Discussion/Essay Questions

- 1. Willy believes that to be successful in life you must be "well-liked". Does the play support this view?
- 2. Arthur Miller said this play was "a love story between a father and a son". In the end, is love gained or lost between Willy and Biff?
- 3. What, if anything, does Willy regret about his life?
- 4. Which character do you respect most?
- 5. Do you think Linda knows about Willy's infidelity?
- 6. What do you think Arthur Miller tried to communicate about the American dream in this play?
- 7. When this play was first written, Arthur Miller was encouraged to change the title to something more uplifting. What other titles would fit this play?
- 8. With today's understanding of mental health issues, and a greater acceptance of therapy, how would this story be different if set in 2017?
- 9. The presidential election of 2016 illuminated a growing anger by a class of Americans who feel they have been left behind economically. How might they relate to Death of A Salesman?
- 10. What status does the salesman have in this play? What do people think of salespeople today?
- 11. Why won't Willy take a job from Charley?
- 12. How does Linda help or hurt Willy?
- 13. What do you think Willy should really have done with his life? What would have made him feel fulfilled?
- 14. What do you think it was like for Happy to be Biff's little brother?
- 15. What is the purpose of Ben (Willy's older brother) in this play? How does he change the story or what we know about Willy?
- 16. Was Willy's suicide selfish or selfless?
- 17. How do the Lomans regard their possessions? Have their appliances and conveniences made life easier or harder?
- 18. The Woman is arguably the most important female in the play and yet she has no name. Why do you think this is?
- 19. City vs. country is debated in this play. Which does the playwright say is better?
- 20. What message does the play communicate about capitalism?
