

## Transfer Planning Guide from Prairie State College (PSC) to Calumet College of St. Joseph (CCSJ)

### Major: Business Management

Completing your Associate in Arts degree at Prairie State College with the following course selections will meet most of the general education and major core requirements for Calumet College of St. Joseph for Business Management. The College reserves the right to require on-campus assessment as a condition of admission for transfer students when appropriate, based on the information submitted in the application process. Calumet College of St. Joseph will accept no more than 66 semester hours from a junior/community college and no more than 94 semester hours from a four-year college toward a bachelor's degree.

### **Fast-Track - Business Management Bachelor of Arts**

Acceptance to Fast Track:

- 52 credit hours (including 8 general education courses) – may accept life experience portfolio

Time to completion: 14-months

- 2 courses/night (2 hours per course) once a week for 7 weeks
- Expectation of additional asynchronous work weekly
- 14 courses total



### **Master of Science in Management (MSM):**

Time to completion: 14-months

*Pending approval in Fall 2022: students who completed Business or Accounting Bachelor's at CCSJ within 5 years of entering Master's in Management are exempt from two courses; therefore, the student can complete the Master's in one year.*
