In the race for Governor, state Attorney General Andy Beshear (D) holds an 18-point lead (50% to 32%) over Gov. Matt Bevin (R) among registered voters. The lead grows to 21-points among likely voters. When undecided likely voters are pressed to make a choice (Leaners), Beshear is up 19 points (55% to 36%).

METHODOLOGY

The PollSmart MR online poll was conducted by Targoz Market Research, an independent research company with sample provided by Prodege, a leading market research panel.

Interviews were conducted from October 13, 2019 to October 20, 2019 among a sample of 548 respondents who live in Kentucky and are registered to vote.
