



We started out at Pratham Books with the mission of putting 'A Book in Every Child's Hand.' And, in our ninth year, we have delivered on that promise in every way we could: 11 million books, 10 million story cards, 12 languages, 400 Creative Commons -licensed uploads, over a million digital downloads, a readership of 52 million and a volunteer network of 500 champions who introduce books and stories to thousands of children across India.

We were especially humbled by an email that a mother sent us, "My son had a speech problem and I was trying to get him to say 's' for a long time. Then I got him *Annual Haircut Day* in which *Sringeri Srinivas* wants to cut his hair. He read the book to himself, laughing all the while. And then he read it again. And again. And before I knew it, he could actually pronounce the name properly!"

Continuing our pursuit of rich and involving content, we freed a book from its spine this year! *The What on Earth? Wallbook* by Christopher Lloyd opens out like a visual tapestry as it chronicles the history of the universe from the Big Bang to the present day. It contains visual streams of information on natural, cosmic as well as human history and

integrates the narrative using the timeline as a context. A teaching tool of immense potential, the book was launched by the Governor of Rajasthan, Ms Margaret Alva at the Jaipur Literature Festival.

The newly minted *Rupaiya Paisa series* was our effort to take financial literacy to children. This beautifully illustrated four-book series was developed through a workshop with BASIX, a livelihood promotion organization who are experts on the subject.

Equally unique was a set of beguiling rhymes by renowned Hindi poet, Prayag Shukla. Illustrated with unusual woodcuts by Siraj Saxena, *Uunt Chala Bhai Uunt Chala* was published in Hindi, English and Marathi. Another powerful tale is *The Talaabs of Darbhanga*, penned by well-known water conservation expert, Anupam Mishra. Based on a legend about a pandit called Ayachi, the book reveals traditional methods of water conservation and harvesting in India.

A collaboration with Dastkari Haat Samiti resulted in a bilingual book, *My Mother*. A pattachitra artist, Bahadur Chitrakar of West Bengal, created a series of paintings depicting a typical day in his mother's life as seen from

the eyes of a young boy, in the Kalighat style of painting. The large-format book, edited by Jaya Jaitley, was made available in combinations of English and Bengali, Hindi, Kannada, Gujarati and Telugu.

Sindhu Ankisettipalle, a young Teach for India Fellow told us, "Pratham Books with their colourful illustrations, engaging story lines with an Indian context which kids find easy to relate to, have been an absolute blessing in my class. From a time when my kids couldn't read three letter words, they've moved on to reading entire story books all by themselves. Thanks Pratham Books!"

Pratham Books continued its long and lively participation in literary festivals and book fairs ranging from Kahaani in Noida, the Jaipur Literature Festival, Bookaroo, the Bangalore Literature Festival, the World Book Fair, Jumpstart, the Kala Ghoda Arts Festival in Mumbai, Bal Kumar Sammelan, the Pune Marathi Granthalaya, and the Kolkata Book Fair, where a buyer Ranjani Jagannathan emailed us to say, "When I came across Pratham Books, I practically purchased the entire stall! I would love to do a storytelling session of Pratham Books at my apartment complex and nearby places if you would allow me."

Our publishing efforts dovetail seamlessly into our work to spread the joy of reading among children. In a massive story telling drive, we launched the *One Day, One Story* initiative.
On International Literacy Day, September 8th,

250 Pratham Books Champions told the story of *Susheela's Kolams*, to children in all of India's 28 states. Thousands of children were transported into Susheela's imaginative world on that day. While we had only published the book in 5 languages, our passionate community volunteers conducted the sessions in 14 Indian languages. What left us speechless was the commitment of so many people to come forward to conduct these sessions and work their magic with children.

International Book Giving Day is one of our favourite occasions; this year, we celebrated it by raising funds to donate books to four incredible organisations – Aarti in Andhra Pradesh, 17000 ft Foundation in Ladakh, Vikramshila Education Resource Society in West Bengal, and the Avalokitesvara Trust in Ladakh. We continued to raise donations through the year to provide books and classroom libraries to supplement the efforts of many organizations that are working to improve the literacy levels of children.

Our books continue to find their way into new markets and geographies. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan provided our books as a pilot in 700+ schools in the tea gardens of Assam, and thousands of books and story cards to schools in Meghalaya. Makkala Jagriti, Teach For India, and the CSR projects of Ambuja Cement, Mazgaon Dock, and L&T took large numbers of books to their educational ventures all across India, as did the Jubilant Bharti Foundation, and Bharti Foundation

Schools. Mahila Kalyan Nideshalaya stocked their libraries with our books at 19 child rescue centres in Uttar Pradesh with the intention of scaling up to 54 centres across the state. Mahila Samakhya, as part of its overall revamp of the Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas in Karnataka, also featured our books in their new and refurbished libraries.

Our work extends beyond publishing and distribution to include advocating the need for all children to have access to a host of enjoyable books. A three-day workshop in partnership with the National Book Trust resulted in the creation of a guide on what makes a good children's book. The workshop was attended by National Council of Educational Research and Training, Room To Read, the Azim Premii Foundation, Sir Ratan Tata Trusts and educationists from all across India, Pratham Books is a founder member of a industry body called PAGe (Publishers Action Group) which documents best practices on getting good books to children and shares the findings with state governments and educational boards.

Our digital footprint continues to grow and we are delighted to lead the way to demonstrate how an open content model expands the market and benefits both the content creator and the content users, in this case, children. Our Creative Commonslicensed books have been read over a million times and continue to proliferate in cyber space in new avatars like digital apps and audio books.

These are just some of the ways that
Pratham Books has reached a readership
of 52 million over its nine-year lifespan.
Ahead lie new challenges, exciting
methodologies, innovations, and much
more that will help us place more books
in the hands of more children. In the months
to come, we will explore newer and braver
ways to use technology to take books closer
to children whether on mobile phones or
low-cost tablets.

Our partnerships will lead us to even more libraries in even more schools. Our stories will capture even more of the great Indian sensibility and ethos in additional languages and forms. And, take the joy of reading to every child!



Can creativity be contagious?



Can enthusiasm be contagious?








Is discovery contagious?
