



PUPPY VACCINE SCHEDULE - GUIDE

When you bring a puppy home, you realize right away they depend on you for just about everything. And that includes puppy shots throughout their first year. These vaccines shield your dog from dangerous and potentially deadly diseases. This is a critical step in keeping your puppy safe and healthy!



WHAT DOES PPR COVER?



PPR handles the scheduling of puppy following up veterinary care with a PPR vet. The adopter **must be willing to drive to PPR vet, East Orlando Animal Hospital**, and must communicate with our **PPR Puppy Vetting Coordinator via email to schedule all appointments** on PPR's timeline (below). The **adopter will receive an email within 1 week of adoption** to schedule all remaining veterinary care.

WHEN ARE THEY GIVEN?

Puppy vaccines may vary, depending on the age of dog during intake to PPR & if they've had any vetting prior to intake. Below is a general rule of thumb but may vary slightly.



- **Bordatella** is given at 8 & 16 weeks
- **DHPP** is given every 3 weeks from ages 8 weeks to 16 weeks
- **Rabies vaccine** is given at 16 weeks

**PLEASE
NOTE...**

PPR does not give the **Lepto vaccine** to any puppy or dog. While many vets still encourage this vaccine, we don't feel it's necessary & have seen a high % of adverse reactions. **We feel it's in their best interest not to have this vaccine** & we follow this practice with our personal dogs as well.

YOUR PUPPY'S SHOT SCHEDULE



If puppy has first round of boosters PRIOR to 8 weeks old, vaccinations & surgery are as follows:

- Round 1** vaccines should not be any earlier than 6 weeks
- Round 2** vaccines: 3 weeks after last set
- Round 3** vaccines: 3 weeks after last set
- Round 4** vaccines: 3 weeks after last set
- Spay or neuter & microchip**: Between 5-6 months old

If puppy has first round vaccines AT 8 weeks old, vaccinations & surgery are as follows:

- Round 1** vaccines
- Round 2** vaccines: 3 weeks after last set
- Round 3** vaccines: 3 weeks after last set
- Spay or neuter & microchip**: Between 5-6 months old

In general, boosters should be completed by 16 weeks of age

The vet will decide if an additional set is necessary after 16 weeks
