6:00 a.m. on Sunday April 21, 2024.

Citable notations include:

- General noise (\$403)
- Urinating in public (\$403)
- Open containers of alcohol in public and in marked complexes (\$321)
- Noise Citation: \$239 minimum anywhere in Davis
- No alcohol is permitted on campus.
