1. Introduction

This document reports on the activity of European Documentation Centres (EDCs) in 2015, and is based on the corresponding online survey input from EDC members.

The survey on EDCs' 2015 activity was launched on 14 December 2015, and was available until 13 January 2016. During this period, two messages were sent to EDC members, two messages were sent to the network correspondents encouraging their networks to reply, and two announcements were posted on the Europe Direct intranet encouraging users to provide feedback on the survey.

There was an overall response rate of 57 %: **213** of the **376** members responded to all questions.

2. Executive summary

In total, **213** respondents from 26 countries took part in the annual EDC activity survey.

EDCs are mostly located in central (37 %) or faculty/department libraries (22 %); their premises are accessible to the general public in 92 % of cases. While EDCs agree to 'routinely use' the EDC logo, only 67 % used it for signposting or promotion in 2015. Of all EDCs, 92 % provided access to material for 20 hours or more per week, with staff members present in this period in 91 % of cases.

EDC material is mostly (76 %) organised as a single collection, and in most cases (89 %) is available on open shelves. On the whole (89 %), EDC material is separately identifiable when integrated into the host structure's catalogue.

Most EDCs (89 %) use some type of library management system (Captia talis has proved the most popular), and 96 % use some type of classification and indexing system, with the Dewey Decimal Classification system being the most popular. According to the survey results, 78 % of EDCs are actively collecting publications on EU issues, in addition to the Publications Office (OP) distribution. Concerning the amount of publications that the centres receive, 61 % of respondents believe this to be sufficient, while 20 % consider some of these publications to be redundant.

The EU Bookshop privileged access feature is used for orders of large quantities of publications by 57 % of the EDCs, while 70 % use it for its free online services. Most EDCs (67 %) specified that the service they used in 2015 was 'Download publications'.

Most respondents (79 %) were satisfied or very satisfied with the OP and the EU Bookshop, although more than half of the EDCs (55%) seem to receive between 51-100 publications/year that have not been explicitly ordered by them, 39% receive between 1-50 publications/year not explicitly requested which represents a total of 94 % of EDCs that receive material which has not explicitly ordered or requested. 26 % of respondents did not request any material via EU Bookshop online orders or via surveys.

An overwhelming majority (91 %) responded that they use the online information services/sources, with the European Commission Libraries Catalogue (ECLAS) being used by 72 % of them.

More than half the EDCs (58 %) use the European Commission's Central Library Services and 60 % of them receive at least one newsletter from a European Commission service. Most EDCs organised at least one teaching event or seminar for students, teachers or university staff (77 %) and at least one teaching event or seminar for the general public (42 %).

EDC users seek information chiefly concerning 'Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion' (48 %), 'Economic and Financial Affairs' (47 %), 'Education and Culture' (45 %), 'Justice and Consumers' (38 %) and 'Migration and Home Affairs' (35 %).

EDC users asked for information most frequently on the following European Commission priorities: 'Justice and Fundamental Rights' (51 %), 'Jobs, Growth and Investment' (46 %), 'Economic and Monetary Union' (41 %) and 'Migration' (38 %).

In 2015, most EDCs (54 %) used a social media platform, mostly Facebook (38 %), followed by Twitter (16 %), while some of them used YouTube (7 %) or managed a blog (7 %).

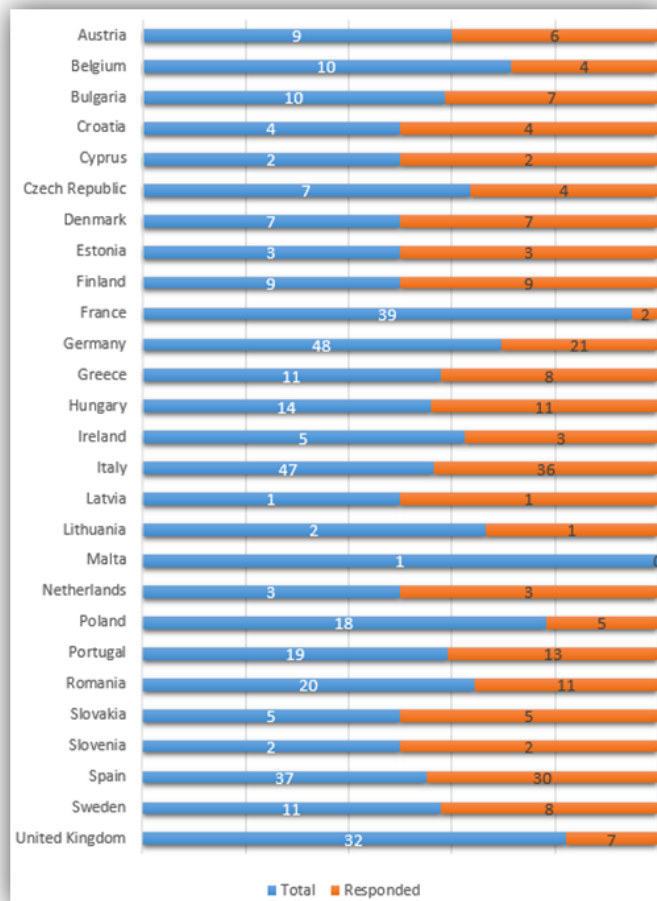
Most EDCs (85 %) have a website or a page in the host structure's website, and 70 % of respondents promoted their EDC via brochures/posters/newsletters.

Concerning queries on EU issues from the general public, 95 % of EDCs received such queries on a daily (7 %), weekly (28 %), or monthly (25 %) basis, while 35 % received such queries just a few times over the entire year.

Most of the EDCs (58 %) cooperated with other Europe Direct (ED) networks (Europe Direct Information Centres (EDICs) and Team Europe (TE) members) in 2015; an even larger percentage (78 %) participated in meetings organised by their European Commission Representation last year.

3. The results in detail

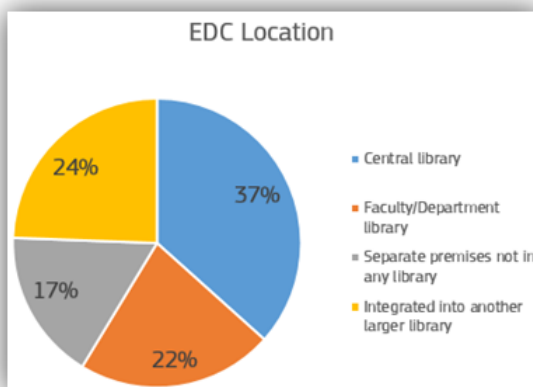
3.1. Respondents per country



In total, 213 respondents from 26 countries took part in the survey, as shown above. The overall response rate was 57 %.

Italy provided the most responses (36), with a 77 % rate; France had the lowest response rate (5 %), while Malta did not provide responses. There is not any EDC in Luxembourg.

3.2. Premises and staff



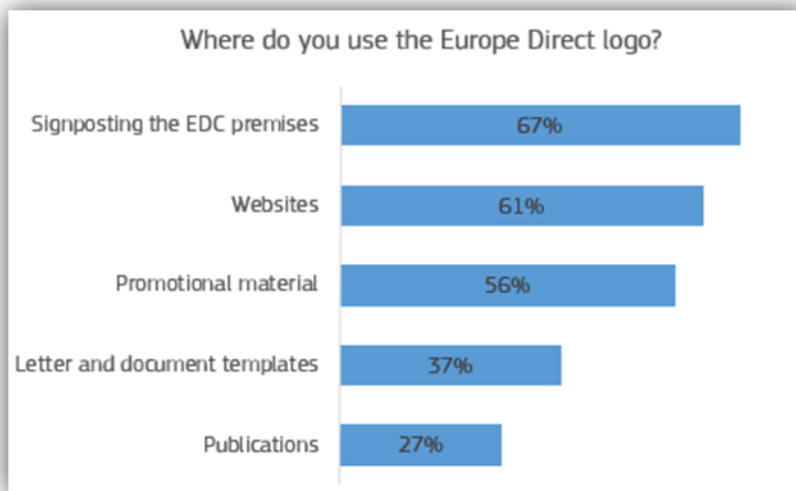
Key findings

- Most EDCs (59 %) are located in a library (37 % in a central library, and 22 % in a faculty/department library). Some 24 % are integrated into another larger library.
- Findings reflect the existing agreement that host structures undertake to 'set a special area aside for the EDC, preferably in its library'.



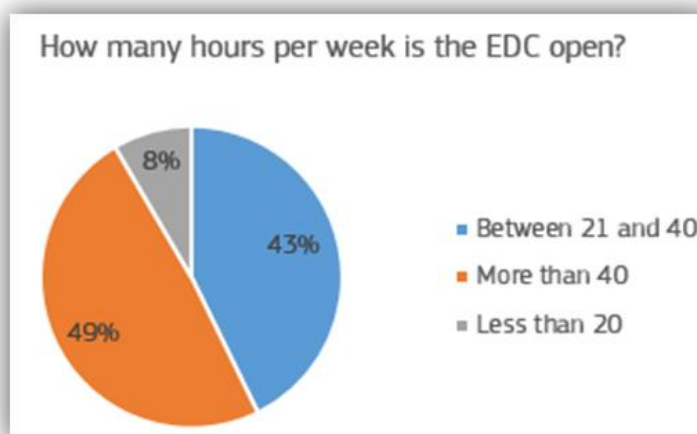
Key finding

Most EDCs (86 %) use the Europe Direct logo for signposting or promotion. The remaining 14 % of EDCs do not fulfil the agreement to 'routinely use the corresponding logo' for such purposes.



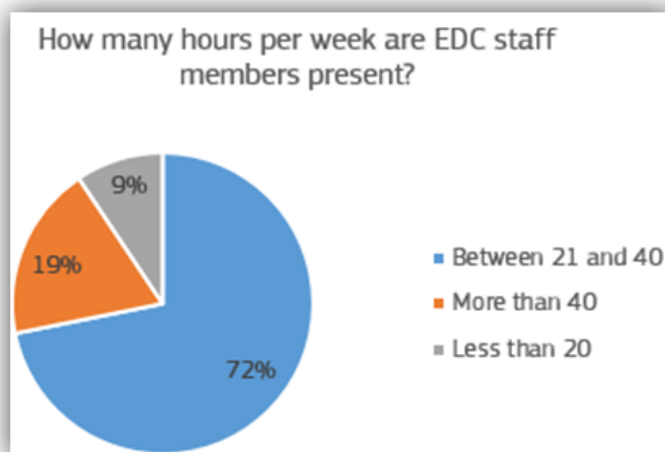
Key findings

- Not all EDCs fulfil the agreement to 'draw attention to the EDC's existence using graphics or any other appropriate means of identification'.
- More than half (67 %) of the respondents use the ED logo signposting the EDC premises, 61 % on websites, 56 % for promotional material, 37 % on letter and document templates and 27 % on publications.



Key findings

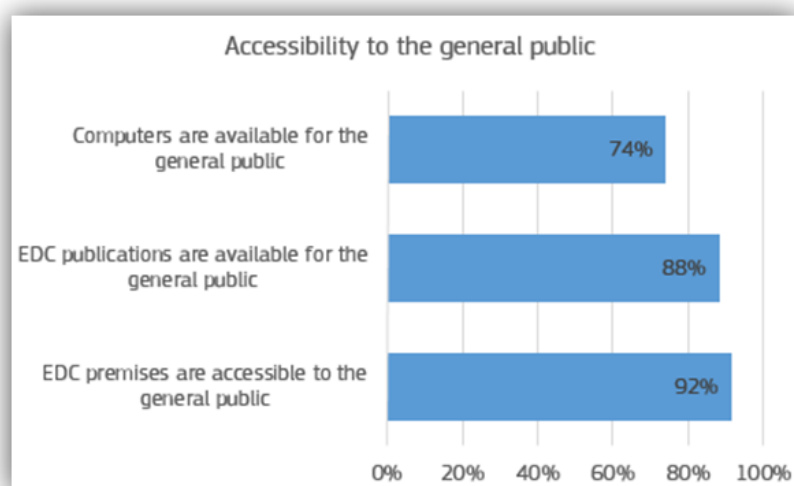
- Almost half the EDCs (49 %) are open for more than 40 hours a week, while 43 % open between 21 and 40 hours a week.
- A few EDCs (8 %) are open for fewer than 20 hours a week; this is not in compliance with the agreement that EDCs should be 'providing access to and enabling consultation of publications and other material for a sufficient number of hours (at least 20 hours per week)'.



Key finding

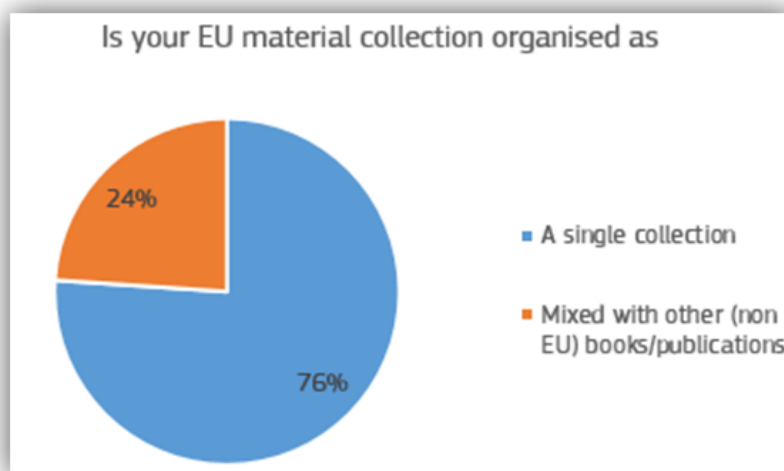
In most EDCs (72 %), staff members are available between 21 and 40 hours per week. In 19 % of cases, availability is higher than 40 hours per week, while in 9 % of EDCs, staff members are available for less than 20 hours per week (figure does not correspond exactly to the figure in previous chart where it says that 8% of the EDCs are open for fewer than 20 hours/week).

3.3. Management of collections and documents



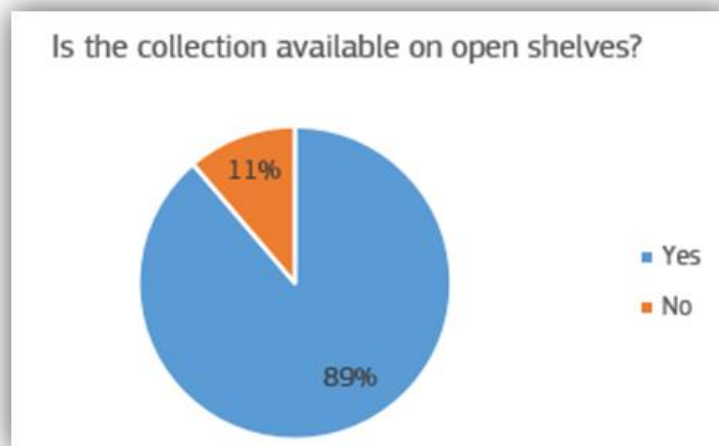
Key findings

- Some 74 % of respondents stated that computers are available for the general public. EDC publications are available for 88 % of respondents and the premises of 92 % of the EDCs are available to the general public.
- The estimation of the respondents' number of EU-related publications loaned in 2015 ranged from 0 to 5 000, with a total average of 353/year.



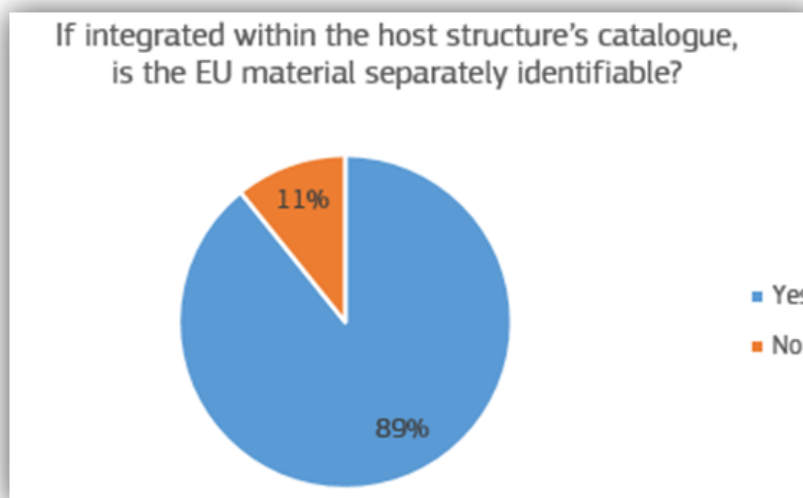
Key findings

- In most EDCs (76 %), EU material is organised as a single collection according to Article 5 of the EDC agreement: 'processing, cataloguing and indexing all the European Union publications received in a single collection'.
- In the remaining cases (24 %), the collection is mixed with other books/publications.



Key finding

The majority of EDCs (89 %) have their collections placed on open shelves.



Key finding

When integrated within the host structure's catalogue, EDC material is separately identifiable in the majority of cases (89 %).

3.4. Library management system

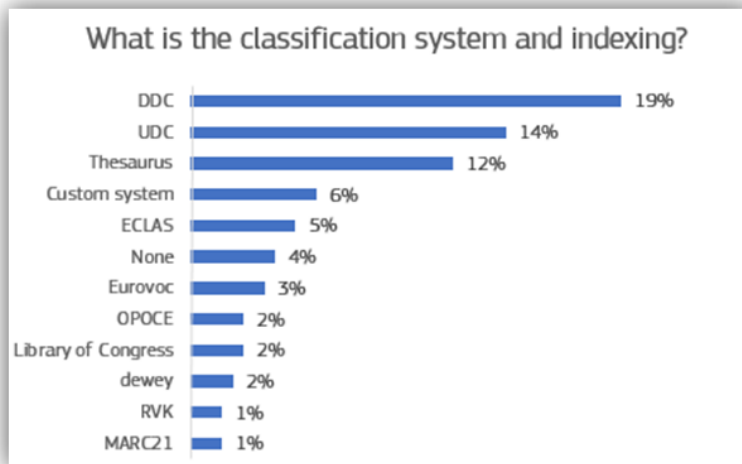


Key findings

- More than 50 library management systems were mentioned by the EDCs: 25 of these were mentioned more than once (corresponding to 70 % of respondents).
- Captia talis is by far the most popular library management system; it is used by 22 % of the EDCs.
- Around 3 % of EDCs use some type of 'custom-made system'. There are 4 % who do not use a library management system, raising the question of whether these EDCs fully fulfil the terms of the agreement specifying that EDCs should perform 'processing, cataloguing and indexing' of EU publications.

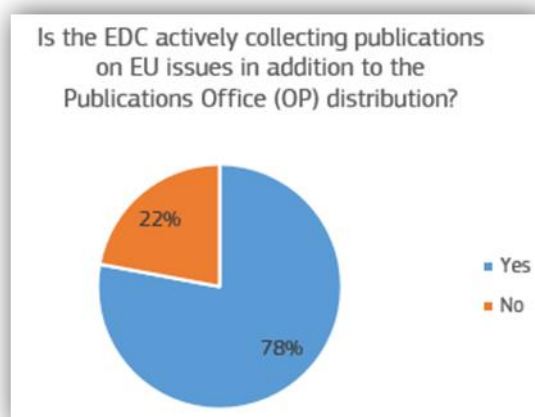
3.5. Classification system and indexing



Key findings

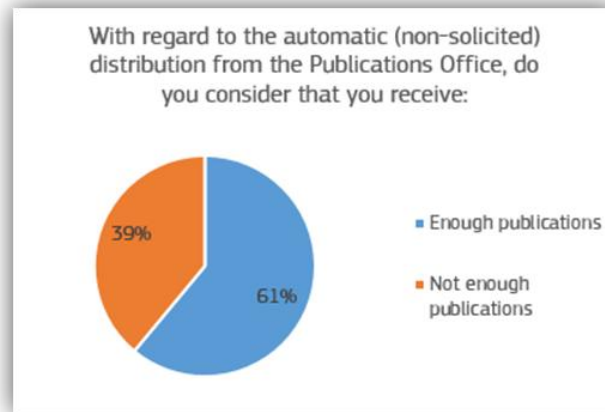
- The EDCs mentioned more than 40 classification and indexing systems. The 13 depicted in the graph were mentioned more than once.
- DDC is the most popular among the 40 systems (it is used by 19%), followed by UDC (14%) and Thesaurus (12%).
- A small number of EDCs (4%) do not use a classification and indexing system: these EDCs may not be fulfilling the terms of the agreement that EDCs should perform 'processing, cataloguing and indexing' of EU publications.

Key finding

The majority (78%) of EDCs is actively collecting publications on European issues, in addition to the distribution of publications by the Publications Office.



Key finding

The majority (61 %) of EDCs consider the amount of publications they receive to be sufficient.



Key finding

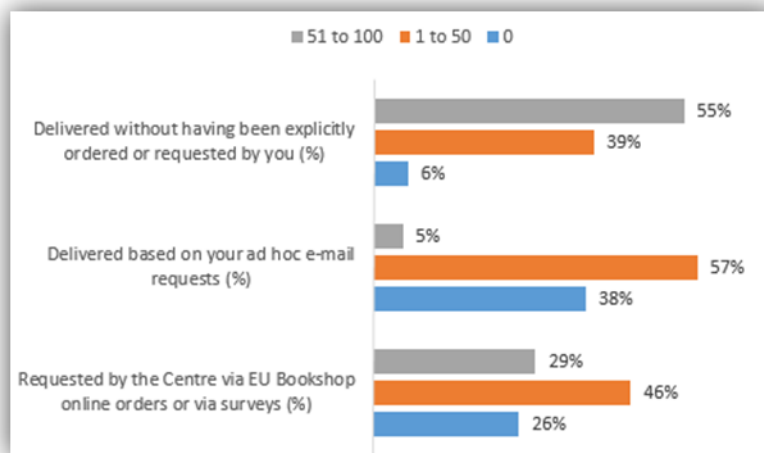
Some EDCs (20 %) indicated that they receive publications from the OP that they do not need.

A number of EDCs (21) noted that they receive leaflets, brochures and posters which they do not need. The publications listed below were also mentioned (once each):

- Ambiente, ricerca
- bulletins, newsletters
- Foundation Focus
- Europeiska revisionsrättens rapporter
- publications of the European Court of Auditors
- publications with topics not related to our area of collection emphasis
- publication (reports) of the previous years
- scientific
- European Court of Justice (ECJ) judgements
- non-scientific publications and publications not relevant to university users
- ECDC publications.

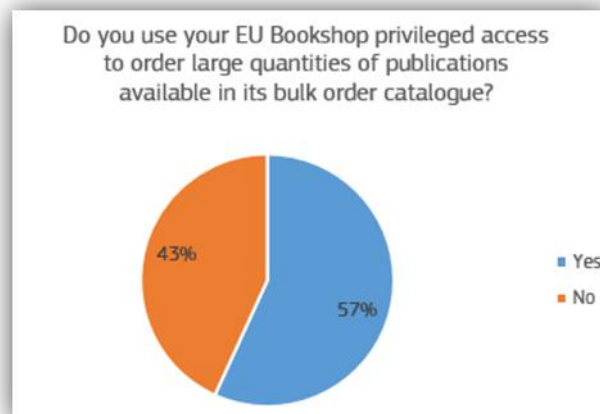

3.6. EU Bookshop services



Key findings

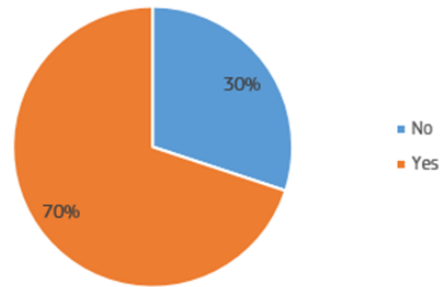
- More than half of the EDCs (55%) receive between 51-100 publications/year that have not been explicitly ordered or requested by them. 39% of EDCs receive between 1-50 publications/year not explicitly requested. So the overwhelming majority (94 %) of EDCs receive material they have not explicitly ordered or requested.
- 26 % of respondents did not request any material via EU Bookshop online orders or via surveys.



Key finding

Most EDCs (57 %) make use of their EU Bookshop privileged access to order the large quantities of publications available in its bulk order catalogue.

In addition to this privileged user feature, EU Bookshop offers free online services to all its users. Do you use these services?



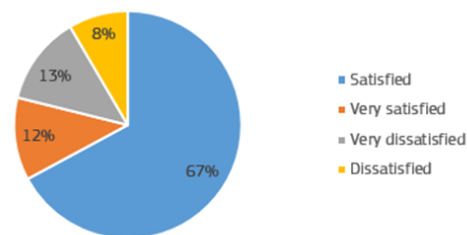
Which services do you use?



Key finding

Most EDCs (70 %) use the EU Bookshop's free online services, chiefly to download publications (67 %) and to order paper copies (39 %).

Most respondents (79 %) were satisfied or very satisfied with the services provided by the Publications Office and the EU Bookshop for EDCs.

3.7. Comments and proposals on the OP distribution services

Comments on this open question were received from 65 respondents. Selected indicative responses are shown below.

The majority expressed their satisfaction with the OP distribution services.

'Very well organized and working properly.'
'The Publications Office distribution services cover my EDC's needs.'
'The books are distributed in time.'
'Each month I get the metadata of publications produced by EU Bookshop, then I upload the metadata on my catalogue. It is a very useful service.'
'It provides sufficient information.'

Some respondents expressed the need for more free material.

'Add more free paper copies for EDC collection.'
'To be able to order multiple free paper books, and more books in Italian.'
'EDC should get the possibility to order (if necessary) one item without costs of publications with costs.'
'Too many publications are only available online, I would prefer that more printed publications could be ordered for free.'
'I'm sorry to say that the EDC is insufficient supplied.'
'Poder pedir más de un ejemplar cuando se trate de las nuevas publicaciones.'
'The opportunity to order two free copies - one for collection and another for archives as we perform the tasks of the national library.'
'We would like to get more free publications and as privileged users some chargeable publications for free.'

Academic institutions in particular would like more material.

'The University of the Azores is satisfied with the publications received and would like to see the number of these publications improved.'
'Privileged access is very convenient when we need documents for events and classes (bulk orders). In general, documents received are not very useful for university students.'

Other respondents indicated that when the material is online, they prefer not to receive a print version as well.

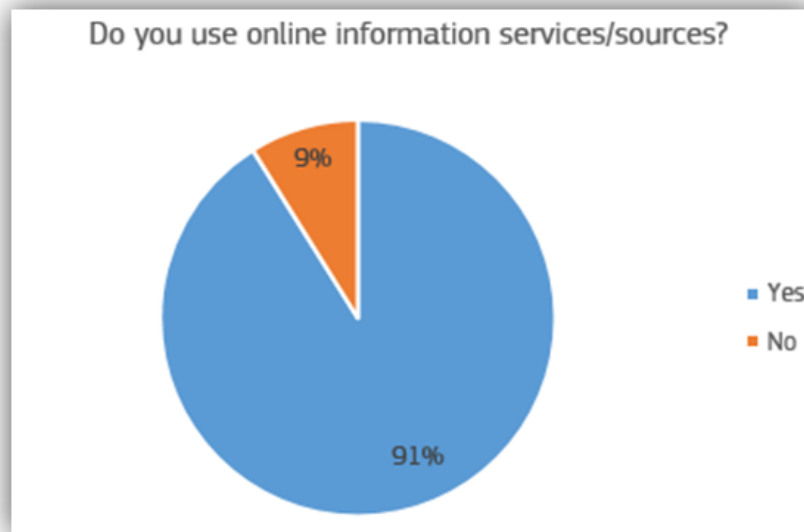
'We do not need printed publications if they are accessibly for free online.'
'Very interesting the possibility of download the ebook.'

Lastly, some EDCs commented on difficulties they encountered related to the platform and its usability.

'The platform is not very easy to work with.'
'Privileged User features are very rare and often not working.'

3.8. Use of online information services/sources

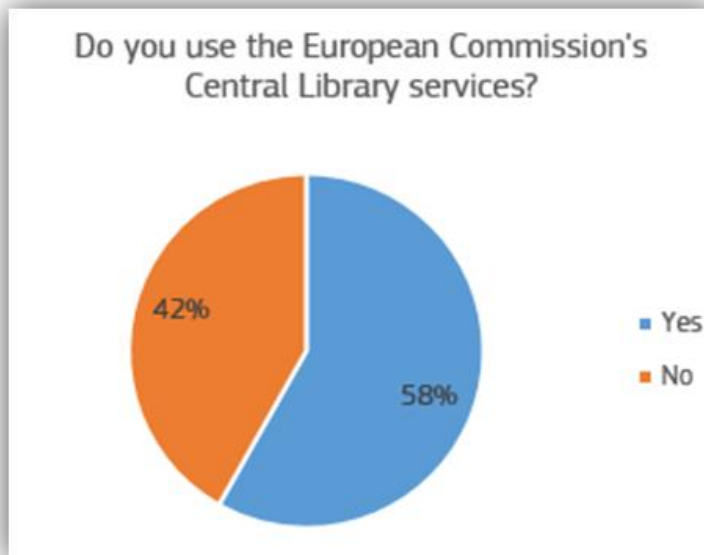


Key finding

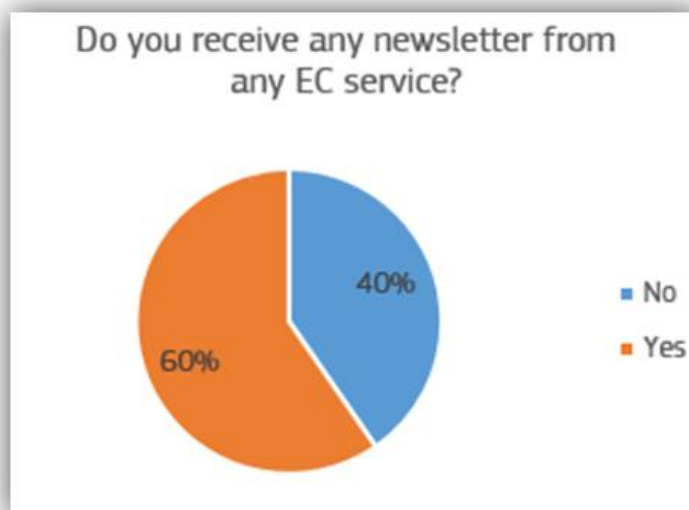
The overwhelming majority of EDCs (91 %) use online information services/resources. Most of them (72 %) use ECLAS, followed by 53 % who use European Sources Online (ESO) and 36 % who use LexisNexis.

When asked if EDC use the European Commission's Central Library services, 58 % of the EDCs mention they do, whereas, when asked which of the available online information services/sources they use in general, the one which is used the most is ECLAS, by 72%.

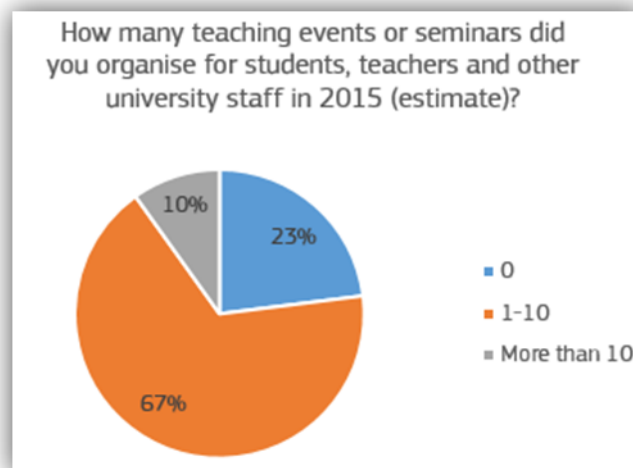

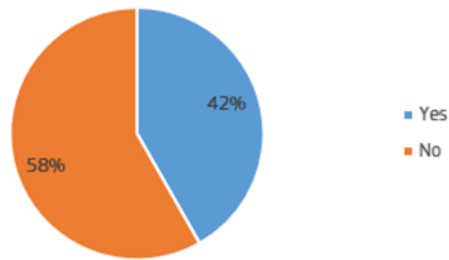

Most EDCs (90 %) organised at least one seminar for students and academic staff in 2015.

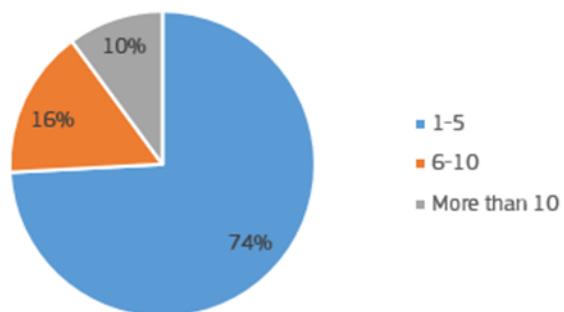
In addition to the events/seminars for students, teachers and other university staff, did you organise teaching events or seminars for the general public in 2015?

How many teaching events or seminars did you organise (estimate)?



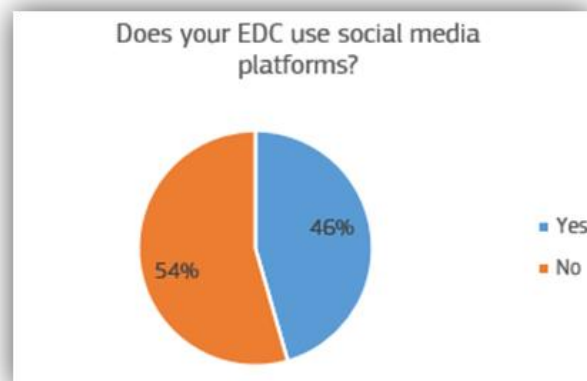

Key findings

- Almost a third (30 %) of EDCs conducted training courses on European documentation or European websites.
- Slightly fewer EDCs (27 %) organised training courses on EU institutions, EU integration, etc.
- Less than 20 % of EDCs organised training courses that covered general training on the use of EDC collections and IT equipment, guidance on studies or carriers, and information, research and analysis at postgraduate level.

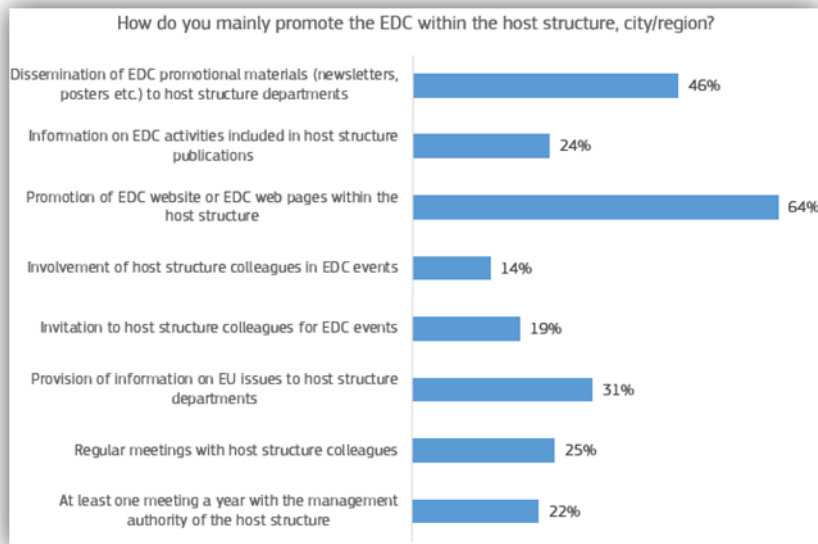

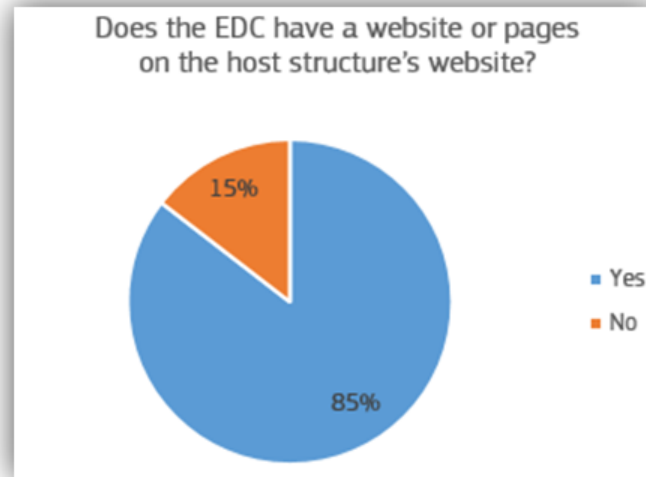
While 38 % of EDCs use Facebook and 16 % use Twitter, only 7 % manage blogs and/or use YouTube.

3.12. Promotion of the EDC within the host structure, city/region

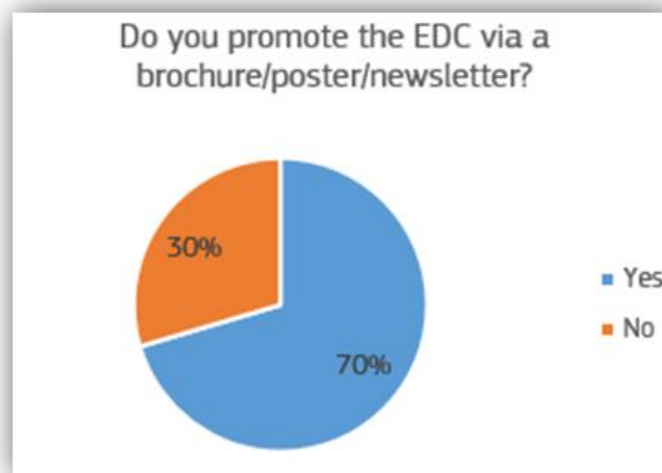

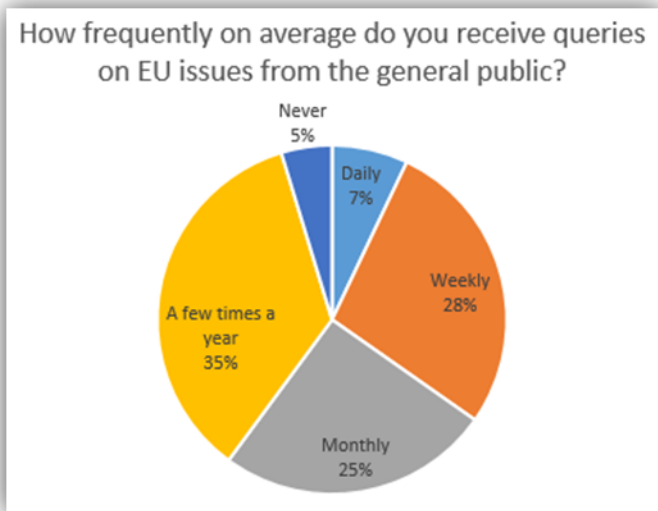
- More than half of EDCs (64 %) promote their website or web page within the host structure.
- Almost half of them (46 %) disseminate their promotional material to host structure departments.
- Almost a third of EDCs (31 %) provide information on EU issues to host structure departments.
- All other promotion activities are implemented by less than 30 % of EDCs.

**Key finding**

The vast majority of respondents (85 %) stated that their EDC has a website or a web page in the host structure.

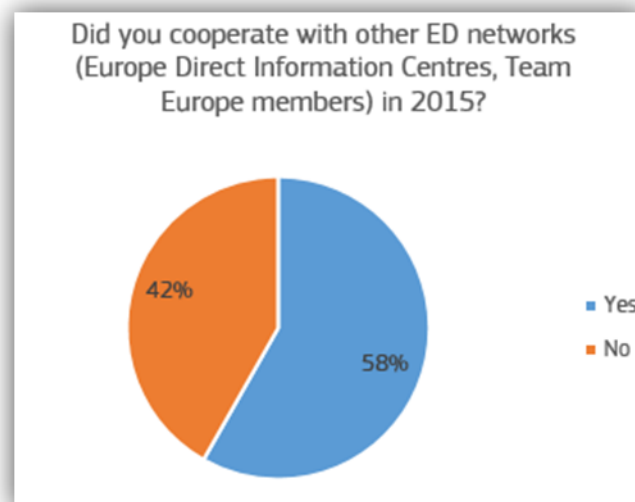
**Key finding**

Most EDCs (70 %) are promoted via brochures, posters and/or newsletters.



Key findings

- More than a third (35 %) of EDCs receive queries on EU issues from the general public just a few times a year.
- Some 28 % of them receive queries every week.
- For 25 % of EDCs, queries are received just once a month.
- Only 7 % of EDCs receive daily queries, while 5 % of them never receive any EU issue-related queries from the general public.

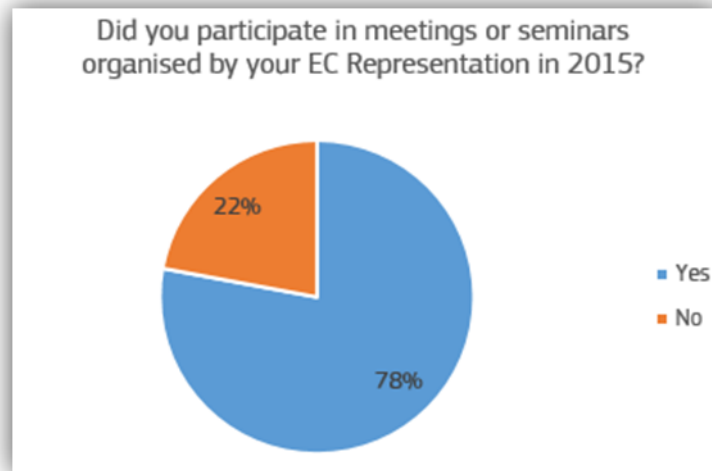


Key finding
