The G1 year is the foundation year, which develops a student's critical, technical and aesthetic sensibilities. The G2 year grounds students in professional competency, while the third year cultivates disciplinary expertise through advanced research. Students admitted with advanced standing bypass the G1 year curriculum unless otherwise notified.

ELECTIVES

Architectural Electives

Students must complete a minimum of 6 credit hours of architectural seminar electives. Each seminar is 3 credit hours and is repeatable. The two seminar course numbers are ARCH 5290 Topics in Architectural Theory and ARCH 5590 Topics in Building Technology.

Open Electives

Open electives can be any graduate-level coursework taken across the university and may include additional arch electives. Courses within architecture must be 5000 level and above (graduate section). Courses outside of architecture may be 4000 level and above if taught by a lecturer or professor. If any course is waived, the credit hours must be replaced with open elective hours prior to graduation in order to reach the total minimum required credit hours for the degree.
