Feel free to ask questions. There are many things you will need to know. Keep sweet, and do the best you can. Don't be discouraged.

The home-sock should be in an atmosphere of cheerfulness. Get up your room. Make it a home-like as you can and keep it so. Meet all your engagements and obligations promptly.

Prepare with your first recitation. Fill in your individual study schedule in this book. Follow the faculty in your looks at home.

Give careful attention to all announcements. Remember you are here in a community, and respect the rights of others. Read carefully the dormitory regulations in this book.

Obey them and they will keep you out of trouble. With us we not enough to do but keep you busy, so get at the President or the lady Principal. Set in such a friendly mood for idle hand and brain with everyone. The soft-voiced life has only a small circumference. Cast first the beam out of thine own eye.

Look for the gold in every heart. It is there. And remember, "All is not gold that glitters. Join the Y.W.C.A. and a Bible class. Put everything to the test of prayer-meetings. They will do you good.

Attend the evening prayer-meetings. They will do you good. Take plenty of good, healthful exercise. It will give brightness to your eyes and elasticity to your step. You will be an optimist.

Keep this book in a convenient place. You will need it all the year. It may be called for when you will not have time to hunt for it. A week-long day is surely coming. Be ready for it. Study carefully the Constitution and By-Laws of the Student's Association. Prepare to become a helpful member.

BY-LAWS AND COLLEGE REGULATIONS.

All members of the Association shall observe and co-operate in enforcing the rules of the College and the Association.

1. At the discretion of the President students may be allowed to go home before the holidays begin, but in such cases students cannot require that they be allowed to make up their recitations.
2. Students must not leave the University grounds without notifying the lady Principal.
3. All students are required to attend church and Sunday evening services twice a month with a chaperone.
4. Juniors and Seniors may attend Sunday evening services twice a month with a chaperone.
4. Students will not sit or visit in the infirmary without permission from physician or nurse.
5. Students are requested to walk in East Raleigh, on Fayetteville or Hillsboro Streets, in the near vicinity of the railroad shops or the depot.
6. The rising bell will ring at 6:45 a.m.; the retiring bell at 10:15 p.m.
- At the ringing of the retiring bell all lights will be extinguished. Students will retire and the house be quiet. Quiet will be preserved until the rising bell. No extra time will be allowed after 10:15.
- Quiet will be preserved during devotional meetings held in the chapel during study hours, and also during Silent hours from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. daily afternoons.
7. From 9 p.m. to 3 p.m. and from 7:30 p.m. to 9:45 p.m., study will be observed as study hours, except on Saturday afternoon and night, and Monday night.
8. Students will not stand, talk, study, or loiter in the corridors or halls of first and second floors during recreation hours or study hours. Students may study in the Chapel, the Library or in their rooms.
9. Students will not make or receive visits outside the University without written permission from parent or guardian, who will assume responsibility for their conduct while away from the University. Students may not call ofteners than twice a month and only on Mondays.
10. Students may go shopping once a week, on Monday, in such place as are approved by the President. Students will not go to the Post-Office, or drug stores without permission.
11. No students will entertain guests in her room under any circumstances. All visitors, including day pupils, will be entertained in the parlors. No young lady will go to the parlors to meet friends without permission from the lady Principal.
12. Under all ordinary circumstances students will receive visits from their friends on Mondays only, between the hours of 3:30 and 5:30.
13. Students will NOT VISIT restaurants, hotel or places of amusement without permission and a chaperone.
14. All express and packages from the city must be delivered to the lady Principal. At her discretion they will be delivered to the students.
15. Students are requested not to have boxes of food sent them except at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter.
16. Sitting in the windows, throwing anything out of the windows, or talking to those outside, is strictly forbidden. No litter of any kind may be thrown from the windows or scattered upon the grounds.
17. The telephone is not to be used by the students. Messages must be written and handed to the lady Principal during her office hours. All long distance messages must be paid for in advance.
18. Students are held responsible for the neatness and order of their rooms, which will be subject to frequent inspection. They will be held responsible and will pay for loss, breakage and damage in which they are instrumental. All such injuries should be promptly reported to the House-keeper.
19. Any student found communicating by word or sign, beyond simple recognition, from any part of the buildings or grounds or making clandestine engagements with any man, will be publicly reprimanded, suspended or expelled at the discretion of the Faculty.
20. Students must not visit the dining-room or kitchen for any purpose whatever. Food or table furnishings of any kind must not be taken from the tables without permission from the House-keeper.
21. Students are expected to be in their places in chapel and at meals three minutes after the bell rings.
22. All shades and blinds must be closed upon lighting the rooms at night.
23. Laundry must be paid for not later than Friday night.
- Envelope containing the money and amount plainly written on the outside should be placed in the box for that purpose before dinner.
24. No paper, hair combs, fruit peelings or litter of any kind may be put in the slop jugs.
- All waste articles must be put in the waste receptacle provided on each hall.

Within Meredith Community, we commit to developing and affirming to each student a sense of personal honor and responsibility. Uncompromising integrity and forthrightness are essential elements of this commitment. The Honor System is a method by which individual honors are protected and maintained. Any dishonesty or false action will be regarded as a violation of this commitment, and corrective action will be taken.

If I am a violation of the Honor Code to prevent jeopardizing the Honor System or creating our system of self-government, I have an obligation to report myself to the proper authority. If I am aware of a violation of the Honor System by another student, I shall call this matter to the attention of that authority as a violation of responsibility to the community.

In choosing Meredith College, I am accepting the Honor System as a way of life. As a Meredith Student, I am responsible for insuring that the Honor System is at all times carried out.

Honor Code Violations

The Honor Council acts on violations of the Honor Code. Violations of the Honor Code include, among other things, Academic dishonesty, including, but not limited to:

- Unauthorized copying or alteration of any work, including, but not limited to, the preparation of a student's thesis, written laboratory reports, computer programs.
- Plagiarism, which is the use of the intellectual composition of another person's words, thoughts, or ideas without the use of notes, books, or other authorized aids or identify.
- Submitting assignments as completed when they are not (i.e., peeking, readings) cheating and cheating dishonestly on behalf of another student.

Theft or misuse of, or damage to, any personal property on institutional premises, any academically related personal property wherever located, or any college property.

Violation of any College policies as set forth in this Student Handbook.
 Alteration, forgery, falsification, abuse, or fraudulent misuse of college documents, records, or identification.

Violation of rules governing the residence halls, the health center, the library, the dining hall, and other college owned, operated or regulated property.

Possession of firearms or other weapons on College property or at College-sponsored functions.

Conduct resulting in physical harm, harassment and/or discrimination of another student.
