

GAZA POLIO CAMPAIGN UPDATE

6 SEPTEMBER 2024

HIGHLIGHTS:

Day 5 update

Central Gaza:

- 📀 Day 5: additional coverage of children who were unvaccinated during phase 1 in Deir al Balah: 4037*
- 🕗 Total number of children under ten years of age vaccinated in central Gaza: 193 598*

Southern Gaza:

🕗 Number of children under ten years of age vaccinated on Day 1: **161 188*** (8793 from Rafah and 152 395 from Khan Younis)*.

Total:

Total number of children under ten years of age vaccinated for central Gaza and southern Gaza: 354 786*
Families from across southern Gaza were enthusiastic to have their children vaccinated.

Day 5 update (Day 1, phase 2 of campaign, southern Gaza)



Number of teams deployed: 534



151 team supervisors have been deployed to support the teams.



91 fixed site teams, 400 mobile teams (including 16 transit teams) and 42 special teams), with 134 teams mobilized from central Gaza and 20 reserve teams that are on standby.





270 social mobilizers, supported by **26 social mobilization supervisors**, have been operational over the last two days.



Vaccination teams replenished vaccine stock in some locations due to high demand. Teams will be allocated additional vaccines in the coming days to avoid depletion.

Cold chain equipment and all necessary supplies were successfully distributed to key points in southern Gaza.



7 fixed vaccination sites (5 in South and East Khan Younis and 2 in Rafah) have been deployed for additional locations that require special coordination.

Preparations for phase 3 of the campaign in northern Gaza:

Planning for phase 3 in northern Gaza is underway. On 7 and 8 September 2024, the focus will be largely on providing support to social mobilizers to raise awareness around the campaign dates, health facilities offering vaccines and benefits of vaccines.
