# UN International Year 2024 International Year of Camelids (IYC)

2024

The UN has designated 2024 as the International Year of Camelids. Camels, llamas, alpacas, vicuñas and guanacos are an important source of livelihood for millions of families - most of them pastoralists - in dryland and mountainous rangeland ecosystems around the world. The Year is meant to raise the public's and policymakers' awareness of the significant role of camelids in protecting ecosystems, conserving biodiversity, assuring food security and adapting to climate change. The resolution for the International Year of Camelids, proposed by the Government of Bolivia and presented by Ecuador as Country Chair of the Group of Latin American and Caribbean Countries (GRULAC), was approved by the UN General Assembly. FAO officially launched the IYC 2024 on 4 December 2023 in Rome, Italy.

## Importance of Camelids

Camelids play an important role in meeting the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) envisaged by the United Nations. Camelids are a source of milk and meat which helps people fight hunger. They also provide fibre which can be used for clothing and shelter.

Camelids are also used by people as a means of transportation. They also provide organic fertiliser which can be used in agriculture. Moreover, Camelids are known to survive in harsh conditions.

## Principal's Report 2023-24

St. Aloysius' College, a premier institute of the city has been consistently progressing towards better results in both academic and non-academic spheres. The diligent hard work and perseverance of students and teachers over the long span of time has aggrandized a reputation that speaks volumes about the College. With the highest CGPA (NAAC) in the state of Madhya Pradesh, the college continues to march and lead other institutions in Central India.

### ACADEMICS:

The session 2023-24 had been an eventful year with a number of accomplishments and lessons learnt. The college started with great ardor and enthusiasm on 26 July 2023 by welcoming the first year students and organized an enriching Orientation Programme for them with an aim to apprise them with college examination system, autonomy, facilities like clubs & societies, library, ICT, Role of English and Hindi Language.

"You must be the change you wish to see in the world" said Mahatma Gandhi. St. Aloysius' College (Autonomous), Jabalpur organized an eleven days Global Education Partnership Program (GEP) under Global Understanding Program (GUP) on the theme "Global Economy" from March 18-28, 2024 in which seventy-two students participated from seven institutions belonging to different parts of India as well as abroad.

The college values and understands the significance of timely result announcement for final year students. In the city of Jabalpur St. Aloysius' College was the only institute that announced the results of UG & PG in the months of May-June. In the session 2023-24, a total 1568 students appeared for UG and 167 in PG final examinations. The total pass percentage for the Under Graduate classes *viz* B.A./B.Sc./B.C.A. was 100%; B.B.A. was 99.58%; B.Com. was 98.88% and of Post Graduate classes *viz* M.A.- Political Science and English Literature was 100%; M.Sc. Chemistry, Computer Science, Zoology, Mathematics and M.Com. was 100%.

The college regularly organizes national seminars, conferences and workshops to professionalize and equip the faculty members. The following are the details: A two-days National Seminar on "Prospects of India towards Economic Integrity: Visualization of *Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam*" sponsored by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) was organised by the Department of Economics on 21-22 July 2023, with the aim of exploring India's economic landscape in the global context. The Department of Commerce organised a National Seminar on "G-20 and Green Growth: Collaborative Action for a Sustainable Future under *Saptrishi* Budget 2023" on 24-25 November 2023 sponsored by ICSSR. This seminar highlighted the G20's role in shaping policies for green

growth and sustainable development, emphasizing collaborative actions for a sustainable future. The Department of Education organised a two days National Seminar on “Education for Sustainability: Navigating the Changing Landscape of Higher Education” sponsored by ICSSR on 2-3 March 2024. The Department of Chemistry conducted a National workshop on “Synergetic Research Approach through RSM, Molecular docking and SPSS for Scientific Computation” sponsored by MPCST from 4 to 6 January 2024.

The college faculty was actively engaged in research and publication. The college teachers published 03 self-authored books, 07 edited books, 01 monograph. The faculty attended and participated in International (03), National (91), Workshops (12), and Faculty Development Programmes (82). Research & Publication in this session had been fruitful and rewarding. The faculty members published 12 research papers in Scopus Index, 12 in Web of Science, 17 in UGC Care List and 99 book chapters in various reputed international and national journals.

I am happy to share that in the session 2023-24, as per the *India Today* magazine of higher education institutions, the College secured the following All India ranking: 74<sup>th</sup> in Arts, 89<sup>th</sup> in Commerce, 105<sup>th</sup> in B.B.A., 104<sup>th</sup> in Science and 131<sup>st</sup> in B.C.A.

The departments of the college provided varied opportunities to students to excel and participate in different curricular and extra-curricular activities conducted through various fests viz Lit Fest, Chem-Fest, Zoo-Fest, Eco-Fest, *Vigyanam Garjana*, Bharat Business Conclave 2.0 and *Meraki*.

The Annual Prize distribution ceremony for the session 2021-22 was held on December 20, 2023. The Chief Guest for the function was Most Rev. Leopoldo Girelli, Apostolic Nuncio, India and Nepal, Most Rev. Gerald Almeida, Bishop, Catholic Diocese of Jabalpur and Fr. Abraham T., Vicar General present as the Guest of Honour. The meritorious students were rewarded with 40 gold medals and 40 certificates from various fields. The Annual Prize distribution ceremony for the session 2022-23 was held on February 22, 2024. The Chief Guest for the function was Justice Rajendra Menon, Chairman armed Forces Tribunal, The programme was presided over by Most Rev. Gerald Almeida, Bishop, Catholic Diocese of Jabalpur and the Special Guest, Former Principal, St. Aloysius' College and Director, St. Aloysius Institute of Technology, Dr. Fr. Davis George. The meritorious students were rewarded with a total of 47 gold medals and 35 certificates from different streams. It gives me great pleasure to report that our college has attained research center status in the field of commerce.

The Placement Cell organised training sessions and placement drives for the final year students via programme called *UDAAN* in collaboration with TIME that benefitted numerous students for their upcoming future. Such programmes lead to achievements, Ms. Keya Chakraborty of M.Sc. IV semester-Physics was selected as Optical Engineer (on project) in LEOS, Laboratory of Electro-optical Systems, ISRO Bangalore, 80 students have also been placed in companies like Collabera, Concentrix, Jaro Education, Codeyoung, Teleperformance, No Broker, SBI Securities, SBI Credit Cards, Planet Spark, TCS, Sutherland, Assist Click, and British Telecom.

#### **EXTRA-CURRICULAR:**

“The quality of life is determined by its activities” said Aristotle. The college has a remarkable track record in extracurricular activities and is at the forefront in leading by example in various co-curricular activities ever since its inception. In NCC, the cadets have performed outstandingly and brought laurels to the institution. In the session, Cadet Aditi Chouksey (Ship Modeling Briefer), Cadet Aditi Mishra (Singing), Cadet Praduman Dubey (PMs Rally), Cadet Captain Harshit Singh Mehrolia (All India Best Cadet) participated in the prestigious Republic Day Camp 2024 at New Delhi and Cadet Shilpa Panna and Cadet Bharti Verma attended the Nau Sainik Camp at INS Shivaji Lonavala, Mumbai. Cadet Captain Harshit Mehrolia secured second position as all India Best Cadet in Senior Division Navy, was also recipient of the Warrior Medallion from Corps Commander of 21 Corps in Bhopal Military Station, and a medal from Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, a cheque of Rs. 2100 from Hon'ble Governor of Madhya Pradesh, cash prize of Rs. 2500

from Corps Commander of 21 Corps Bhopal Military Station, Rs. 30,000 as cash prize from Hon'ble Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh and Rs. 25000 from Additional Director General of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh Directorate. SUO Adeeti Mishra and UO Yashika Jain received cash prizes of Rs. 3500 each as group level Best Cadet.

In the cultural field, Falguni Ghansela participated in the National Youth Festival at Agricultural University, Jalandhar and secured 2<sup>nd</sup> position in Western Solo and 3<sup>rd</sup> position in Solo Sugam singing competition and Sidharth Tiwari secured 6<sup>th</sup> position in Quiz. The college students participated in Zonal Youth Festival organized at Subharti Merrut from 29 -31 January 2024. The students won first prize in quiz competition and Solo western.

#### **SPORTS:**

The college sustains commendable success rate in sports activities from the time of its inception. This year in sports, the college performed excellently as evident in its multiple awards detailed below. At the International levels: Mehak Jaiswal (B.A. IV Sem.)- 2<sup>nd</sup> position in 1<sup>st</sup> Asian Dueball Championship in December 2023, Mumbai; Tanya Jatav (B.Com. IV Sem.)-5<sup>th</sup> place in 11<sup>th</sup> Asian Junior Wushu Championship in August 2023 Macao, China; Rubina Francis (M.Com. I Sem.)- bronze medal in Shooting Asian Para Games 2023-24, Hangzhou, China and Aarti Tiwari (B.A. II Sem.) and Sapna Pandey (B.Com. II Sem.)- Two bronze medals in individual and team events in 13<sup>th</sup> Silent Knight Karate Cup at Malaysia. At the National level: Vanshika Namdeo (B.Com. IV Sem.)- gold medal in Wushu National Games and Chirag Vidhyarthi (B.Com. III Year)- gold medal in Archery National Games, Goa. *Khelo* India National Games: Tanya Jatav (B.Com. IV Sem.)- gold medal in Wushu, Bhagwati Nagar, Jammu and Vanshika Namdeo (B.Com. IV Sem.)- bronze medal in Wushu in February Rachi, Jharkhand. At South West Zone Competitions: Amey Rai (B.A. I Year)- gold medal in Archery at Bhatinda University; Amit Kumar (B.A. II Year)- Overall gold medal in Archery; Kritika Bichpuriya (B.C.A. II year)-two gold medals in Archery; Aarti Tiwari (B.A. I year)- silver medal in Karate in January, Bhopal and Chirag Vidhyarthi (B.Com. III Year)- One silver and two bronze medals in Archery. At All India University level: Vanshika Namdeo (B.Com. IV Sem.)- four gold medals at All India University at University of Jammu; Tanya Jatav (B.Com. IV Sem.)- two gold medals at All India University at University of Jammu and Chirag Vidhyarthi (B.Com. III Year)- gold medal in Archery at Patiala University.

The college teams participated in Intercollegiate tournaments organised by the various colleges under the supervision of Rani Durgavati Vishwavidhyalaya, Jabalpur and were winners in- Badminton (men & women); Chess (men & women); Football (women); Basketball (men & women); Volleyball (men); and Kho Kho. The College teams were runners-up in Cricket, Table Tennis (women), Kabaddi, Football (men), Handball (men), Cricket (women), Football (men). In the session 2023-24 students participated in various games and earned laurels for the college. At International level 05, *Khelo* India University 06, All India University 12, Inter University 22, Nationals 13, *Khelo* India National 02, National Games 02, State 57 and District 96 students participated.

# Quantum Computing: A Technological Revolution

At first, when we hear about quantum computers or quantum technology, our brain will picturize an advanced technical computer or system that can work as efficiently as Supercomputers. But when we'll dive into this concept, it is much more than that. The word "Quantum" comes from Latin, which says "an amount" or "how much?" A Quantum is the minimum amount of any physical entity involved in an interaction. It means if something is quantifiable, then it can be measured. "Quantum" is a word that is widely used in the field of science as – Quantum physics, Quantum chemistry, Quantum mechanics, etc.

## HOW AND WHEN IT CAME?

In computer science, the term "Quantum computing" first appeared in the early 1980s. One of the earliest references to quantum computing can be found in a seminal paper published in 1982 by physicist Richard Feynman. However, quantum computing truly began to gain momentum in the mid-1990s. David Deutsch, a British physicist at the University of Oxford was the first person who proposed the idea of a machine having quantum components which can test the existence of parallel universes and since then he became known as the "father of Quantum computing". His paper in 1985 paved the way for the rudimentary quantum computers that scientists are working on today.

## HOW IT ACTUALLY WORKS?

Quantum computing harnesses the principles of Quantum mechanics, which is a theory of physics that describes the behavior of matter and energy at the smallest scales such as atoms, molecules and sub-atomic particles. Quantum computing is an evolving & advancing

technology in computer science that is rapidly gaining popularity and has gained attention from a lot of IT enthusiasts, scientists, physicists, and so on. Unlike traditional computing in which we compute data and perform calculations using binary bits 0 & 1, Quantum computing uses quantum bits which are termed as 'Qubits'. Qubits can exist in a superposition of multiple states simultaneously, allowing quantum computers to perform many calculations in parallel, which makes these computers 10-20 times more efficient and faster than today's classical computers. This technology can solve complex and large-scale problems. In simpler words, Quantum computing is nothing but programming and computation at atomic/sub-atomic level by manipulating atoms and other particles using the principles of Quantum mechanics. One of the key-elements in this technology is to maintain the atom stability by cooling down the system till the temperature goes to minus Celsius.

## THE CURRENT LEADER IN QUANTUM COMPUTING

IBM (International Business Machines), which is one of the world's oldest and largest technological MNCs introduced the world's first circuit-based commercial quantum computer in January 2019 and named it "Quantum System One". IBM dedicated their Quantum computer to healthcare research at Cleveland Clinic, Ohio in March 2023. Also, IBM unveiled their "Quantum System Two" on 4<sup>th</sup> December 2023. Other top IT companies like—Google, Amazon, Microsoft, Intel, etc. are actively researching and working on this technology to have both hands on it.

If all other countries are in this race, then where does India stand? On 19<sup>th</sup> April 2023, our Union information and

Broadcasting minister Anurag Singh Thakur announced 'National Quantum Mission' which aims to develop 50 to 1000 qubits of quantum computing hardware, 2000 kms of quantum communication network, and foster a domestic ecosystem of quantum research. India's biggest IT company, TCS has started TCS Quantum Computing Lab on AWS. IIT Delhi offers a Quantum Computing course to students and other universities like – IIT Madras, IIT Bombay and many more also help the students to know, understand and study about this technology.

WILL IT BE A REVOLUTION?

Today, quantum computing is an

active area of research and development, with significant investments from governments, academia, and industry. On the other hand, big-scale quantum computers are still being researched by scientists and professionals and are yet to be realized. Machine Learning, AI, etc. are hence recognized as future technology that'll have a major impact on the globe. This technology is still five to ten years away from us, still it holds a great promise for revolutionizing computation and technical advancement.

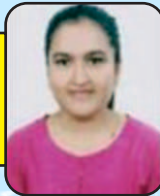

## Glimpses of Past 72 Years

It is said, "Try not to become a man of success, but rather try to become a man of value". The college occupies a position not only in shaping the career of the future generations, but also for sensitizing them to the needs of humanity and instilling in them a strong value system. Aloysians are convinced that "whatever we did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters, we did for God" (Mt. 25:40). Since 1951, St. Aloysius' College stands firm with its constructive and productive outlook, in contributing effectively to the teaching-learning, ethical living and service towards humanity. In this effort the college did not strive for people's approval, rather searched for the approval that comes from God (Jn 12:42-43). As an institution we did not try to convert anyone, but yes, we were involved in transforming students to be better humans and better citizens of Bharat. We always tried to maintain a family atmosphere in the campus.

The college was established with 52 students. After 20 years (1971-72) the college had 257 students. 40 years later (1991-92) had 803 students. In the 60<sup>th</sup> year (2011-22) there were 2793 students and as of today (72<sup>nd</sup> year) 5542 students are studying in the college. The college offered B.A. & B.Sc. from 1951 to 1998. From the year 1999 a number of new courses were introduced. Now it is offering B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.B.A., B.C.A., B.Ed., M.Com., M.A. in 3 subjects, M.Sc. in 7 subjects and is a research centres for 5 Ph.D. Programmes. We are happy to share that the college has been accredited three times by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Government of India. In all the three accreditations the college was accredited with A+ Grade and remained the top most college in the state of M.P. We were the first private college given Autonomous Status and College with Potential for Excellence by the UGC. The Department of Biotechnology has conferred upon us the Star College Status and the Department of Science and Technology; Government of India has

supported us with grants for the PG departments. We are the only private college in MP to have achieved these milestones.

In academics, our students have performed well. Our results have been above 98 percent in all years. With regard to students' enrollment, there is a gradual shift in favour of female students. Presently, female students account for 53 percent and 47 percent are males. For the last 10 years, more than 98 students of NCC & NSS have participated in the International Youth Exchange programmes and Republic Day Parade. 12 students have participated at the International level sports and games and have been awarded medals. More than 1265 students procured placements through placement activities conducted at the college level. For the last 10 years 1664 students have been given financial help by the college management and alumni.

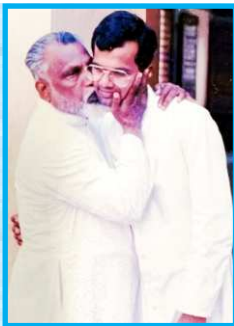
We are happy to announce that our ex-students are doing well in the civil services, police, army, education, business and political field etc... At present there are 4 sitting High Court judges and many more retired judges from the Supreme Court and High Courts. Two of our students have become the Director General of Police, in M.P.

Our faculty too has contributed remarkably towards higher education by disseminating knowledge through innovative means. In the last 10 years, 39 students have attained Ph.D. under the supervision of our teachers. 11 Major Research Projects and 29 Minor Research Projects have been completed. 61 books have been authored and edited. 861 research papers have been published in international and national journals and chapters in edited books. 20 teachers have visited abroad to present their papers at international conferences.

# Department of English

“Persevere -Excel- Promote- Quality” is the motto of the Department of English since 1951. Fostering better Communication of ideas through speech and writing is the aim and objective of the department. The highlights of the academic year 2023-24 are as follows:

- ❖ Literary Competition: Annual Literary competitions were organized in the month of November 2023 in which various events like debate, speech, extempore, essays were conducted.
- ❖ Guest Lectures: To provide exposure and better understanding regular teaching is supplemented with guest lectures by eminent speakers for both the PG and UG students. Alumna guest lecture on “Figures of Speech” was delivered by Ms. Arya Pandey and 'Content Writing' was delivered by Ms. Moulshree Sarwate. Dr. Shibani Basu Dubey, Head, Dept. of English, BSSS College, Bhopal delivered a lecture on “Narrative Insights on Aristotle's Poetics” through virtual platform.
- ❖ News Letters: “The Aloysian Times”, the college newsletters, were released in three volumes in September 2023, November 2023 and January 2024 respectively.

## Department of Economics

This annual report encapsulates the endeavors and achievements of the department in the academic year 2023-2024-

- ❖ Collaboration with the National Statistical Office to celebrate National Statistical Day (i.e. 29 June 2023), emphasizing the importance of statistical data in informed decision-making.
- ❖ Certificate courses and guest lectures on Advertisement and Sales Promotion, providing students with practical insights into marketing strategies.
- ❖ Internship programs, community services, field projects and bridge/remedial classes aimed at enhancing students' practical skills and supporting weak learners.
- ❖ Environment Awareness Program organized on 30 September 2023 in collaboration with Kadam Foundation, reflecting the department's commitment to societal and environmental concerns.
- ❖ Workshops on Graphics Designing in Advertisement was conducted on 7 October providing students with practical skills relevant to the industry.

# Department of Commerce

The Department of Commerce commenced its academic journey with the overarching theme of 'In Pursuit of Excellence,' committed to achieving this goal through a diverse array of initiatives and activities. Below is a comprehensive summary of the department's highlights for the academic year 2023-24

- ❖ Aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP), the department offered a variety of major, minor, and elective courses. Infostering international collaboration, the department conducted an online certificate course in GLOBAL BUSINESS in partnership with La Salle University, Colombia, and East Carolina University, USA. The women cell was established in 1997 with the motto “Duty makes us do things well but love makes us do them beautifully”.The cell encourages greater participation and develops responsible and value-oriented leadership among women students. The following activities were conducted in the year 2023-24:

- ❖ Awareness Programme: Women Cell organized Awareness Programme on 24 to 26 August, 2023. ## चन्द्रयान – 3

गीतांजलि गुप्ता

बी.ए. प्रथम सेमेस्टर

हिन्दी में चन्द्रयान का अनुवाद चन्द्र वाहन के रूप में किया जाता है। भारत के सबसे पहले चन्द्र मिशन को चन्द्रयान कहा गया है। यह भारत के लिये अग्रणी एवं महत्वपूर्ण उपलब्धि भी है, क्योंकि इसने उसे चन्द्रमा पर पहुँचने वाला अमेरिका, रूस, चीन के बाद चौथा देश बना दिया ॥

मिशन चन्द्रयान – भारत अंतरिक्ष अनुसंधान संगठन (इसरो) ने 2008 में लांच किया था। चंद्रयान-1 को 2008 में श्रीहरिकोटा से लांच किया गया था। इसने हमें चन्द्रमा पर खनिजों के बारे में विस्तृत जानकारी प्रदान की, परन्तु तकनीकी दिक्कतों और संचार में रुकावट की वजह से पूरा सफल नहीं हुआ। अतः चन्द्रयान-2 को 22 जुलाई 2019 को लांच किया गया, यह चन्द्रमा की सतह पर पानी का पता लगाने के उद्देश्य से बनाया गया था, परन्तु इसका लैंडर और रोवर चन्द्रमा की सतह पर दुर्घटनाग्रस्त हो गये और यह विफल हो गया।

पिछले मिशन के अनुरूप 14 जुलाई 2023 को दोपहर 2:51 बजे चन्द्रयान-3 लॉन्च किया गया। चन्द्रयान-3 में भारत ने अपने वैज्ञानिक अध्ययन, खोज और अभियांत्रिकी मजबूती के लिये इस प्रकार विक्रम लैंडर और रोवर चाँद पर भेजा।

इस यान में एक आर्बिट भी शामिल किया गया है। जो चन्द्रमा की सतह की पूरी तरह निगरानी करेगा। यह एक मल्टी वार्ट मिशन है, इसमें उन्नत संचार, जल, ऊर्जा प्रबंधन और उच्च क्षमता की बैटरी शामिल है।

चन्द्रयान-3 का लैंडर :- चन्द्रयान-3 का लैंडर विक्रम नाम से है। यह लैंडर चन्द्रमा की सतह पर उतरेगा और रोवर को छोड़ेगा। रोवर चन्द्रमा की सतह पर वैज्ञानिक प्रयोग करेगा। विक्रम लैंडर 1475 किलोग्राम वजनी और 45 मी. लम्बा है। इसमें एक पैराशूट भी है जो इसे चन्द्रमा की सतह पर सुरक्षित रूप से उतारने में मदद करेगा।

चंद्रयान-3 का रोवर:- चन्द्रयान-3 का रोवर प्रज्ञान नाम से है, यह 135 किलोग्राम का 6.5 मी लम्बा है यह चन्द्रमा की सतह पर वैज्ञानिक प्रयोग करेगा।

चन्द्रयान-3 की विशेषता:

चंद्रयान-3 की विशेषताएं कुछ इस प्रकार हैं-

- चन्द्रयान-3 को चन्द्रमा के दक्षिणी ध्रुव भाग पर उतारा जायेगा।

- यह यान चन्द्रमा पर मौजूद पानी और बर्फ की उपस्थिति के बारे में बताएगा।

- यह चन्द्रमा पर मौजूद प्राकृतिक तत्व एवं खनिजों की जानकारी प्रदान करेगा।

- चन्द्रमा की सतह की बनावट और अगर किसी प्रकार के जीव-जन्तु मौजूद होंगे तो उसकी जानकारी साझा करेगा।

- यह चन्द्रमा के वायुमण्डल की जाँच कर वहाँ मौजूद प्राकृतिक गैसों की जानकारी भी साझा करेगा।

**चन्द्रयान-3 को बनाने का उद्देश्य**

चन्द्रयान-3 अगर सफल होता है तो यह भारत को अंतरिक्ष विज्ञान के क्षेत्र में अलग पहचान देगा। यह भारत के लिये एक महत्वपूर्ण मिशन है, इसे बनाने का उद्देश्य इस प्रकार है-

- चन्द्रयान-3 भारत को चन्द्र की ओर आगे बढ़ने में मदद कर सकता है।

- चन्द्रयान-3 के सफल होने के बाद भारत चाँद पर जाने वाले एक नये देश के रूप में जाना जायेगा।

**चन्द्रयान-3 के सफल होने से भारत को लाभ**

इंडियन स्पेस रिसर्च ऑर्गनाइजेशन द्वारा - 2008 में पहला चन्द्र मिशन शुरू किया गया। चन्द्रयान-1 सफल रहा-बाद में 2019 में चंद्रयान-2 को भेजने की कोशिश की गई लेकिन वह असफल रही। अब तीसरी बार चंद्रयान-3 को भेजा गया है, अगर यह सफल होता है, तो भारत को निम्न प्रकार के फायदें होंगे- चंद्रयान से देश के युवाओं को अंतरिक्ष से जुड़ी जानकारियाँ प्राप्त होगी।

- देश के सभी लोगों को चन्द्रमा की बनावट के बारे में पता चलेगा।

- इस मिशन के सफल होने से अंतरिक्ष क्षेत्र में नयी पहचान मिलेगी।

- चन्द्रयान-3 के वैज्ञानिक प्रयोग चन्द्रमा के दक्षिणी ध्रुव पर पानी की, बर्फ की उपस्थिति, चन्द्रमा के गुरुत्वाकर्षण क्षेत्र और वायुमण्डल का अध्ययन करेगा।

- चंद्रयान-3 भारत के वैज्ञानिकों और इंजीनियरों के लिये एक चुनौती होगी और उन्हें तकनीकों को विकसित करने में मदद करेगा।

- यह भारत के युवाओं को अंतरिक्ष विज्ञान और प्रौद्योगिकी के क्षेत्र में कैरियर बनाने के लिए प्रेरित करेगा।

- चन्द्रयान-3 भारत के लिए गौरव का विषय होगा। यह संचार क्षेत्र में भारत की ताकत को भी प्रदर्शित करेगा। एक सफल मिशन भारत को अंतरिक्ष समुदाय में अधिक मजबूत बनाने को प्रेरित करेगा।

निष्कर्ष: चन्द्रयान-3 भारत के अंतरिक्ष रहस्यों की खोज और मानव ब्रह्मांड के बारे में ज्ञान का योगदान देने में एक बड़ा कदम है। चन्द्रयान-3 मॉड्यूल लॉच होने का समय लगभग एक महीने से लेकर चाँद तक पहुँचने तक का है, इसके लिए लैंड से प्लॉट की योजना 23-24 अगस्त 2023 निर्धारित की गई है। यह भारत के लिए बहुत ही महत्वपूर्ण और गौरवशाली कदम है। चन्द्रयान-3 भारत में अंतरिक्ष और वैज्ञानिक खोज के लिए एक भविष्य का निर्माण करना चाहता है।

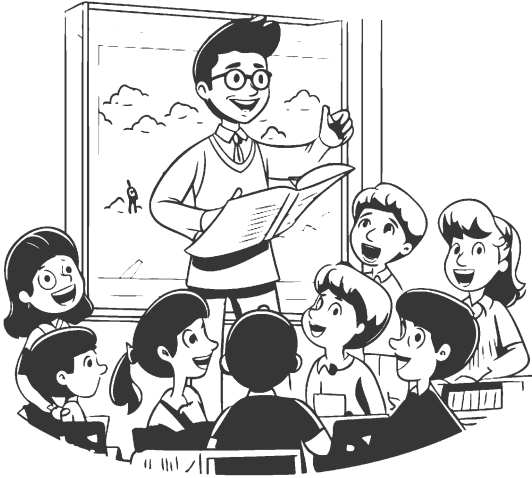

# आरक्षण : अभिशाप या वरदान

आरक्षण का हाल यही है, एक समय था रक्षक।।  
लेकिन आज विनाशक बनकर महाकाल बन आया।  
योग्य युवा की आशाओं को ग्रास बनाकर खाया ।।”

जब भारत अंग्रेजों की गुलामी से मुक्त हुआ तब देश में अपना संविधान लागू हुआ। उस समय देश में दलित वर्ग की स्थिति अत्यंत दयनीय थी। उन्हें न तो राजनीति में कोई स्थान प्राप्त था और न समाज में। समाज में तो उन्हें अत्यंत हेय दृष्टि से देखा जाता था। ऐसी स्थितियों को देखकर उनका उत्थान करने की भावना को दृष्टिपथ में रखते हुए देश के संविधान निर्माताओं ने उनके लिए आरक्षण की व्यवस्था की।

**वर्तमान समय में आरक्षण का बिगड़ता स्वरूप :-**

देश के संविधान निर्माताओं ने दलित वर्ग के उत्थान के लिए जिस आरक्षण नीति का सूत्रपात किया, कालान्तर में वहीं नीति स्वार्थी और भ्रष्टाचारी नेताओं की लिप्सापूर्ति का साधन बन गई है। जातीय आधार पर किए गए आरक्षण व्यवस्था के कारण आरक्षण के अंतर्गत आने वाले समृद्धशाली लोगों ने इसका अत्यधिक लाभ उठाया। निर्धन सवर्ण अपने सामने अपने सपनों पर समृद्ध आरक्षित वर्ग का अधिकार देखता रहा। अयोग्य लोग चुन-चुन कर राजकीय सेवाओं में पहुँच गए। योग्य वर्ग असहाय दृष्टि से केवल देखता ही रह गया।

वर्ष 1953 में प्रथम आयोग का गठन किया गया था। इसके अध्यक्ष काका कालेलकर थे। इस आयोग ने अनुसूचित जाति, अनुसूचित जनजाति के साथ ऐसी जातियों की सूची में रखने का अनुमोदन किया जो सामाजिक, शैक्षिक और सरकारी सेवाओं के क्षेत्र में अत्यंत पिछड़ी थीं। इसके अंतर्गत पिछड़ी जातियों को 27% आरक्षण देने की सिफारिश की गई। इसे तत्कालीन प्रधानमंत्री वी.पी. सिंह ने लागू करने का प्रयास किया। तब इसके विरोध में युवा वर्ग ने भयानक रूप धारण कर लिया तथा कई युवाओं ने आत्मदाह करने का प्रयास भी किया।

**वर्तमान समय में आरक्षण की आवश्यकता :-**

देश में जब आरक्षण नीति लागू की गई थी, तब से लेकर आज तक वर्तमान समय में देश में परिस्थितियाँ परिवर्तित हो चुकी हैं उस समय जातिगत जागरण की आवश्यकता थी किन्तु आज के परिप्रेक्ष्य में आर्थिक आधार पर आरक्षण की आवश्यकता है। यद्यपि जब संविधान में आरक्षण

की व्यवस्था केवल 10 वर्ष तक के लिए की गई थी किन्तु राजनयिकों ने अपनी कुर्सी मजबूत करने के उद्देश्य से इस व्यवस्था को आज़ादी के इतने वर्षों बाद भी कायम रखा है। आज समाज में ऊँच-नीच और भेदभाव की भावना डालने में जातिगत आरक्षण का बहुत बड़ा हाथ है। व्यावहारिक रूप में समाज में अब जातिगत भेदभाव नहीं रह गया है किन्तु आरक्षण का काँटा सवर्णों के हृदय को निरंतर भेदता रहा है। इसी कारण आरक्षित वर्ग आज उनकी ईर्ष्या और द्वेष का शिकार हो जाता है।

**उपसंहार :-**

यदि कोई समस्या होती है तो उसका समाधान भी अवश्य है। आरक्षण की समस्या का समाधान है कि संविधान में संशोधन करके आर्थिक आधार पर आरक्षण की व्यवस्था की जाए। जातिगत आरक्षण समाप्त कर दिया जाए। इससे एक तो समान से परस्पर वैमनस्यता की भावना दूर होगी। दूसरे योग्य और निर्धन सवर्ण बेरोजगारों को भी सरकारी सेवा में आने का तथा उच्च शिक्षा प्राप्त करने का अवसर प्राप्त होगा। तभी देश का वास्तविक रूप से विकास होगा। देश का विकास युवाओं की उन्नति और विकास पर ही निर्भर है। अतः ऐसा होने पर ही खुला आसमान सबके लिए बिना किसी पक्षपात की भावना के उपलब्ध हो सकेगा।

हमारे शरीर का हर अंग जरूरी है। कुछ अंगों को हम देख सकते हैं – और कुछ अंग होते हैं, जो हमारे शरीर के अंदर होते हैं, जिन्हें हम देख नहीं पाते। मानव शरीर के सभी अंग अपने-अपने स्तर पर अपनी अहम् भूमिका निभाते हैं, कान भी मानव शरीर के अंगों का भाग है। जो हमारी इंद्रियाँ होती हैं, उनमें हमारे कान भी शामिल होते हैं, जो हमारी सुनने की क्षमता और शक्ति दोनों रखते हैं। ये बात एकदम सही है, कि जब भी हम कोई कार्य जरूरत से ज्यादा या अपनी सीमा के बाहर आकर करते हैं, तो वह हमारे लिए परेशानी का विषय बन जाता है, इसी बात को हम आवाज़, शोर या ध्वनि के साथ भी जोड़ सकते हैं।

## ध्वनि प्रदूषण क्या है? :-

ध्वनि प्रदूषण वह स्थिति होती है, जिस समय हमारे आसपास या पर्यावरण में आवाज या शोर का स्तर सामान्य स्तर से बहुत अधिक हो, हमारे वातावरण में जरूरत से अधिक शोर होने के कारण पशुओं एवं मनुष्यों को परेशानी होती हो तथा हानि पहुँचती है। तेज आवाज से प्रकृति का संतुलन भी बिगड़ जाता है। किसी भी प्रकार की तेज आवाज या ध्वनि किसी भी दूसरी आवाज को दबा देती है, आज के इस आधुनिक युग में तेज ध्वनि का खतरा तेजी से बढ़ता जा रहा है। हमें स्वयं के प्रयास से ही ध्वनि प्रदूषण को रोकना होगा। अन्यथा वे दिन दूर नहीं जब हर दूसरा व्यक्ति किसी भी बात को पूर्णतः सुनने में सक्षम नहीं होगा।

## ध्वनि प्रदूषण की परिभाषा:-

वह आवाज़ या ध्वनि जो हमारे कानों को कष्ट पहुँचाए, जिसका हमारे दिमाग पर बुरा प्रभाव पड़ता हो, उसे ही ध्वनि प्रदूषण कहा जाता है। दुनिया में जैसे-जैसे टेलीविजन, साउंड स्पीकर, यातायात के साधन, मशीनें आदि बढ़ रही हैं, उसी प्रकार ध्वनि प्रदूषण भी तेजी से बढ़ रहा है, जो जीव –जन्तुओं को हानि पहुँचाता है, सरल भाषा में कोई भी ध्वनि जब जरूरत से ज्यादा हो, तो वह शोर की श्रेणी में आ जाती है।

## ध्वनि प्रदूषण के कारण :-

ध्वनि प्रदूषण होने कई कारण होते हैं, सबसे पहले तो यातायात, वाहन, लाउडस्पीकर एवं साउंड सिस्टम से ध्वनि प्रदूषण होता है, कई धार्मिक स्थलों पर भी लाउड स्पीकर लगे होते हैं, जिनसे निकलने वाली आवाज भी ध्वनि प्रदूषण करती है, शहरों में यातायात के साधन जैसे बस, बाईक, कार, अंडर ग्राउंड ट्रेन आदि बढ़ता ही जा रहा है। जिससे शहरों में शोर भी बढ़ रहा है। जब किसी मकान, दुकान, सड़क, पुल, भवन, बाँध, स्टेशन आदि का निर्माण होता है और उनके निर्माण में बड़ी-बड़ी मशीनें और यंत्र लगाए जाते हैं, वो भी उच्च स्तर का शोर उत्पन्न करते हैं। दिवाली का त्यौहार हो या घर में शादी हो, हम जिन पटाखों का इस्तेमाल करते हैं, उससे निकलने वाली आवाज़ भी ध्वनि प्रदूषण की वजह बनती है। रोजमर्रा की जिंदगी में काम आने वाले घरेलू उपकरण भी ध्वनि प्रदूषण का मुख्य कारण बनते जा रहे हैं।

## ध्वनि प्रदूषण के स्रोत :-

ध्वनि प्रदूषण मुख्य दो प्रकार के है, 1. प्राकृतिक स्रोत 2. मानवीय या कृत्रिम स्रोत ।

1. प्राकृतिक स्रोत :- जब बादल गरजते हैं, बिजली कड़कती है, तूफानी हवायें चलती है, ज्वालामुखी का विस्फोट होता है, भूकंप आता है, समुद्री तट पर लहरें टकराती है, या झरनों से नदी में जल गिरता है, तो उसे ध्वनि प्रदूषण के प्राकृतिक स्रोत में जोड़ा जाता है।

2. मानवीय स्रोत :- जब औद्योगिक संस्थान, परिवहन साधन, मनोरंजन के साधन, विद्युत उपकरण, मानवीय क्रियाओं आदि से जो शोर पैदा होता है, उसे ध्वनि प्रदूषण के मानवीय स्रोत में शामिल किया जाता है।

## ध्वनि प्रदूषण के प्रभाव :-

- इंसान के काम करने की क्षमता और गुणवत्ता में कमी आना, एकाग्रता को कम करना, थकान महसूस होना है।
- गर्भवती महिलाओं को गंभीर रूप से प्रभावित करना।
- छोटे बच्चों और बड़े-बुजुर्गों पर सबसे ज्यादा असर होगा
- लोगों को विभिन्न बीमारियों जैसे उच्च रक्तचाप और मानसिक बीमारी का शिकार होना ।
- मन की शांति भंग करना।
- मनुष्य के स्वभाव में चिड़चिड़ापन रहना।
- अस्थायी या स्थायी बहरापन का कारण बनना।

## ध्वनि प्रदूषण रोकने के उपाय :-

- सबसे पहले लोगों को ध्वनि प्रदूषण के बारे में जागरूक करना होगा।
- जगह-जगह शांतिपूर्ण तरीके से प्रचार – प्रसार करना होगा।
- सड़कों की चौड़ाई बढ़ानी होगी जिससे जाम ना लगे और शोर कम पैदा हो।
- हरियाली को बढ़ाना होगा।
- प्रेशर वाले हार्न का उपयोग बंद करना होगा।
- पुराने वाहनों के चलाने पर रोक लगानी होगी।

इस पृथ्वी पर या प्राकृतिक संसाधनों पर हम सभी का बराबर अधिकार है, फिर चाहे वह कोई मनुष्य हो या कोई जानवर। हमें अपने मनोरंजन या लाभ से पहले यह सोचना चाहिए कि कहीं इसका किसी पर दुष्प्रभाव न पड़े या किसी प्रकार की कोई हानि न पहुंचे हम सभी के सहयोग और सकारात्मक सोच से ही प्रदूषण के प्रकार ध्वनि प्रदूषण को जड़ से खत्म किया जा सकता है और उस पर विजय हासिल की जा सकती है।

जो रखे समय का ध्यान,

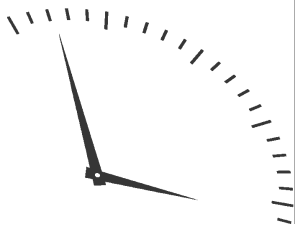

छत्रपति शिवाजी महाराज का विवाह सईबाई निवालकर के साथ हुआ था। उनके पुत्र का नाम संभाजी था। वे शिवाजी के ज्येष्ठ पुत्र व उत्तराधिकारी थे, जिसने 1680 से 1689 ई तक राज्य किया। संभाजी में अपने पिता की कर्मठता व दृढ़ संकल्प का अभाव था। उसका पुत्र व उत्तराधिकारी राजारामथा। शिवाजी के गुरु समर्थ गुरु रामदास का नाम भारत के साधु संतों व विद्वत समाज में सुविख्यात है।

नेपोलियन को पराजित करने वाले एडवर्ड नेल्सन की यह पंक्ति खेल के महत्व को बयां करने के लिए पर्याप्त है। खेल न केवल हमें स्वस्थ रहने में योगदान देकर सक्षम बनाते हैं वरन् वर्तमान युग की संकीर्णवादी सोच के विरुद्ध हमें निष्पक्ष, सहिष्णु तथा विनम्र बनाकर एक बेहतर मानव संसाधन के रूप में बदलते हैं। खेलों की महत्ता को दुनिया, समाज व सभ्यता में स्वीकृति मिली है। रामायण, महाभारत के प्रत्येक समाज से लेकर ग्रीको-रोमन दंत कथाओं में होने वाले खेलों का जिक्र इस बात का प्रमाण है। पुनः ओलंपिक की प्रारंभिक शुरुआत यह स्पष्ट करती है कि खेलों को संस्थानिक महत्व मिलता रहा है।

वर्तमान परिवेश व जीवनशैली में आज मनुष्य जब अनेक रोगों से ग्रस्त हो रहा है। ऐसे समय में खेलों का महत्व स्वयमेव स्पष्ट हो जाता है। खेलों के द्वारा हमारी दिनचर्या नियमित रहती है बल्कि ये उच्च रक्तचाप, ब्लड शुगर, मोटापा, हृदय रोग जैसी बीमारियों की संभावनाओं को भी न्यून करते हैं। इसके

अलावा खेल द्वारा हमें स्वयं को चुस्त-दुरुस्त रखने में भी मदद मिलती है, जिससे हम अपने दायित्वों का निर्वहन सक्रियतापूर्वक कर पाते हैं।

एक अच्छा जीवन जीने हेतु अच्छे स्वास्थ्य का होना बहुत जरूरी है। जिस प्रकार शरीर को अच्छा व स्वस्थ रखने के लिए व्यायाम की आवश्यकता होती है उसी प्रकार खेलकूद का अत्याधिक महत्व है। खेल बच्चों और युवाओं के मानसिक तथा शारीरिक विकास दोनों ही के लिए अति आवश्यक है। नई पीढ़ी को कितनी ज्ञान के साथ-साथ खेलों में भी रुचि बढ़ाने की जरूरत है।

परंपरागत रूप से भारत के मध्यम वर्ग की धारणा रोजगारपरकता के लिहाज के प्रति नकारात्मक रही है। खेलकूद को मनुष्य के बौद्धिक व रोजगार प्राप्ति का बाधक मानते हुए कहा जाता है कि – ‘पढ़ोगे लिखोगे तो बनोगे नवाब, खेलोगे-कूदोगे तो होगे खराब।’ परंतु बदलते समय के साथ यह साबित हो गया कि खेल मनुष्य के विकास में बाधक नहीं वरन् सहायक है। बगैर शैक्षणिक, उपलब्धि के भी सचिन तेंदुलकर द्वारा अर्जित यश, सम्मान, धन, लोकप्रियता आदि

इस बात के सुंदर उदाहरण हैं। सचिन तेंदुलकर द्वारा देश का सर्वोच्च सम्मान भारत रत्न प्राप्त करना, वर्तमान परिदृश्य में खेलों की महत्ता को दर्शाता है। आज सचिन ही नहीं वरन् सुशील कुमार, सानिया मिर्जा, अभिनव बिंद्रा, साइना नेहवाल, मैरी कोम व महेंद्र सिंह धोनी जैसे नामों ने सफलता व समृद्धि एवं यश के जो आयाम गढ़े हैं उसके समक्ष संस्थागत शिक्षा का प्रश्न गौण हो जाता है।

सरकार खेल में ख्याति प्राप्त खिलाड़ियों को अनेक पुरस्कारों से सम्मानित करती है। अर्जुन एवं द्रोणाचार्य जैसे पुरस्कार इसी श्रेणी के खेल रत्न के पुरस्कार हैं जो भारत में खेलों में सर्वश्रेष्ठ प्रदर्शन हेतु सरकार द्वारा खिलाड़ियों और गुरुओं को प्रदान किए जाते हैं। हमारे देश की कई महिलाओं यथा—पीटी उषा, मैरी कोम, सायना नेहवाल एवं सानिया मिर्जा ने दुनिया भर में खेल में काफी नाम कमाया है और देश को गौरवान्वित किया है। खेलों को भारतीय संस्कृति एवं एकता का प्रतीक भी माना जाता है। खेल हमारी प्रगति को सुनिश्चित कर जीवन में सफलता प्रदान करते हैं।

आज सरकारी व निजी दोनों क्षेत्रों में खिलाड़ियों के लिए नौकरियाँ पाने के कई अवसर हैं। रेलवे, एअर इंडिया, भारत पेट्रोलियम, ओ.एन.जी.सी, आई-ओ-सी जैसी सरकारी संस्थाओं के साथ-साथ टाटा अकादमी, जिंदल ग्रुप जैसी निजी समूह भी खेलों व खिलाड़ियों के विकास व प्रोत्साहन हेतु प्रतिबद्ध है। इसके अलावा आई.पी.एल., आई.बी.एल., एच.सी.एल., जैसी लोगो तथा स्थानीय क्लबों के स्तर पर भारी निवेश ने खिलाड़ियों के विकल्प को बढ़ाने के साथ-साथ उन्हें बेहतर मंच व अवसर उपलब्ध कराया है। इसे देखते हुए अब कहा जा सकता है कि 'खेलोगे – कूदोगे तो होंगे नवाब'।

इससे यह स्पष्ट होता है कि खेल से न सिर्फ स्वास्थ्य बल्कि

रोजगार एवं यश तथा सम्मान भी प्राप्त होता है। खेल द्वारा राजनैतिक लक्ष्य भी प्राप्त किया जा सकता है। कई देशों में यह देखने में आया है कि खेलों का अप्रत्यक्ष रूप से संबंध देश के विकास से भी होता है। वर्तमान समय में लोगों के खेलों के प्रति नजरिए में काफी बदलाव आया है। खेल हमें विभिन्न प्रकार से शिक्षित भी करते हैं। इससे मानवीय मूल्यों का विकास होता है साथ ही खेलों द्वारा सामूहिक चेतना का भी विकास होता है क्योंकि खेल की मूल भावना यही होती है कि अकेले नहीं बल्कि समूह में खेलना। खेल द्वारा नेतृत्व करने की कला का भी विकास होता है। आजकल खेलों में कई नई प्रौद्योगिकियों का उपयोग किया जा रहा है जिससे खेलों में सटीकता और उसके अनुसार नीति-निर्माण में भी सहायता मिल रही है।

इस प्रकार तमाम वजहों से खेल अपनी उच्च भावना और उद्देश्यों के साथ लोगों के बीच पहुँच ही नहीं पा रहे हैं। वहीं वर्तमान युग के नए खेल व मनोरंजन के तरीके अपनी प्रकृति के अनुरूप लोगों में एकाकीपन तथा मानसिक विकृतियों को जन्म दे रहे हैं।

उपरोक्त वर्णन से यह स्पष्ट होता है कि जीवन में खेलों का महत्व निर्विवाद है। ये न केवल जीवन में गति व लय का संचार करते हैं, हमें जीवन वरन् हमें का महत्वपूर्ण पाठ भी पढ़ाते हैं।

## स्वाधीनता आंदोलन

चलो फिर आज वो नजारा याद करते हैं,  
शहीदों के मन की वो ज्वाला याद करते हैं।  
जिसमें बहकर आजादी पहुँची साहिल तक,  
वो वीर सपूतों की लहू की धारा याद करते हैं।  
15 अगस्त 1947 का दिन भारत के इतिहास में सुनहरे अक्षरों से अंकित है। आज ही के दिन पहली बार भारतियों ने एक स्वतंत्र देश की खुली हवा में साँस ली थी। इस दिन भारत अंग्रेजों की 200 साल की कठोर गुलामी और कृशितियों से आजाद हुआ था। इस आजादी को प्राप्त करने के लिये न जाने कितने ही भारत माता के वीर सपूतों ने हँसते-हँसते अपना बलिदान कर

दिया। यह स्वतंत्र भारत की लड़ाई किसी दायरे में बँधकर नहीं लड़ी गई थी। बल्कि इसे प्राप्त करने के लिये सभी धर्म, जातियों और समूह के लोगों ने मिलकर ब्रिटिश राज्यसत्ता के खिलाफ आवाज उठाई थी। अंग्रेजों द्वारा भारत पर राज करने एवं उनकी सत्ता का अंत करने के लिये पहली बार सन् 1857 में पहला कदम उठाया गया, जिसने पूरे ब्रिटिश साम्राज्य को हिला कर रख दिया।

सन् 1857 में पहली बार भारतवासियों ने अपना देशप्रेम जाहिर किया एवं एक स्वतंत्र भारत की माँग जताई। इस क्रांति में बहुत सारे वीर – वीरांगनाओं ने अपना योगदान दिया एवं

समूचे राष्ट्र को आजादी से वाकिफ कराया। मंगल पाण्डे एक ऐसे क्रांतिकारी थे जिन्होंने सम्पूर्ण भारत में अंग्रेजों के खिलाफ आजादी की क्रांति का बिगुल बजाया। अलग – अलग प्रांतों के शासकों ने, राजा-महाराजाओं ने यहाँ तक की आम आदमियों ने भी अपना योगदान दिया।

आजादी प्राप्त करने के लिये जिन वीरों ने अपने लहू की कीमत चुकाई है, वह है – वीरांगना रानीलक्ष्मी बाई, चंद्रशेखर आजाद जैसे कई वीर हैं, जिनके नामों से हर व्यक्ति परिचित भी नहीं है। हमें अपने वीर जवानों के बलिदान को व्यर्थ नहीं जाने देना है और उनके द्वारा दिलाई गई आजादी का एवं स्वतंत्र भारत का सम्मान हमेशा करना है।

1857 की क्रांति के बावजूद भी भारत को तब स्वतंत्रता प्राप्त नहीं हुई। परन्तु अंग्रेज शासकों के मन में यह बात स्थिर हो गई थी कि अब भारतवासियों को ज्यादा समय तक गुलामी की बेड़ियों में जकड़े रखना मुश्किल है। उन्होंने भारत की आजादी की पहल को तोड़ने के लिये भारतवासियों की सबसे बड़ी ताकत पर वार किया। उन्होंने भारत को धर्म के आधार पर विभाजित किया और आगे जाकर उनका यह प्रयास सफल हो गया। परन्तु अलग-अलग भागों में विभाजित होने के बाद भी भारतीयों ने अपने-अपने स्तर पर स्वतंत्रता की पहल जारी रखी। और अंत समय ऐसा आया जब भारत ने अपने आप को ब्रिटिश चंगुल से आजाद कर लिया। और वह स्वर्णिम दिवस था आज का शुभ दिवस 15 अगस्त 1947।

यह दिन सारे भारतवासियों के लिये हर्षोल्लास से भरा होता है। आज के शुभ अवसर पर सारे भारतवासी अपने प्रिय तिरंगे का सम्मान करते हैं, एवं देश के लिये बलिदान हुए सपूतों का योगदान याद करते हैं। इस दिन सभी सरकारों कार्यालयों, स्कूलों, कॉलेजों हर जगह तिरंगा फहराया जाता है एवं विभिन्न

कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन किया जाता है। सरकारी संस्थानों में आज के दिन अवकाश भी रखा जाता है, एवं सभी लोगों को लड्डू आदि का वितरण किया जाता है।

## कथक नृत्य में कविता

सृष्टि ने जब मानव को रचा, तो अन्य जीवों की अपेक्षा उसकी बुद्धि में निरंतर विकास होता गया। शब्दों की रचना करके उसने बोलना सीखा, फिर लिपि बनाई, फिर लिखना सीखा, इसी लिपि और कल्पना से उसने वाक्यों की रचना की और उसमें लय गति देते हुए काव्य विधा का विकास किया। अपने द्वारा बनाई गई चंद रचनाओं को तो बनाया ही किन्तु उसकी निरंतर अभिलाषा रही कि वह दूसरों को भी अपनी रचना बताना चाहे, बोल कर, पढ़कर या गाकर। इतना ही नहीं भाव-भंगिमा से उसे नृत्य रूप में भी प्रदर्शित करने के उपाए किए। काव्य प्रस्तुति की पराकाष्ठा है नृत्य!

भारत के प्रमुख नृत्यों में से एक है कथक नृत्य। उत्तर भारत में प्रचलित यह नृत्य अपने प्रस्तुति क्रम में अनेक कविताओं को समेटे हुए है। कथक नृत्य में जिन कविताओं का प्रस्तुतिकरण होता है इन्हें कवित्त कहते हैं। अर्थात् जब इन्हें तालबद्ध करके नाचा जाए तो ये कवित्त कहलाते हैं। कथक में ब्रज भाषा और अवधी हिन्दी की कविताएँ मुख्य रूप से गायी जाती हैं और वर्तमान में इनमें काफी प्रयोग भी हुए हैं। इन कविताओं में राधा-कृष्ण की छेड़-छाड़, पनघट लीला, दशावतार, प्रकृति वर्णन जैसे अनेक विषय पाए जाते हैं। उदाहरण स्वरूप- प्रातः समय घर से निकासी, धर गोरस की मटकी सर भारी ता थई.. तत आ थई.. तत ता थई अचानक घर लयो मग में टाँड़े मोहन बनवाशी, लपक-झपक मोरी बहियाँ मरोड़ी। इन कविताओं ने प्राचीन काल से ही कथक नृत्य की प्रस्तुति को सजाया सँवारा है। समय के साथ ही कविताओं के मर्म में भी परिवर्तन हुआ है।

प्राचीन काल में शास्त्रीय नृत्य में प्रमुख रूप से देवी-देवताओं का वर्णन मिलता था। वर्तमान परिदृश्य में इन कविताओं का सार विस्तारित हो चुका है। सामाजिक चेतना को लेकर कविताएँ रची जा रही हैं।

प्रकृति संरक्षण पर भी कवित्त रचे गए हैं। नारी चेतना चिंतन भी इन कविताओं में है। सामाजिक कुरितियों पर प्रहार करने वाली कवित्त भी कथक में प्रयुक्त की जाती है। नृत्य के बोलो के साथ गुथकर जब इन कविताओं का मंथन किया जाता है तो दर्शक भी मंत्र मुग्ध हो जाते हैं। कथक में प्रयुक्त की जाने वाली ये कविताएँ भावाभिव्यक्ति का एक सशक्त माध्यम हैं, इन्होंने इस विधा को सजाया-सँवारा है और नृत्य को नृत्य के नए आयाम दिए हैं।

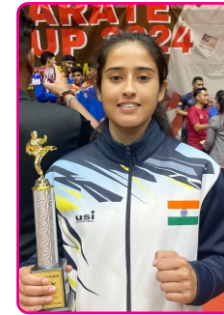

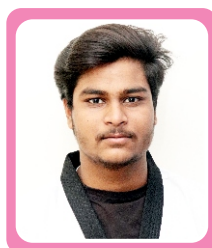

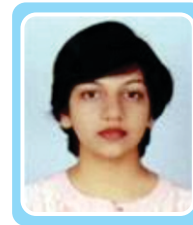
