Executive Vice President's Report

Happy 2025 to American Rhinologic Society members and fellows!

I am pleased to report that our Society continues to prosper. Our portfolio of meetings – Annual Meeting, COSM, and Summer Sinus Symposium - have all been successful. We also have strong industry partnerships, a growing membership, and an engaged and active leadership.

Our Annual Meeting in Miami had one of the highest attendances in recent memory, and the scientific content and professional collegiality were both outstanding. The Society continues to have solid finances, with a balanced annual budget. Over the past few years, we have managed to invest some of our reserves in balanced portfolios with stable income, which we are using to support some of our research initiatives and some of the administrative infrastructure of the Society. This year the ARS partnered with the American Academy of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and the American Academy of Otolaryngic Allergy to create an evidence-based position statement on Empty Nose Syndrome, which will be released soon.

Also, 2024-2025 will be the final year of my second term as Executive Vice President, and the Society has already started a search process to identify a successor. The next EVP will be selected sometime this Winter, and that will allow several months of overlap with me, before the new EVP begins their term in October 2025 following our Annual Meeting in Indianapolis. Our President Dr. Kevin Welch, and our Officers and Board of Directors all volunteer their time to lead the Society, and you can rest assured that the ARS's future is in excellent hands. And of course, we have to recognize and thank our outstanding administrative staff – Wendi Perez, Susan Arias, and Tammy Lorimer. Live and Ancillary Education Course Committee Update

The Live and Ancillary Education Course Committee continues to organize quality educational programming for Otolaryngology residents.

This year's annual Resident Dissection Course was held on September 26th and 27th at the Fontainebleau Hotel in Miami, Florida. The course recently changed to a junior and senior level track, allowing for more trainee specific panels and lectures. Highlights from this year's course include a keynote note presentation on the current and future state of chronic rhinosinusitis by Dr. Zara Patel as

ARS Spring Meeting at COSM

will be held on May

17-18, 2025, at the Hyatt Regency New Orleans. This meeting, part of the Combined Otolaryngology Spring Meetings (COSM), promises to be an excellent opportunity to catch up with colleagues, share and learn from cutting edge research, and gain practical knowledge in the medical and surgical management of rhinologic diseases. My favorite reason for going...networking with colleagues. What is yours?

Consistent with recent trends, we again saw a significant growth in our scientific contributions, with **248** abstract submissions—over 30 more than last year. Thank you to the abstract review committee for their hard work in selecting the best research for this year's program. The meeting will feature **66** oral presentations and over **180** posters, highlighting the latest advances in rhinologic research and clinical practice.

Program Overview

The meeting begins on **Saturday morning** and runs through the day, concluding at **noon on Sunday**. Saturday's program will be capped off with the President's reception which is always a great time. The program is

designed so that we can get everyone home by Sunday evening so that you have some down time prior to starting your next week.

The program will include:

Four 45-Minute Panels:

- · Applications of AI in rhinology.
- Transforming research into companies from both the private and academic practice perspective
- Updates on allergic fungal rhinosinusitis.
- Advances in endoscopic approaches to the skull base outside the nasal cavity.

Four 20-Minute Panels:

- Common coding errors and how to avoid them.
- The role of immunomodulators in CRS.
- Spectrum and evaluation of perioperative care for endoscopic sinus surgery.
- Insights into epigenetic modifications in CRS.

Keynote Discussion on Cybersecurity

The meeting concludes with a timely and I hope thought-provoking fireside chat featuring **Terry Ray**, Chief Technology Officer of Imperva (recently acquired by Thales), and **Gavin Setzen**. They will explore the increasing threat of

ransomware attacks in healthcare and address critical questions:

- · Is your patients' data secure?
- What vulnerabilities exist, and what are the liability implications?

Networking Opportunities

Over the years, the ARS has encouraged the creation of sections that focus on particular practice interest shared among our membership. In addition to the scientific sessions, the meeting will include opportunities for networking and professional growth hosted by 2 of our sections:

- Skull Base and Orbital Surgery (SBOS): A morning session discussing aspects of building an early-career skull base practice.
- Women in Rhinology (WiR): A breakfast roundtable discussion addressing career challenges and opportunities.

New Orleans offers a rich cultural experience that complements the professional focus of the meeting.

I hope you all will take time to enjoy the city's renowned cuisine, music, and historic charm during your visit. I look forward to seeing you in New Orleans!

Women in Rhinology News

The Women in Rhinology (WiR) Section ends 2024 on a high energetic note on our mission to facilitate

involvement of women in advancing the ARS's mission to care for people with rhinologic diseases and disorders. We focused on other key objectives: facilitating research collaborations, mentorship, networking, career advancement and addressing gender issues affecting women rhinologists.

The WIR advises the Board of Directors and the ARS to fully leverage the talents of women in rhinology, and holistically integrate them into all its functions, meetings, committees and leadership roles. In addition, the WiR works on addressing gender issues affecting women rhinologists. Since our inception, we have celebrated the strong leadership of Dr Sarah Wise as the first woman president of the ARS.

We are looking forward to the upcoming presidency of first vice-president, Dr Amber Luong. Dr. Jivianne Lee serves as ARS treasurer. In addition, many of us have had the privilege of sitting on the Board of Directors and serving as Board Consultants. The ARS now leads in the number of women otolaryngologists participating and presenting at the ARS and in educational programming and planning.

Much was accomplished during the productive tenure of our outgoing chair, Dr Stacey Gray in 2024. At COSM in Chicago, the WiR hosted a breakfast session on "Allyship in the pathway beyond the 'glass ceiling'" with guest speaker Dana Thompson, MD, MS, MBA, FACS. In addition, at the Summer Sinus Symposium in New Orleans, WiR held a "Speed Mentoring" session, which was a great success. This year, WiR was again able to offer the ARS Women in Rhinology Research Grant through the Centralized Otolaryngology Research Efforts (CORE) mechanism, which was awarded to Dr. Corinna Levine, MD, MPH, for her project entitled "Evaluating How Social Stress and Environmental Exposures Impact CRS." We look forward to the results of her study! We are again in happy receipt of a WiR specific research grant for 2025 supporting a team with at least one female PI performing rhinologic-related research. Thank you, Medtronic! Our Research Officer, Dr. Lauren Roland in partnership with Dr Elisa Elling and Dr Ashleigh Halderman are putting together a DIY to assist early-stage investigators on how to construct and submit for CORE and other grants. Stay tuned as the recipient will be announced soon.

In 2024, we also added a wellness initiative for our membership, led by Dr. Jean Kim.

WiR started with a grassroots effort of women in need of collectively speaking for our desire to be more holistically integrated into the ARS. I recall sitting together circa 2014 with impassioned colleagues, Erin O'Brien, Stacey Gray, Jivianne Lee, Amber Luong, amongst others- WiR members who have now held key ARS leadership roles since. This organic group led to the formal formation of the WiR section being announced with Amber Luong as its first chair. Today the section continues to grow dynamically with the support of the ARS leadership.

WiR also just finished electing our new slate of officers. Congratulations to this year's WiR Governing Council: Stacey Gray, MD, Immediate Past Chair; Devyani Lal, MD, Chair; Stephanie Joe, MD, Chair-Elect; Victoria Lee, MD, Information Officer; Tran Locke, MD, Financial Officer; Lauren Roland, MD, Research Officer; Elisa Illing, MD, Development/Mentorship Officer; Ashleigh Halderman, MD, and Anna Knisely, MD, Members-At-Large.

As we head into the new year, much work still needs to be done in 2025. In the recent Fall meeting, Dr. Morgan McCain presented a poster on the "Intersection of demographic and academic productivity trends among American rhinology fellows". Their data showed a relative plateau in women's

representation among rhinologists since 2002 after studying 31 rhinology fellowships and 477 fellowship-trained rhinologists. Despite an absolute increase in women per year, the proportion of women in rhinology fellowships has remained stable since 2002, averaging 21.1%.

Overall, women rhinologists had a statistically significant lower h-index than men (7 vs. 9; p=0.01), particularly in mid-career (7 vs. 10; p=0.01) across various practice types." To summarize, the authors said, "Addressing gender disparities in academic productivity necessitates acknowledging these challenges and implementing further gender initiatives".

WiR strives to continually advocate for women rhinologists.

Quality Improvement Committee Update

The ARS Quality Improvement (QI) Committee has had a highly productive year, with numerous initiatives aimed at promoting quality and safety in rhinology.

The committee, which has 11 active members, has spearheaded key projects, including a panel discussion at the 2024 Summer Sinus Symposium in New Orleans, Louisiana, focused on practical tips for improving quality in clinical practice. The committee is also in the early stages of developing

initiatives to enhance rhinologic trainee education and incorporate artificial intelligence to further augment quality and safety.

In addition to these new initiatives, the QI Committee has continued its commitment to generating Expert Practice Statements (EPS). These statements summarize existing evidence and provide clinical recommendations for specific scenarios in rhinology and skull base surgery. This year, the committee has supported the development of several EPS, culminating in three published papers in International Forum of Allergy and Rhinology (IFAR) in 2024.

The published EPS include:

- 1. **Pediatric Septoplasty** (August 2024 issue of IFAR): This statement consolidates evidence supporting the safety of pediatric septoplasty and its negligible impact on nasal or midfacial growth.
- 2. **Endoscopic Skull Base Reconstruction** (September 2024 issue of IFAR): This document discusses the comparable success rates of various reconstruction techniques, with a recommendation to use vascularized grafts for large defects and/or high-flow cerebrospinal fluid leaks.
- 3. **Postoperative Management in Endoscopic Skull Base Surgery** (November 2024 issue of IFAR): This statement addresses common questions about postoperative restrictions in an area where evidence is often scarce.

The growing interest in EPS among ARS members has sparked discussions about the best ways to disseminate evidence-based practices in rhinology. The QI Committee looks forward to continuing to improve this process in collaboration with the ARS Executive Committee throughout 2025 and beyond.



Allergy and Immunology in Rhinology Report
