MRI BREAST COIL

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) is a valuable tool in breast imaging. Used to distinguish between benign and cancerous lesions, this MRI breast coil is an integral part of our scanning day. We have the capability to perform biopsies to help diagnose abnormalities such as infection, inflammation or malignancy.



HEMATOLOGY ANALYZER

In approximately 5 minutes we get an inside view of what human blood cells look like. This equipment upgrade is crucial to our Hospital's patient care and a Complete Blood Count can tell us a lot about their status. Our Medical Laboratory Technologists will get reliable, rapid results, allowing for quicker medical intervention when necessary.



CART WASHER

This cart washer is used to sanitize many large items: stainless steel tables, washbasins, K-basins, wheelchairs, kitchen carts, laundry bag holders and many large stainless steel boxes for the OR. It can even be used to wash stretchers. A benefit to all departments who would otherwise have to wash them by hand.



OPERATING ROOM SURGICAL LIGHTS

These new, high-quality surgical lights for the operating room help provide natural colour rendition, excellent shadow control and deep-cavity illumination. These features help the surgical team accurately and consistently assess and interpret tissue and vessel appearance.
