Dorsal column stimulator is a device that is actually surgically implanted in the back onto the spinal cord and that electricity is then put through those wires to try to turn off some of the pain that is being conducted from the body up to the brain. It sounds complicated and it is and it really has no place or role in the treatment of a cervical herniated disc.

So, bottom line on spinal cord stimulation is, it is not used, I would not do it, and if someone is offering it to you, you have to be extremely cautious in proceeding.
