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DND flyway will remain toll-free: SC

The Supreme Court on Friday ruled that the Delhi-Noida-Direct (DND) flyway will be toll-free as it dismissed a plea by a private firm challenging the 2016 decision of the Allahabad High Court order asking it to stop collecting toll from commuters. The decision will benefit lakhs of people who commute daily on the flyway. A Bench of Justices Surva Kant and Ujjal Bhuyan held that awarding a contract to private firm Noida Toll Bridge Company Ltd (NTBCL) to collect toll from commuters plying on the DND flyway was unjust, unfair and arbitrary.

There is no reason for the collection of user or toll fee to continue. We hold that the agreement (for toll collection) is invalid," the bench said. It pulled up the NOIDA authority for delegating toll collection to private firm NTBCL, which did not have any prior experience and said it has resulted in unjust enrichment.



the country's energy needs. Indian exports to Kuwait reached USD 2 Billion for the first time, while investments by the Kuwait Investment Authority in India exceed USD 10 Billion. India and Kuwait have enjoyed traditionally friendly relations, with links dating back to pre-oil Kuwait when maritime trade with India was the backbone of its economy. Kuwait's economy revolved around its fine harbour and maritime activities which included ship building, pearl diving, fishing and voyages to India on wooden dhows carrying dates, Arabian horses and pearls that were traded for wood, cereals, clothes and spices, according to people tracking the ties

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Friday searched multiple locations in The National Investigation five States in connection with a case relating to attempts at revival of the banned CPI (Maoist) outfit, according to an official statement. Extensive searches were conducted at the premises of suspects at two ocations in Patiala and Sri Muktsar Sahib districts of Punjab, four locations in Manesar and Gurgaon districts of Haryana, two locations in New Delhi, and one location each in Patna district of Bihar and Azamgarh district of Uttar

Pradesh, it said. The suspects whose premises were searched were believed to be involved in propagating the ideology of CPI (Maoist) and the revival of its northern regional bureau wing through various frontal organisations. The searches led to the seizure

of digital devices, including mobile phones, pen drives/hard disks, laptops and memory cards, SIM cards and other incriminating documents related to naxalism, said the statement issued by the NIA.

The searches were conducted in a case that relates to attempts by CPI (Maoist) leaders. cadres, sympathisers and overground workers (OGWs) to renergise the outfit's decrepit influence in the NRB region, comprising Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Delhi, Punjab, Haryana, and Himachal Pradesh.

The NIA's investigations have revealed that long-time associates and other OGWs of the outfit were being provided funds from the eastern regional bureau, especially from Jharkhand, to recruit cadres and raise the front organisation in the northern states, the statement said.

In a related issue, Lok Sabha was informed that a total of 2.200 cases of violence against Hindus and other minorities have been reported in Bangladesh this year till December 8, and India's expectation is Dhaka will take necessary measures to ensure their safety, the government said on Friday.

Heavy snowfall, shabdeg, and kangris... 'Chillai Kalan', begins in J and K

mid the persistent dry and cold Aweather, the Jammu and Kashmir region is ready to face the 40-day-long harshest winter period of 'Chillai Kalan', beginning from the intervening night of December 20 and December 21. This period of Chillai Kalan, which begins with Winter Solstice spans from December 21 to January 31, marks the apex of Kashmir's severe winter. Chillai Kalan is also known as "Shahenshah-e-zamistan." Chilla-i Kalan is a Persian term which means "major cold" while the intense cold conditions are known as 'Jaada' in North and East India. During Chilai Kalan, the chilling cold increases further, while heavy snowfall and temperatures well below freezing point cause water

bodies and even water taps in homes to freeze. In this 40-day period, nights are chilly and day temperatures are in single digits. The winter games at the skiing resort of Gulmarg are held during this period.

During Chillai Kalan, many Kashmiri families prepare 'Shabdeg' on the first day of 'Chillai Kalan'. Meat is slow cooked with turnips and spices in an earthen vessel during the night intervening December 20-21, to mark the onset of the coldest phase of the season. During its 40 days, the Chillai Kalan leaves no chance to put people through the most difficult of hardships. Generally, however, due to the icy winds in Chillai Kalan, the entire valley is gripped by severe cold. The ongoing cold wave is said to reach its peak with



Kashmir's mountains covered in snow for weeks, and the famous Dal Lake also reaching freezing point until the end of January.

Kashmir's winter pans out in three stages starting with a 40-day intense period from December 21 (locally called Chillai Kalan)

followed by 20 more days which are less intense (Chillai Khurd) and then 10 days of mild cold (Chillai Bache). Chillai-Kalan is the 40-day period of harsh winter in Kashmir that begins December 21 and ends on January 31.

According to meteorological reports, this year's Chillai Kalan will begin with a cold wave, and temperatures are expected to dip significantly across the Kashmir Valley. The Meteorological Department has also predicted that there could be light to moderate snowfall in the coming days, expected with the higher days, especially in the higher reaches of the valley. The plains are likely to experience a drop in temperature, which may cause minimum temperature of minus office said. 6.2 degrees Celsius, slightly down

from minus 6 degrees Celsius the previous night.

the India According to Department Meteorological (IMD), in South Kashmir, Pahalgam, which also serves as one of the base camps for the annual Amarnath Yatra, registered a low of minus 8.2 degrees Celsius, down from the previous night's minus 6.8 degrees Celsius.

It said Gulmarg, a tourist spot popular for skiing, logged a minimum of minus six degrees Celsius, a degree down from the previous night. A hamlet on the outskirts of Pampore town, Konibal, was the coldest weather station in the valley as the minimum settled at the low of frost. Srinagar recorded a minus 9.2 degrees Celsius, the

SC asks Centre to file fresh report on 1984 anti-Sikh riots trials

The Supreme Court on Friday directed the Centre to file a fresh status report within two weeks on the status of trials in the 1984 anti-Sikh riots. A bench comprising Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih asked additional solicitor general Aishwarya Bhati to file an affidavit and permitted the petitioners in the case to file detailed objections. During the hearing, Bhati said recommendations of the special investigation team special investigation team, set up by the top court, were carried out.

A counsel appearing for one of the petitioners submitted there were some glaring instances in the SIT report and said 500 cases were clubbed in one FIR and the investigating officer could not probe them.

"There were many instances where 498 cases were clubbed in one FIR and IO had to investigate all of them. Initially when the hearing began, the court felt that it should be confined to Delhi only. But we have done nothing about other t a t e We have given examples of Kanpur, Bokaro, etc., nothing has happened," he said.

The top court assured it will look into all these aspects. Delhi witnessed large-scale violence and killings of persons from the Sikh community following former PM India Candhic community following former PM Indira Gandhi's assassination by her bodyguards in 1984 and the cases stemming from the incident have seen some major twists and turns 40

years on. According to the Nanavati According to the Nanavati Commission Report, there were a total 587 FIRs registered in Delhi in relation to 1984 riots that witnessed 2,733 people being killed. Of the total, the police shut about 240 cases as "untraced" and about 250 cases resulted in acquittals

acquittals. However, it was only in May 2023 that the central probe agency the CBI filed a chargesheet against Congress leader Jagdish Tytler for his alleged role in the killings of three people on November 1, 1984. The CBI alleged The CBI alleged Tytler "incited, instigated and provoked the mob provoked the mob assembled at Pul Bangash Gurdwara Azad Market area Gurdwara Azad Market area in the national capital on November 1, 1984. The incident resulted in the burning down of the gurdwara and killing of Thakur Singh, Badal Singh and Guru Charan Singh.





The Janata Dal (United) on Triday accused Aam Aadmi Party leader Arvind Kejriwal of not giving representation to Dalits and backward classes, and said a leader tainted with corruption charges has no right to give suggestions to someone like Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar.

The attack on the former Delhi chief minister from two key JD(U) leaders, Union minister Lalan Singh and Sanjay Jha, came a day after Kejriwal wrote a letter to Kumar asking him to "deeply reflect" on Union Home Minister Amit Shah's alleged insulting comments for B R Ambedkar. Kejriwal had written a similar letter to another key BJP ally, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu.

Jha responded to the AAP leader by writing he did not send a single leader from the Dalit and backward castes to the Rajya Sabha and accusing him of backtracking on his promise of picking a Dalit deputy chief minister in Punjab.

Jha asked if the AAP leader could not find anyone from these classes to replace him as Delhi chief minister when he resigned and cited Kumar's choice of Dalit leader Jitan Ram Manjhi to take him place in 2014. Kejriwal has had links with an organisation known for its stand against reservation, joined hands with the Congress after swearing to never ally with it, hates people from Bihar and poorvanchal as is clear from their poor living conditions in the national capital, he alleged. Singh told reporters that Kejriwal had no right to question the JD(U) president and took a swipe at him over his incarceration in jail in a corruption case after entering politics through an anti-corruption movement headed by veteran activist Anna Hazare. He then

dumped Hazare, the Union minister said, adding, "A corrupt person has no right to offer advice to Nitish Kumar who was a Union minister and is now chief minister for so many years and still can not been accused of any misconduct."

Sharing the letters on social media, Kejriwal said people feel that those who love Ambedkar can not support the BJP that "insulted" the India's architect of Constitution, and asked Kumar and Naidu to ponder over it. Shah's remark on Babasaheb was not only "disrespectful" but also revealed the BJP's perspective towards him and the Constitution, the AAP leader said in the letters to the two chief ministers.

"The statement made by Shah in Parliament regarding Babasaheb has left the entire nation stunned. His remark that 'chanting Ambedkar-Ambedkar has become a fashion these days' is not only disrespectful but also reveals the BJP's perspective towards Babasaheb and our Constitution," Kejriwal wrote. JD(U) leaders strongly

defended Shah, saying he only exposed the Congress' insult of Ambedkar, an iconic figure, especially among Dalits.

The home minister threw light on those pages of history which you and the leader of your alliance Rahul Gandhi do not want to see. Shah told the country as to how a hurt Ambedkar had to resign from Nehru's Cabinet due to neglect of Dalits and women. I can understand that you and your alliance leader Rahul Gandhi would not have liked such a discussion at all," Jha wrote in the letter. The Congress was in power in Bihar till 1990 and enjoyed its fruits later till 2005 in alliance with the RJD but it was Kumar who gave reservation to Dalits and extremely backward classes in local bodies, he added.



Chate was earlier allegedly involved in an extortion case of Rs. 3 crore. The police have found a link between the extortion case involving a windmill company and the Sarpanch murder case. In the previous (extortion) case lodged by the local windmill company, one of the accused was Walmiki Karad, who is alleged to have been linked to a senior NCP (AP) minister

Dhananjay Munde. Acknowledging the prevalence of lawlessness in Beed and attempts to create an atmosphere of anarchy in Beed, Fadnavis said that the State government would initiate a 'cleansing process' to protect the local industrialists from harassment.

said. Condemning the large-scale violence at Parbhani, Fadnavis said: "The violence is unacceptable. The police have found medical records to confirm his condition and there was no criminal act behind his act of vandalising the replica of the Indian constitution".

The chief minister said that a judicial probe will be conducted into the large-scale violence, arson and stonethrowing that took place after the desecration and the death of an arrested person in judi-cial custody. "Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar is not limited to any caste. He belongs to all," Fadnavis said.

The demonstration, led by Leader of Opposition in the State Assembly Umang Singhar, witnessed Congress legislators dressed in blue stoles as a mark of respect to Bhimrao Ambedkar. The protest took place near

Mahatma Gandhi's statue at the Assembly premises. This move was seen as an expression of solidarity with the Congress central leadership, which held a similar demonstration at the Parliament premises a day earlier. During the protest, the Congress MLAs raised slogans such as 'Ambedkar Ka Apman, Nahi Sahega Hindustan' (India will not tolerate Ambedkar's insult), criticizing what they termed as the BJP's attempts to denigrate Ambedkar.

Umang Singhar accused the BJP of insulting Ambedkar during parliamentary proceedings and alleged that Delhi Police had lodged false cases against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi at the behest of the ruling party. He stated, "First, BJP



leaders insulted Dr. B.R Ambedkar in Parliament, and when Congress leaders protested, fake charges were imposed on our leader Rahul Gandhi. This is unacceptable.

The controversy intensified on Thursday when Rahul Gandhi, along with Congress MPs, staged a protest at Parliament, leading to a heated confrontation between ruling and opposition members. The clash escalated into a physical altercation, resulting in injuries on both sides.

A 70-year-old BJP MP from Balasore, Odisha, reportedly fell and sustained a head injury during the scuffle and was admitted to a hospital. Congress, on the other hand, claimed that party president Mallikarjun Kharge collapsed during the incident.

From gold to silver Ramlala's temple in Ayodhya receives record donations

 $T_{Janmabhoomi}^{he$ Shri Ram Kshetra Trust in Ayodhya has witnessed an unprecedented surge in donations, collecting approximately ?183 crore from April to October 2024. This includes ?78 crore from direct contributions and ?105 crore in bank interest. On average, 70,000 to 80,000 devotees visit Ramlala's temple daily, with numbers doubling on weekends and tripling during major festivals. Monthly donations have reached ?10 crore through various channels, including offerings in the temple's hundi

acquisitions between August and October alone amounted to over ?29 crore for more

than two acres. Trust member Anil Mishra shared, "The land acquisitions are crucial for accommodating the ever-growing number of devotees. The aim is to create a spiritual and serene environment that enhances the overall pilgrimage experience.'

According to trust sources, these acquisitions aim to accommodate the increasing number of pilgrims and ensure smooth temple operations. The Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust remains committed to enhancing visitor experiences

as the temple's grand inauguration approaches. Meanwhile, the construction

of the 161-foot-high Ram temple's spire commenced recently and is expected to be completed in four months. Additionally, seven other temples in the complex, dedicated to seven sages, are anticipated to be completed within the same timeframe.

An abhorrable practice

The SC's observation on witchcraft practices is a timely reminder that women still face humiliation under various pretexts

n a landmark observation, the Supreme Court of India recently described the victimisation of women under accusations of witchcraft as a 'blot on the constitutional spirit.' The case before the apex court, involving egregious acts of abuse and violence against women in Bihar's Champaran district, has brought the spotlight on the persistent issue of witch-hunting in the country. The court's remarks emphasise the urgent need to eradicate such practices that undermine the dignity, equality and human rights enshrined in the Constitution of India. The bench, comprising Justices CT Ravikumar and Sanjay Karol, was dealing with a petition concerning a disturbing incident that occurred in early 2020. Women were publicly assaulted, disrobed, and accused of witchcraft. One of the accused individuals, Lakhpati Devi, along with others, faced charges for these heinous acts. Reportedly there was police apathy towards the victim. The apex court expressed its shock and dismay at the brutality of the acts and the apparent indiffer-



ence of the legal machinery. Such incidents, the court observed, are a direct affront to the dignity and rights of women, particularly in rural areas where equality remains a distant goal. The court highlighted the role of superstition, patriarchy, and social control in perpetuating witch-hunting practices. It called for the eradication of these regressive beliefs, which often target vulnerable women such as widows and the elderly. Indeed, such practices stand in stark opposition to the scientific temper mandated by the Constitution. Unfortunately these are not isolated cases but are rampant in rural India. The Constitution of India guarantees justice, liberty, equality and dignity for all

citizens. Practices like witch-hunting undermine these principles and perpetuate a culture of discrimination and violence against women. What is more shocking is the apathy of the government in such cases who are equal partners in crime. The court reiterated that the responsibility of investigating and adjudicating authorities is heightened in cases involving violations of human dignity. The Supreme Court also criticised the state for not challenging the High Court's non-speaking order, which granted a stay on the proceedings. The bench's observations underscore the need for a multi-pronged approach to address witch-hunting. This includes strengthening laws to explicitly criminalise witch-hunting and ensuring stringent punishment for perpetrators. Besides, promoting scientific temper and educating communities about the illegality and immorality of witch-hunting. But most important is establishing support mechanisms for survivors, including legal aid, rehabilitation, and psychological counseling. The government machinery also need to be sensitised in dealing with such cases. The Supreme Court's remarks serve as a clarion call to address the deep-seated issues of superstition and patriarchy that enable witch-hunting. The victimisation of women under such baseless allegations is not merely a social evil but a constitutional failure.

Revisiting the Places of Worship Act



The Places of Worship Act, 1991, was enacted to maintain the religious status of sites as of August 15, 1947 but there is misunderstandings about its purpose

ow the Places of Worship Act (1991) is being dealt with at present is due to many not being aware of how and why the Act came about. Evidently, the then Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao (1991-96) in his heart of hearts was a staunch Hindu. He was anxious to contribute to help solving the then existing-or festering-problem at Ayodhya. Most developments that took place at the Janmasthan on December 6, 1992, spoke of Rao's silent participation in the cause of Ram Lalla.

The most clinching evidence of the Prime Minister's contribution was indicated by the facts when I left Ayodhya on that momentous day. It was 5:45 pm; all the three domes of the Babri edifice had been brought down. All the ten walls were still standing and so was the rest of the structure. Soon after we sat in our car to proceed to Lucknow, my companions and I heard on the transistor radio that the Uttar Pradesh government of then chief minister Kalyan Singh had been dismissed by the Centre, and Governor's rule imposed.

That meant whatever was done thereafter was the handiwork directed by someone at the Centre. At the Centre, even the then-home secretary Madhav Godbole is on record saying that he did not know a thing about what was happening and had learnt about it only through the radio and television.

This author has not met not knows anyone who has claimed that he has seven even a photograph of the edifice walls without their domes. At 10 pm that very night, PM Narasimha Rao addressed the nation on television, wherein he assured the people of India that he would rebuild the Babri Masjid as soon as possible. This gave the impression that the entire edifice had been destroyed. The walls were tall and thick as was the style of the architecture of the 16th cen-The chabutara around the walls was also solid and tall, this happened under Central apart from being large. Even the domes, which had been the most vulnerable part of the structure, nowhere in power after 5:45

took selected men of the Uttar Pradesh Public Works Department (PWD) to bring them down, an endeavour that began in the morning and lasted till 4:30 pm when the last dome fell. I came to know that they were men of the PWD, from two of the five photographers whose cameras had been smashed and they beaten up and left with bleeding faces. A lady IPS officer who was second-in-command at Ayodhya on that day, in answer to my query told me later that the police had instructions not to intervene unless lives were in danger; presumably, not property. She assured me that there were 15,000 paramilitary personnel in readiness at Faizabad, just 4 km away. Incidentally, she added there were consummate numbers of bulldozers in the nearby vicinity, along with their operators. Evidently, all these preparations were deployed to see the end of the Babri edifice over the next 60 hours. Indeed, an enormous thing to accomlish, in such a short time. All rule. What this statement means is that a legitimate difference must be made between genuine places of worship and those edifices or structures that are the outcome of dacoity. verted from temples to mosques like the Adhai Din Ka Jhopda, about a furlong away from Ajmer Sharif. Three temples were confined into one within 60 hours, or two-anda-half days, so that the invader Mohammad Ghori would be able to pray there on his return from the decisive Second Battle of Tarain in 1192 AD.

There was no time to erase the Hindu structure. The pristine design has survived till this day. There are many such examples until the Lodi Dynasty conquered north India. Evidently, these Afghans had brought some architects with them, who built a significant number of buildings, including mosques.

How can the courts refuse to hear and try a case when someone petitions against daylight dacoity of a temple, which is either converted immediately like the one described above in Ajmer, or brought down and rebuilt like the Jama Masjid in Ahmedabad? Surely, dacoities can't be condoned out of hand? On the other hand, genuine cases of mosques having become victims of Hindu mischief can be kept out of the courts under the Places of

Philippines: The broken promise of democracy

The resurgence of the Marcoses, the entrenchment of the Aquinos, and the dominance of families like the Dutertes show the enduring grip of oligarchy



he 1987 Philippine Constitution, crafted in the aftermath of the 1986 People Power Revolution, was supposed to mark the dawn of a new democratic era. The ousting of Ferdinand Marcos Sr., after decades of corruption, repression, and dynastic rule, was a victory for the Filipino people, or so they were told. Yet, the Constitution, supposedly a tool for disman-tling the oppressive old order, contains a glaring, unimplemented clause: Article II, Section 26, which bans political dynasties. Nearly four decades later, this promise remains a cruel joke, the prohibition nothing more than a symbol of a nation shackled by its feudal past. Political dynasties thrive unabated, and the Philippines remains trapped in a cycle of oligarchy, where power is passed down like a family heirloom, not earned through democratic means. The rise of Corazon Aquino, the "hero" of People Power, has proven to be a double-edged sword.

While she restored democracy in name, she failed to eradicate the dynastic forces that had long plagued the country. Instead of dismantling the Marcos empire and the dynasties that thrived in its wake, Aquino's presiaency paved the way for a new set of rul throne. The irony is staggering: Aquino, the DISARM THE VERY symbol of resistance to Marcos, was unable to disarm the very forces that helped prop up the dictatorship. Her administration's failure to enact meaningful reform paved the way for the Marcos family's return to power, with Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr.'s rise in 2022 exposing the unyielding grip of dynastic politics, illuminating the eternal truth behind the words of José Rizal, a true revolutionary executed by the Spanish in ADMINISTRATION'S Manila: "The Filipino is not a slave of the Spanish Government. He is a slave of his FAILURE TO ENACT own people."The Marcoses, who plundered billions from the nation's coffers, are not the only ones to have manipulated the system to their advantage. Under Cory Aquino, the promise of land

The hypocrisy of the political elite is stag-gering, with families like the Marcoses and the Aquinos using their histories of violence and corruption as stepping stones to further entrench their power. But the Aquino-Marcos rivalry is only the tip of the iceberg. In Mindanao, the Duterte family's hold on power predates Rodrigo Duterte's presidency, with a history of death squad killings and iron-fisted rule. As mayor of Davao City, Duterte ruled with an iron fist, silencing dissent and using extrajudicial executions to rid the streets of perceived enemies.

And yet, despite the horrific nature of the crime, justice has been slow and incomplete, as political dynasties use their influence to shield themselves from the consequences of their actions. In regions like Cebu and Ilocos Norte, political dynasties such as the Osmeñas, Garcias, and Fariñases manipulate elections and use their wealth to maintain control, treating public office as their domain. This cycle of violence and impunity, where the ruling class prioritises their interests, extends to the economic realm, with families like the villagers growing their wealth through political power. The system persists due to cultural deference to family authority, weak institutions, and pervasive poverty, with voters often coerced into supporting the very dynasties that sustain their suffering.

Foreign powers, particularly the United States, have long been complicit in this system. During the Marcos era, the US provided crucial The Macapagal-Arroyo family, meanwhile, turned corruption into an art form. Schools produce citizens ill-equipped to challenge the status quo, while the media, often co-opted by powerful families, serves to protect the interests of the elite. Social media, too, has become a tool for dynasties to spread propaganda, rehabilitate their tarnished images,

and silence critics.

The current political spectacle cen-tred around Vice President Sara Duterte's public threats against President Marcos, is a stark reminder of how fragile the Philippines' democracy truly is. The alliance between the Marcoses and the Dutertes, forged during the 2022 election, is now on the brink of collapse. What once seemed like a partnership between the North and south's ruling classes has devolved into a bitter feud, exposing the cracks in a political system built on corruption, nepotism, and violence.

This is not a battle for the people's interests, but a struggle for control between two families, each vying for supremacy in a system that has failed its citizens. This feud is not just political-it has geopolitical ramifications. Marcos' pivot towards the US and his opposition to China's claims in the South China Sea have reignited regional tensions, while Duterte's pro-China stance during his presidency deepened divides

Patent risks: Key strategies for businesses amid rising litigation costs

Businesses today must adopt proactive strategies like Freedom-to-Operate searches and patent liability insurance to mitigate risks and protect their inovations

n November 2024, a US jury ruled in favour of Netlist, a company specialising in computer memory and storage solutions, ordering Samsung to pay \$118 million in damages for willfully infringing Netlist's patented technology. This follows an earlier verdict in April 2024 where another jury found Samsung guilty of similar patent infringements, award-ing \$303 million to Netlist. Together, these penalties amount to \$421 million-an extraordinary sum that could destabilise even the most established organisations.

In India, the Delhi High Court recently delivered a landmark judgment favoring the plaintiff, Antenna Inc., in a patent infringement case against Mobi Antenna Technologies.

The court issued a permanent injunction against the defendant and ordered them to pay damages of USD 26.04 million (INR 216 crores) to compensate for the plaintiff's loss of profits due to the infringement. This insurance, provided by specialised firms, helps cover legal expenses and damages arising from unintentional infringement. While popular in several countries, its adoption is

steadily growing in India. Freedom-to-Operate (FTO) Another cost-effective tool to minimise patent infringement risks is a Freedom-to-Operate (FTO) search. This process evaluates whether a new product or process infringes on existing patents, enabling informed business decisions and reducing the likelihood of legal disputes. Many compa-nies conduct FTO searches before initiating new R&D projects to mitigate financial and reputational risks.

An FTO search involves ana-lyzing granted and pending patents to form a techno-legal opinion on whether a product, process, or service infringes existing IP rights. These searches can be conducted using free databases provided by intellectual property offices,

with directories available on the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) website. When Patents Block Freedom to Operate If an FTO search reveals con-

flicting patents, companies have several options: 1.Licensing Agreements: Companies can negotiate inlicensing or purchase patent rights to gain access to the nec-

essary technology. 2.Patent Pools: Collaborative agreements among companies in the same technological field allow shared access to patents, resolving disputes and controlling costs, especially for essential products like medicines

3.Designing Around: Companies can modify exist-Around: ing processes or products to avoid infringement.

Steps to Minimise Litigation Risks: Regardless of the strategy chosen, it is crucial for companies to address patent infringement risks early in the research and commercialization process. Proactive measures such as in-licensing, cross-licensing, patent pooling, and designing around can help avoid future disputes. A systematic FTO search before launching a new product is indispensable for minimizing infringement risks. While an FTO search cannot completely eliminate the possibility of litigation due to limitations in patent databases and search expertise, it significantly reduces potential

According to a complaint filed on Tuesday in the US District Court for the Central District of California, Sun is accused of conspiring with Chen Jun, who was sentenced to 20 months last month for acting as an illegal agent of the Chinese government.

Chen, 71, also a Chinese national, pleaded guilty in July to using Chinese money to

AP MOSCOW

The rapid downfall of Syrian leader Bashar Assad has touched off a new round of delicate geopolitical manoeuvring between Russia's Vladimir Putin and Turkiye's Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

With the dust still settling from the stunning events in Damascus, the outcome for now seems to be favouring Ankara, which backed the victorious rebels, while Moscow suffered a bruising blow to its international clout.

"In the game of Czars vs. Sultans, this is Sultans 1 and Czars 0," said Soner Cagaptay, director of the Turkish Research Program at the Washington Institute. "Far from being allies, Turkiye and Russia are competitors. And in this case, Turkiye has outsmarted Russia.

Six entities pay ₹ 3.49 crore to settle front-running trade case with Sebi

Six entities, including Samir Kothari and Jitendra N Kewalramani, has settled with Sebi in a case pertaining to the suspected front-running of trades by paying ₹ 3.49 crore towards settlement charges.

The other entities that settled the matter with the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) are Kuntal Goel, Jitendra N Kewalramani HUF, Dipika J Kewalramani and Pallavi Shailesh Nayak, Sebi said in the order on Thursday. Apart from the settlement amount, Sebi's committee placed other conditions to

settle the case. These included disgorgement of unlawful gain totalling ₹2.06 crore along with 12 per cent interest per annum from the date of the impugned transaction to the

date of filing of the settlement application for disgorgement to be paid by Samir Kothari, Kuntal Goel and Jitendra N Kewalramani. Also, the six entities will vol-

untarily debarred themselves from the securities markets for six months. The order came after Sebi received four separate settlement applications from the

applicants in March 2024, proposing to settle the instant proceedings through a settlement order "without admitting or denying the allegations".

"It is hereby ordered that the proceedings initiated against the applicants, vide show cause notice dated January 24, 2024, is disposed of," Sebi's tlement order. Chief General Manager

ing the period from January 2021 to October 2022. Pursuant to the investigation, a common show cause notice dated January 24, 2024, was issued to certain entities, including the applicants.

The SCN alleged that the applicants and other noticees were consistently placing orders ahead of Bharat Kanaiyalal Sheth Family Trust, Ravi Kanaiyalal Sheth Family Trust and Arjun Discretionary Trust and Arjun Discretionary Trust (collec-tively referred to as the Big Clients) in the equity (cash) segment of NSE and were squaring off the same.

Further, Jitendra, who was the authorised person of Angel One was, directly or indirectly, in possession of the details of the impending orders to be placed by the big clients.

Accordingly, during the investigation period front running trades were allegedly executed by him in his own trading account and the trading accounts of certain entities, including the applicants (except Kuntal Goel and Samir Kothari), who were all related/associated to him dur-

ing the probe period. Sebi also alleged that Jitendra was connected to Kothari through an employer-employ-ee relationship, while Kuntal, who possessed the informa-tion of the impending trades of the big client is connected to Samir Kothari by way of to Samir Kothari by way of frequent calls leading to Jitendra having access to the non-public-information-ofthe-impending orders of the big clients.

The rest of the notices/ applicants were, directly or indi-

rectly, in possession of the details of the impending orders to be placed on behalf of the big clients, through Jitendra, who then placed orders in clients' accounts to generate abnormal profits.

Sensex tanks 1,176 points, Nifty falls below 23,600 level

Equity benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty plunged about 1.5 per cent on Friday, taking their downtrend to the fifth straight session, due to risk aversion in the global markets after the hawkish stance of the US Federal Reserve.

The 30-share BSE benchmark tumbled 1,176.46 points or 1.49 per cent to settle at 78,041.59. During the day, it slumped 1,343.46 points or

1.69 per cent to 77,874.59. 
t would be wrong to say that I - like many other admirers of Ustad Zakir Hussain - am not shocked and mourning the demise of the maestro on December 15, 2024. But while there are countless messages on social media from those who are offering their tributes and remembering the maestro's greatness, it is a moment to also remember Zakir Hussain for his humility despite his multiple accolades and achievements. I must also convincingly add that it would further be wrong to say that the world of 'taal' and 'rhythm' fell silent on December 15, 2024, as Ustad Zakir Hussain breathed his last in San Francisco at 73, leaving behind an unparalleled legacy in the realm of music. For decades, his hands transformed the tabla from a classical Indian percussion instrument into a universal language, one that bridged the East and the West, traditional and contemporary, music and magic. It can, however, be said that while the 'taals' and 'taranas' seem momentarily muted, Zakir Hussain's music continues to echo in the hearts of millions. Born on March 9, 1951, in Mumbai,

Zakir Hussain was the son of Ustad Alla Rakha, another tabla virtuoso. From a young age, Zakir was destined for greatness, showing an uncanny ability to master the intricacies of rhythm. His music wasn't just a recital of beats - it was a dialogue, a dance, a spiritual experience. Even as a child prodigy, he bore the weight of his father's towering legacy with grace, eventually shaping his own path and taking 'tabla' to a realm previously unimaginable.

REDEFINING THE TABLA

akir Hussain revolutionised the art of tabla playing, elevating it from its conventional role as a supporting instrument to a soloist's pride of place on the world stage. With a profound understanding of tradition and heritage, he seamlessly blended his technical virtuosity with creative improvisation, crafting performances that transcended genres and boundaries. His hands moved like poetry, crafting rhythmic patterns so intricate and yet so accessible that even the untrained ear could sense the brilliance of his craft.

His collaborations with artists across the globe are a testament to his genius. With guitarist John McLaughlin, he cofounded the band 'Shakti', a pioneering force in fusion music that blended Indian classical music with jazz and rock. His work with Mickey Hart of the 'Grateful

percussion to global prominence, winning a Grammy for Best World Music Album in 1992.

He had the remarkable ability to connect disparate musical traditions, forging symphonies that spoke to the universal spirit of humanity. Whether performing with Ravi Shankar in a sitar-tabla 'jugalbandi' or jamming with Yo-Yo Ma's 'Silk Road Ensemble', he approached each with reverence and curiosity, breaking barriers without ever diluting the essence of the tabla.

WHAT PARAMPARA (LINEAGE) MEANT FOR THE USTAD

espite his global persona, Zakir Hussain remained deeply rooted in Indian musical traditions. His performances were steeped in the wisdom of centuries, carrying forward the parampara (lineage) of the Punjab gharana while infusing it with his own

just an instrument but a storyteller, capable of expressing every shade of human emotion - from the ecstatic to the meditative. His renditions of complex 'talas' ('teental', 'jhaptal', and 'rupak tal') revealed his mastery of rhythm and timing, yet what set him apart was his ability to infuse each beat with life and soul. Even as he experimented with cross-cultural sounds, Zakir Hussain never let the tabla lose its identity. He saw fusion as a dialogue rather than a compromise, where traditions could coexist and enrich one another.

In his lecture-demonstrations, Zakir Hussain often spoke about the spiritual dimension of music. For him, the tabla was a medium of devotion and transcendence, a way to connect with the divine. It is this depth of understanding that lent his performances an ethereal quality, leaving audiences spellbound.



A LESSON IN HUMILITY Hussain's akir fame was unparalleled, yet his humility Iremained his most endearing quality. Despite receiving countless accolades, including the Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, Padma Shri, Sangeet Natak Akademi Award,


