Happy New Year and welcome to 2025!

I hope all of you had an enjoyable holiday over the extended break from school. As we enter January and think of resolutions and new commitments here are some conversations you could continue to have with your student to keep them focused on their success in school.

- Talk about the importance of following our cell phone policy. Students today are so connected to their devices it impacts their learning. There is much research emerging on the negative mental health impacts of teens being overly connected to devices. As a parent, consider using screen time limit features that most phones have in the settings, especially if you pay the bill for it.

- Have your student check on their grades and progress regularly in the PowerSchool accounts.
- Help promote safety for students! Report all absences to our Attendance Office at (586) 445-5550 so that both the school and you know where your child is during the school day.

Semesters and Exams

Roseville High School is on a semester schedule system. First semester ends January 24, with final exam dates on January 23 and 24. Here is some important information about exams, semesters, and grading:

- Final exams will cover all material learned in the first semester (since school started in September).
- Students are expected to be in school to take final exams. There are no make-up exam dates. The only exception is medically excused absences.
- Semester grades are used to determine whether a student earns the required credit for graduation and are calculated for their cumulative GPA.

To receive credit to graduate, a student must have a passing semester grade in the class. Semester grades are calculated as follows:

- 1st marking period grade: 40% of semester grade (this has already been finalized).
- 2nd marking period grade: 40% of semester grade (2nd marking period ends Wed., Jan 24).
- Semester Exam grade: 20% of semester grade (Jan 23 and 24).
- Semester grade=100% of the above 3 grades.

Again, to receive credit towards graduation, the semester grade **MUST** be a passing grade in each class.

All credit recovery will cost \$150 per class during the school year and \$200 during the summer. This means it is incredibly important that students are passing their classes and earning credit now.

5. **January 21:** Last day for senior photos to be provided to be included into the yearbook. Upload photos to www.yearbookforever.com
6. **January 25:** All the Hassle Before the Tassel Vendor Show. RHS gyms from 11:00 AM - 3:00 PM. Admission is \$5.00.
7. **Diploma sheets:** (which verify the spelling of the legal name that will appear on diplomas) will be distributed in January and are due back in February.
8. **February 6:** There will be a Senior Class meeting during 3rd hour to review all things Seniors should know between February and the end of April.

If you don't schedule a SchoolPics portrait session at the school, PLEASE READ:

Senior portraits — Upload online by Jan. 31

Senior portraits must be submitted online under the Yearbook Snap tab. Go to yearbookforever.com, search for Roseville High School and select the Roseville High School link to continue. Click on the Yearbook Snap image.



From the Yearbook Snap page:

- Enter **panthers** as the access code and select Enter.
- Click on Upload Photo and select a photo to upload from your computer or device. Make sure your file is 300 dpi.
- Once it uploads, select Portraits from the drop-down menu.
- **Fill in your student's formal name** and click Submit Photos.

IMPORTANT:

- You must work out with your photographer when you need to be photographed to be able to make the Jan. 31 deadline.
- If you use a photographer other than SchoolPics, the only way to guarantee that your portrait makes it in the yearbook is to personally check with Sarah Drouin before the deadline.
- You or your photographer must upload your portrait by the due date. This is not the date your photo shoot. It is the date by which Sarah Drouin needs the photo.



SPECS:

- Use the portrait to the right as a guide for sizing, attire and quality.
- Approximately 2x3 in., color retouched photographs, head and shoulders, both eyes showing.
- Distance from top of head to chin is 1.25 in.
- Medium blue/gray/brown background.
- No hands or props showing.
- Soft focus is accepted.
- No shoulders showing or low-cut tops.

*Be aware that portraits not meeting these guidelines will not be accepted.

Class composite (Read carefully)

The class composite is a picture of the senior class that is displayed in the school and handed out to seniors included in it.

Please remember that only students photographed by **SchoolPics** will appear in the senior class composite.

AM Drop Off/PM Pick UP:



Visitor Entrance, Drop Off, and Pickup Instructions

1. The RHS Visitor Entrance is Door #1. This door is accessed by parking in the Visitor Parking lot located in the North Lot.
2. Student pick up and drop off is in the NORTH LOT. Please pick up and drop off at the Athletic Entrance following the traffic pattern on the map. (BOTH DRIVEWAYS CAN BE USED AS AN ENTRANCE OR EXIT)
3. The South Lot is for staff parking and Bus Drop Off/Pick Up ONLY.
4. Student parking is in the North Lot. Students must purchase a parking pass from the Main Office for \$40 to park at school.
5. Normal St. Curbside drop-off should only occur on the west (school) side of the street, not the east (private homes) side. This prevents students from having to cross the street at our busiest times of day, especially when it is dark.



Campus Policy

Roseville High School has a closed campus.

This means students cannot have lunch delivered to them.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about ROBLOX



Roblox is one of the most popular video games on the market. In 2020, the game's creators were claiming that more than half of children in the USA play it. Like Minecraft, Roblox offers a huge amount of creative freedom. In this players create their own gaming experiences with the Roblox Studio to build custom levels and games, which can then be shared with other players online. Roblox fosters creative thinking and enjoys a robust online community of fans.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

Roblox encourages players to communicate online (including a group chat facility). This could expose children to risks such as scammers, online predators, harassment, griefters and more. The in-game chat has some filters, but isn't perfect: players can still send harmful messages to others – such as general hostility – while predators can reach out to children directly.

PUBLIC SERVERS

Roblox has private or VIP servers which allow people to play exclusively with their friends, but this costs money. Most Roblox players will instead be on public servers that anyone can join. Servers can have games which focus on all kinds of aspects, including direct player interaction. Some games and servers, therefore, will put children more at risk of contact from strangers than others.

ONLINE DATERS

These are also called 'Griefers' and are quite common in Roblox. An ODER is an individual who joins a game with the intention of finding someone to date online – and eventually meet in person. Such online dating is against the Roblox community guidelines, but this usually doesn't deter ODERs. Some player-built Roblox game worlds have even been designed with online dating specifically in mind.

IN-APP PURCHASES

Roblox is actually free to download and play, but bear in mind that there are some hidden costs. Players are encouraged to make purchases in the game, for example, using real money. People can also buy extra Robux (the in-game currency) to spend on cosmetic items in the game, and some private or VIP servers also have a cost.

Advice for Parents & Carers

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblox comes with several parental control options, which are explained well on the game's official website. It's essential to enter the correct date of birth for your child, as that allows Roblox to automatically apply the appropriate chat filters. The game also allows parents and carers to set monthly spending restrictions and monitor their child's account.

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Roblox's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with – potentially leading to bullying, harassment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyone who hasn't been added as a friend on your child's account.

PRIVATE SERVERS

If your child has genuine friends who they play Roblox online with, paying for a private or VIP server decreases the risk of contact from strangers. Even then, however, some players could invite other people – who might not necessarily be child friendly – into the private server. If your child is a Roblox fan, it's important to talk with them regularly about who they are playing the game with.

MONITOR SPENDING

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a sizeable amount in the game. Using parental controls to place limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts also makes it harder for your child to spend money inadvertently.

DEALING WITH STRANGERS

At some point in their development, your child will need to learn how to deal with strangers online. Show them how to block and report any users who are upsetting them or asking uncomfortable questions. Talking to them about what's OK to discuss – and what they should never tell a stranger online – will help them understand how to communicate with others safely in the digital world.
