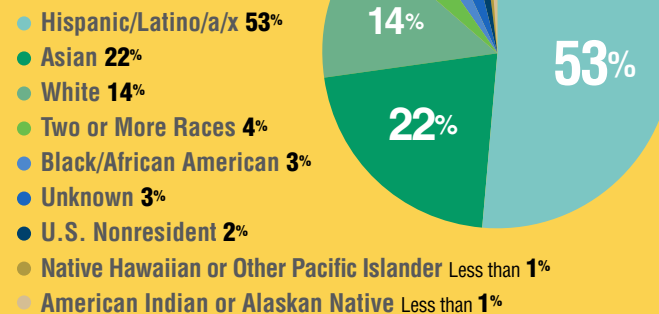

Admission Requirements: Freshmen

Minimum Eligibility Requirements

Freshmen applicants must meet the California State University (CSU) eligibility requirements: graduation from high school and completion of the following A-G courses with a "C-" or better. "P/CR" grades are accepted for the winter, spring, summer and fall 2020 semesters and for the winter, spring and summer 2021 semesters.

Meeting CSU minimum requirements does not guarantee admission into Cal Poly Pomona.

To determine admission eligibility, applications are evaluated on coursework (A-G courses), the grade point average of 10th and 11th grade, and extracurricular activities and leadership. Applications are first reviewed for CSU eligibility.

Next, CPP uses a multifactor admissions (MFA) evaluation process for first-time freshman applicants. The MFA process excludes ACT/SAT scores and instead relies on both academic and non-academic student variables.

A-G College Preparatory Course Requirements

A. History/Social Sciences

2 years required

One year of a social science is required.

Two options for history:

One year of U.S. History

One semester of U.S. History AND one semester of Civics OR one semester of American Government

B. English

4 years required

Four years of college-preparatory English.

No more than one year of Advanced ESL.

C. Mathematics

3 years required (4 years recommended)

Three years including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, or Common Core Integrated Math I, II, III.

D. Laboratory Science

2 years required

One biological and one physical science.

E. Language other than English

2 years required

Two years of the same language other than English.

F. Visual & Performing Arts (VPA)

1 year required

One year (two semesters) from one of the following disciplines: dance, drama or theater, music, or visual art.

G. College Preparatory Elective

1 year required

One year in addition to the required A-G courses listed above.

Career Technical Education (CTE) can be used to meet any of the subject area requirements.

Admission Requirements: Transfer

Minimum Eligibility Requirements

Transfer applicants must meet the minimum CSU eligibility requirements listed below. Cal Poly Pomona only accepts upper division transfer students. Requirements must be completed by the end of the spring term prior to entering for fall, and summer term prior to entering for spring. Transfer students must declare a major when applying. Meeting CSU minimum requirements does not guarantee admission into Cal Poly Pomona.

Minimum CSU Requirements

Must be in good academic standing at the last institution attended

Must have a minimum 2.00 GPA in transferable coursework

Must have at least 60 transferable semester units (90 quarter) by spring for fall applicants

30 of the 60 semester units must be in General Education

Completion of Golden 4 courses with a P, CR, C- or better
