

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

Parents & Godparents are required to attend a Sacramental Preparation Class. Please call the Parish Office at 428-6426 to register.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:

Couples wanting to be married at Sacred Heart Parish must be registered and practicing members of this parish. An appointment must be made with one of the parish priests at least six months in advance of the wedding. The Diocese of Orlando requires a marriage preparation program for all couples.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Children who are seven years or older, who have been baptized Roman Catholic, and who have participated in at least one full year of religious education during the previous year may be eligible to prepare for the Sacraments of Eucharist.

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners

A woman who has two young sons told me this story. She said that one Saturday morning she was making pancakes for the two boys: Kevin, who was five, and Ryan, who was three. The boys began to argue over who would get the first pancake, and their mother saw the chance for a lesson. She said to them, "You know, if Jesus were here, He wouldn't be arguing. He would say, 'Let my brother have the first pancake. I can wait.' With that, Kevin turned to his younger brother and said, "Okay, Ryan. You be Jesus."

I tell you this on today's feast of the Holy Family to assure you that I know that raising a family is not an easy thing. The life of the Holy Family was anything but the tranquil scene pictured on holy cards, or like that on the photo to the left. Life for Mary and Joseph was, in fact, a litany of struggles and surprises: ---a betrothed man feels jilted; words spoken at a child's presentation in the temple predict a troubled future; the threat of a murderous monarch forces them into exile; ---a boy runs away in

Jerusalem; ---a mother finds difficulty in trying to understand her Sons' plans; ---that Son is arrested and put to death in the prime of His life. We celebrate today not the feast of the Perfect Family but the feast of the Holy Family. Truly, theirs was a life filled with all the emotional ups and downs, joys and sorrows, problems and difficulties, like that of our own families. Yet despite it all, they were hopeful and trusting; preserving in knowing and believing that they were not alone, but that God was with them. That is the call of each of us as individuals and within our family, as well as that of our parish family and church family; to bear with one another and forgive one another, being a witness of mercy.

Today we stand on the threshold of a "New Year" a "New Beginning." This week, we will get rid of an old year and look forward to a new one. This is indeed a time to reflect and think about what the past year that has just ended has brought, and what the New Year lying right ahead of us could bring. So, the beginning of a new year provides us with an opportunity to reflect on the special gifts of time and family. We recall the events of the previous year and express our gratitude to God for all the good things that have happened in our personal lives and in that of our family, all the while being aware that there have also been sad and painful experiences and perhaps sinful realities for which we feel sorry, and also the missed opportunities for which we might regret. We joyfully celebrate the promise of a new set of months with new opportunities and happiness. Like the Blessed Mother whom we honor on the first day of the New Year as the Mother of God, and like the Holy Family, we try to be hopeful and trusting, in spite of uncertainties and the unknown that lies ahead. It is a day the church also celebrates the World Day of Peace. We pray for peace; peace in our troubled world; peace in our country; in our families, homes and hearts. It is a day to pray for God's blessings upon each one of us as we proceed in the New Year with fresh resolutions. Yes, it is God's blessing we all need on this first day of the New Year. This week

begins the year 2025 A.D. Those initials stand for Anno Domini, in the year of Our Lord. May it be so for each of us---a year of the Lord---a year for regular conversation with the One Who loves us most.

I close with this little story. A son called his parents to wish them 'A Happy New Year' and when his Dad answered the phone, he asked his dad, "Well Dad, what's your New Year's resolution?" His dad replied, "To make your mother as happy as I can all year," When his mom got on the phone he asked her the same question and she replied, "To see that your dad keeps his New Year's resolution."




