BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS OF SPECTATORS

- ⇒ Remember that school athletics are learning experiences for students and that mistakes are sometimes made. Praise student-athletes in their attempt to improve themselves as students, as athletes, and as people.
- ⇒ Understand a ticket is a privilege to observe the contest, not a license to verbally assault others and be generally obnoxious.
- ⇒ Learn the rules of the game so that you may understand and appreciate why certain situations take place.
- ⇒ Show respect for the opposing players, coaches, spectators, and support groups. Treat them as you would treat a guest in your own home.
- ⇒ Respect the integrity and judgment of game officials. Understand that they are doing their best to help promote the student/athlete, and admire their willingness to participate in full view of the public.
- ⇒ Recognize and show appreciation for an outstanding play by either team.
- ⇒ Use only those cheers that support and uplift the teams involved.

ACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR

- ⇒ Applaud introduction of players, coaches, and officials
- ⇒ Accepting all decisions of officials
- ⇒ Treating competition as a game, not a war
- \Rightarrow Searching out opposing participants to recognize them for outstanding performance or coaching
- ⇒ Applaud at end of contest for performances of all participants
- ⇒ Showing concern for an injured player, regardless of team
- ⇒ Encouraging surrounding people to display only sportsmanlike conduct

UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR

- ⇒ Yelling or waving arms during opponent's free throw attempt, serve, etc
- ⇒ Disrespectful or derogatory yells, chants, songs, or gestures
- ⇒ Booing or heckling an official's decision
- ⇒ Criticizing officials in any way; displays of temper with an official's call

UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR (CONTINUED)

- ⇒ Refusing to shake hands or give recognition for good performances
- ⇒ Blaming loss of game on officials, coaches, or participants
- ⇒ Laughing or name-calling to distract an opponent
- ⇒ Using profanity or displaying of anger that draws attention away from the game

PARENTS/FANS CODE OF CONDUCT

PVCA believes that sportsmanship is a core value and its promotion and practice are essential. This code of conduct applies to all parents/fans involved in interscholastic athletics and activities.

- 1. Parents/Fans will promote academic, emotional, physical, and moral well being above desires and pressure to win.
- 2. Parents/Fans will teach, enforce, advocate, model, and promote the development of good character to include:

- ⇒ Parents/Fans will respect participants, officials, opponents, and all others involved.
- ⇒ Parents/Fans will promote fair play and uphold the spirit of the rules in the activity.
- ⇒ Parents/Fans will model appropriate behavior at all times.
