

Sister Seas

As we live out our faith in Jesus, it's critical that we recognize the importance of not only making sure we are being spiritually fed, but ensuring that we are sharing that wisdom with Stewardship 5 others. God gives us a great example of this with the Sea of Galilee and the Dead Sea.

These neighboring seas in Israel are both fed from the same freshwater source, the Jordan Calendar | Most Wanted 7 River. Each even has underground, freshwater springs feeding it through its seabed. Though located "next door" to each other, these two locations are notably dissimilar.

The Sea of Galilee is teeming with life. Home to over 25 species of fish, bordered by lush green farmlands, and surrounded by vibrant cities and towns, this body of water is a symbol of life and growth.

Its sister to the south, however, boasts no signs of life. No fish make their homes within the waters of the Dead Sea. No plants line its bed or naturally grow along its shores. An aerial view of this vast lake reveals barren land surrounding its borders, all life choked out by its excessive salt content.

So how can these two seas (technically lakes), so similarly formed, be so completely different?

While both lakes are fed by the same freshwater source, only the Sea of Galilee remains a freshwater lake. The Dead Sea is a saltwater lake and currently ranks as the fourth saltiest body of water in the world.

The Jordan River enters the north side of the Sea of Galilee carrying salt and other minerals and flows all the way through, leaving the southern shore and meeting its end in the Dead Sea.

The Dead Sea has no outlet. All of the salt, sediment, and other minerals carried by the Jordan River are deposited into it and left with



no place to go. As the water evaporates, these minerals and salt become more and more concentrated, resulting in an environment that is hostile to life and growth.

I think this is a beautiful and tangible illustration of what the Christian life should look like. Going to church, reading the Bible, and having an active prayer life are all important, but it would be easy to become like the Dead Sea if we let our faith end there. Knowing the truth of the Gospel and doing nothing with it is not God's design for His children. Like the Sea of Galilee, we should be taking the spiritual nourishment we receive from our source, the Word, and sharing it with others around us. After all, "faith without works is dead."

At Riverside, it is our joy to do this every summer, all summer long. Week after week, our staff and volunteers pour into the campers attending summer programs. Every child who attends a summer camp at Riverside hears the Gospel before they leave. For some, this is the only place they will hear the Bible taught all year. For others, Riverside has become a safe place to ask the tough questions that result in spiritual growth and maturity. And for more yet, the fellowship found at Riverside provides the encouragement needed for campers to feel brave and bold in their faith outside of camp.

As you continue to read about the 2024 Summer Camp season at Riverside, I encourage you to begin praying for 2025. Pray for the campers who will attend, the volunteers who will serve, and the staff who will plan it all. Pray that the truths we learn and study all year will be poured out to those whom God will bring to camp next year. Pray that we take our cue from the Sea of Galilee, consistently being spiritually fed and feeding others.

There was also a time where leaders and campers alike shared testimonies, prayed together, asked for advice, and worshipped God through song. This evening gave campers opportunities to open up to each other and their leaders about things they were struggling with, or to ask important questions about God and faith in Him. A highlight of the week for many of these campers is always the talent show that we hold at the end of the week, which gives them a chance to step out into the spotlight and have some fun! The acts ranged from funny skits, to singing worship songs, to cabin leader impersonations, and so much more!

We are so thankful for all the campers that came out this summer and will continue to pray that they grow in their faith, that they have good spiritual mentors, and that they would be able to come back to Riverside again next summer! 
Equal Partners
