

Domain 3: Maternal & Child Health



Rationale:

Maternal and child health is a primary focus for the Medicaid program as Medicaid funds more than half of the births in the state and provides coverage to more than half of Washington's children.

Evidence-based Approaches:

- 1. Evidence-based family planning strategies, and *if applicable, leverage the Reproductive Health Pathway*
- 2. Evidence-based models for home visiting:
 - <u>Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)</u> or other federally recognized evidence-based home visiting model currently operating in Washington State- provides firsttime, low-income mothers and their children with nurse-led home-based support and care.
 - <u>Early Head Start Home-Based Model (EHS</u>), which works with parents to improve child health; prevent child abuse and neglect; encourage positive parenting; and promote child development and school readiness.
 - <u>Parents as Teachers (PAT)</u> promotes optimal early development, learning and health of children by supporting and engaging their parents and caregivers.
 - <u>Family Spirit</u>, offers culturally tailored home-visiting to promote the optimal health and wellbeing of American Indian parents and their children
- 3. Evidence-Based models to improve well child visit & immunization rates:
 - <u>Bright Futures</u>, Improve regional well-child visit rates (for ages 3-6) and childhood immunization rates.
 - Stony Brook Children's Hospital Enriched Medical Home Intervention (EMHI).



System wide Metrics:

- Rate of Teen Pregnancy (15 19)
- Unintended Pregnancies Low Birth Weight Rate

Project-Level Metrics:

- Prenatal care in the first trimester of pregnancy
- Mental Health Treatment Penetration (Broad Version) (women and children)
- Substance Use Disorder Treatment Penetration (women and children)
- Well-Child Visits in the 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th Years of Life Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life
- Chlamydia Screening in Women Ages 16 to 24
- Contraceptive Care Most & Moderately Effective Methods Contraceptive Care
 Access to LARC
- Contraceptive Care Postpartum
- Childhood Immunization Status
