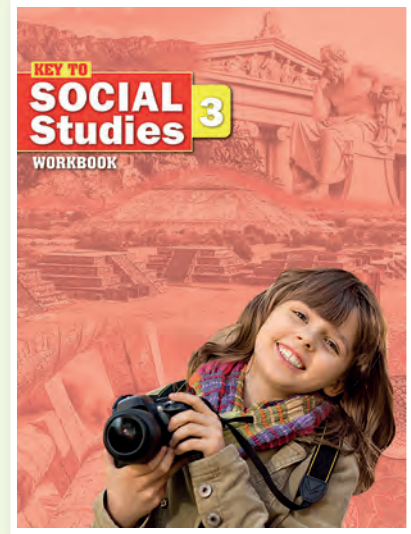
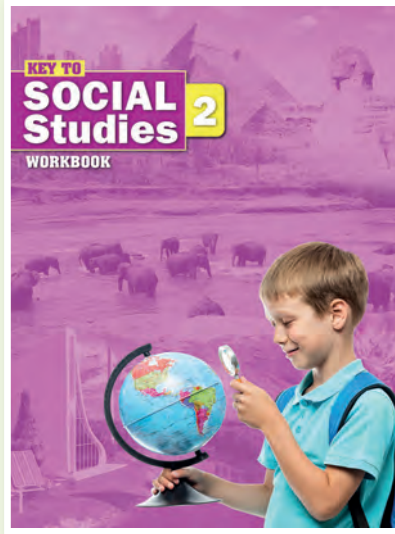
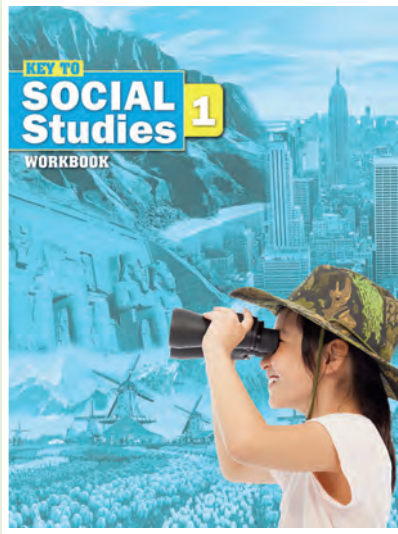
Caravan in the Sahara Desert

Land covers around one-fourth of the Earth's surface. In some places, the land is too high to live in. In other places, the land is too low. Some land areas are richly green and others are dry and **desolate** (a desolate place is a place that has no people living in). Egypt has a variety of natural **physical features** that shape the country, such as mountains, plains, deserts, plateaus, rivers, and valleys.
