ROY GUILTY IN RG KAR MURDER CASE In another first, poll freebie for Delhi tenants

Kolkata Sessions Court on Saturday held prime **A**accused Sanjoy Roy guilty in the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital rape and murder case.

The quantum of punishment be pronounced on Monday, District and Sessions Judge of Sealdah Court Anirban Das told Roy in a 12minute hearing, adding that he had been held guilty in the case and could be condemned to death or imprisonment for life. Roy was convicted of rape under Section 64 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), and murder under Sections 66 and 103(1).

The body of the victim, a 31year-old postgraduate lady doctor working in the Chest Medicine Department of the RGKMCH who was brutally raped and murdered, was discovered inside the seminar room of the said hospital in the wee hours of August 9 last year, triggering nationwide

Subsequently, on the basis of

the CCTV footage, the Kolkata Police on August 10 arrested Sanjay Roy, a civic volunteer with the police. He was seen entering the seminar hall and coming out of it after about half an hour.

The judgment was delivered days after the trial commenced in-camera on November 12, during which 50 witnesses were examined. The hearing in the case concluded on January 9.

"When the Court held Sanjoy Roy guilty of the crime of rape and murder, he continued to call himself innocent and a victim of conspiracy. The honorable Sessions Judge told him that he had been found guilty of the crime which invite capital punishment like death or life imprisonment... the quantum of punishment shall be given on Monday when the Judge will also hear out the convict," the advocate of the victim's family said, adding that justice will not be fully complete until other people who might have been involved in the case were

"Though the copy of the judgment is likely to be uploaded on Monday," the Court did not seem fully satisfied with the investigation as "it often raised the issues of lacuna and loopholes in the process of investigation... we will have to

see whether these things find

place in the judgment or not,"

the advocate said. The parents of the victim also held the same opinion, wondering administration would not go after the masterminds of the crime. "We have 20 questions that are yet unanswered. Let the agencies, be it the CBI or the state police answer them," said the mother of the victim, welcoming the partially

judgment. The mother of an only child, she said, "Sanjay's guilt was proved through biological evidence. He is only one person but not the only person who has killed my daughter. The entire medical fraternity, the entire hospital says so, the truth is known to every brick, every wall of the real accused are being discussed but why it was not taken up judicially is not known to us. There are others who haven't been arrested yet. So, justice hasn't been fully delivered. We are people of humble background and have nothing to lose so we will continue our fight for justice till the last day of our life." The father of the victim, who

had on Friday held the Banerjee government guilty brushing the case under the carpet again, said, "I have many questions. Minister Mamata Banerjee herself kept awake the whole night and supervised the investigation. Where was a need for her to do so?

The investigation was nothing

but an act of erasing evidence. police destroyed evidence, which finally led to the other culprits either not getting arrested or two others getting bail. The entire medical fraternity knows that this rape and murder is not the work of only one person." The announcement comes as the Aam Aadmi Party ramps up its campaign for the Delhi assembly elections slated for

"Wherever I go, I meet people living on rent who say they benefit from good schools and hospitals but are deprived of free electricity and water schemes. Across Delhi, we have provided free electricity and water to residents. However, it is unfortunate that tenants do not get these benefits. Today, I want to announce that after the elections, if our government is formed, we will introduce a system ensuring tenants also receive free

With campaigning for the Delhi Assembly elections heating up, claims and counterclaims erupted between AAP and BJP as the former alleged that AAP convener Arvind Kejriwal's car was

pelted with stones in New Delhi constituency on Saturday. However, BJP leader and New Delhi candidate Parvesh Verma refuted AAP's allegations, saying the AAP chief's car hit three youths who had been protesting against him. Verma claimed it was Kejriwal who asked the driver of the car to crush them.

"Fearing defeat, BJP panicked, got its

goons to attack Arvind Kejriwal," the AAP, which has been ruling Delhi since 2013, posted on X within minutes of the attack on its leader.

The AAP convener also said the Delhi Police on Saturday stopped the screening of the Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) documentary Unbreakable on January 18, citing non-compliance with election guidelines. AAP convener and former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal accused the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of using the Delhi Police to stop the screening. However, the Delhi Police denied these allegations. The Delhi Police said that "no permission" was taken for the screening of the documentary. The police emphasized that political parties must apply for permission for such events through a single-window system at the District Election Officer's (DEO) office. Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi on Saturday described the two-day visit of Singapore President Tharman Shanmugaratnam to Odisha as a great event and claimed

that it has opened greater op-

portunities of the State's eco-

nomic ties with that country.

Noting down that at least eight MoUs were signed between Odisha and Singapore during the visit of the Shanmugaratnam for making collaborative efforts to develop various sectors, Majhi said Singapore's support and cooperation would help Odisha emerge as a developed State by 2036.

"We have a goal to make Odisha a prosperous state by 2036 when the state will celebrate its centenary year. Simi-Prime Minister Narendra Modi wants to see that India fully develops or Viksit Bharat by 2047 when it will be celebrating 100th year of its Independence. I'm pretty sure that Odisha will very soon emerge as one of the fifth developed provinces and play India's growth engine," Majhi

The CM, while claiming that his government had fulfilled many of the Bharatiya Janata Party's pre-poll promises, claimed, "There is also a strong possibility that we can also cross the Rs 5 lakh-crore investment target.'

Majhi took a swipe at the previous Biju Janata Dal government headed by Naveen Patnaik, saying it had left Odisha in a state of "inaction" and "underdevelopment".

Cold wave to continue for 5 days in State | Twist in Naba Das murder

Mercury dips in Twin City

Cold wave conditions returned to most districts of Odisha on Friday night with a steep fall in temperature, throwing normal life out of

There would be no respite from the cold as the India Meteorological Department (IMD) stated in its forecast that the conditions would continue for at least subsequent four to five days.

Notably, cold wave conditions gripped the State capital region from the intervening night of Thursday and Friday when the mercury levels plummeted sharply. Bhubaneswar recorded a fall in temperatures by 3.2 degrees Celsius over one day and reeled at 12.3 degrees.

Cuttack experienced a 2-degree temperature drop and shivered at 12.4 degrees Celsius. The steep temperature drop was also accompanied by cold winds from the northwest, which further intensified the chilly conditions.

Weather situations under



the impact of the cold wave were also aggravated by persistent dense fog conditions across many interior districts. Koraput recorded a thick layer of fog where visibility fell below 20 meters. Phulbani also witnessed dense fog conditions with visibility between 50 and 200 meters.

As per th forecast of the IMD, there would be no large change in the minimum temperature across most districts of the State for the next four to five days.

The Regional Office of the IMD here also issued shallow to moderate fog warnings for parts of Ganjam, Gajapati, Puri, Cuttack, Khordha, Jagatsinghpur, Nayagarh and Jharsuguda districts, which would remain valid until the morning of January 20.

Forensic report says multiple firearms used

m ome}$ sensational new revelations have come to light in the ongoing investigation into the assassination of former BJD Minister Naba Das.

Forensic reports have indi cated that multiple firearms were used during the crime, raising suspicion of the involvement of more shooters apart from accused Gopal According to the State Fo-

rensic Science Laboratory's report from the crime scene, one bullet struck the minister while five bullets were found to have hit an accompanying government Innova SUV. This finding challenges earlier assumptions that implicated only one suspect, Gopal Das, suggesting potential involvement of more persons in the murder plot.

Defence lawver Naresh Nayak has speculated about the possible involvement of a sniper, due to the precise nature of the attack. On January 29, 2023, according to the



Gandhi Chowk, travelling in two separate vehicles. Das was in the leading car, with his aides following in another. During the investigation,

authorities discovered a magazine with 18 bullets and three unfired rounds from Gopal Das. This situation report claims that of the six bullets, three were retrieved unfired, one hit Naba Das in the chest, another was not discharged, and the last fired into the air.

However, forensic findings contrast with this account, especially regarding the second vehicle, a white Toyota Innova, found with five bullet holes. The absence of shell casings for bullets that hit the second vehicle raises further queries about the trajectory and origin of the shots.

The firearm responsible for the bullet that struck Naba Das remains undetermined, fuelling further intrigue around Gopal Das' involvement and beyond.

While the bullets found align with Gopal Das' weapon, the source of the bullet that fatally wounded Naba Das is still uncertain. The investigation continues to probe deeper into these developments, aiming to uncover all involved in this high-profile case.

4 lakh taxpayers avail ration cards in State

In a startling revelation, taxpayers in Odisha have ration cards!

Minister for Food and Supplies Krushna Chandra Patra on Saturday informed that approximately 4 lakh people in the State, who regularly file income tax returns, appear to be disproportionately benefiting from ration distribution schemes, which are meant for those in genuine need.

The minister said instructions have been issued to officers to verify such facts after field verification. This step is intended to ascertain the veracity of these records to ensure that ration benefits only reach the truly-deserving people. "Everything was possible in

the previous government's tenure for which ration cards were issued to those they wanted," said minister Patra. Once the reports are corroborated, appropriate measures would be enforced to rectify any exploitation of the ration card system, he said.

 In a bid to identify and penalise the owners of the vehicles plying without having insurance, the State Government would start an automated system at all toll pla-

In a notification on Saturday, the State Transport Authority (STA) said the e-detection process would start operation from February 1. The system would be operational at all 22 toll plazas on the National Highways.

Under the system, if any vehicle is found not having valid insurance coverage, e-challans would be automatically sent to its owner. Then, the Transport Department would start

mandatory for all vehicles. Violation of the Act would attract a fine of Rs 2,000 or a jail term up to three months or both. Repeat offences would lead to a fine of Rs 4,000 along with imprisonment. Notably, the department

had detected violation of various traffic norms including speed limit, fitness certificate and tax dues through the automated system. The additional provision is meant to ensure compensation to the families in case of any mishap involving the vehicles.

The volunteers received certificates and medals as a testament to their achievement.



State-wide midwinter bird census held PNS BHUBANESWAR

Udisha on Saturday commenced its comprehensive midwinter bird census, aim-

ing to log both indigenous and

migratory bird species across

the State.

For the first time, the bird census is being carried out in all the 52 forest divisions in Odisha, marking a significant scale-up in efforts to understand avian biodiversity.

On Thursday, a mock drill had been held to prepare for the census followed by specialised training for experts on Friday. The regions of Chilika Lake, Bhitarkanika National Park and Hirakud Dam are of paramount importance due to their substantial bird populations.

As many as 21 teams are designated for both Chilika



and Hirakud while 18 are allocated to Bhitarkanika. Each team comprises an ornithologist, forest personnel and additional members, ensuring

comprehensive coverage. Chilika, renowned for its


avian diversity, will be covered across five distinct ranges: Satapada, Nuapada, Tangi and Rambha. The Hirakud Dam survey spans an extensive 550 square kilometers with 32 teams engaged in the counting process.

At the outset, Prof Chandi Prasad Nanda, Director, Odisha Research Centre (ORC) Bhubaneswar briefed the audience about the major goals of ORC.


Bodies of 3 missing workers recovered

he Southern Odisha is witnessing a surge in thefts and robberies, leaving residents in a state of fear and uncertainty

Over the past two years, criminal activities have intensified, with thieves targeting locked houses to steal valuables and, in some cases, setting properties ablaze after unsuccessful attempts, causing massive financial losses.

in 2024 across 13 out of 16 police stations, compared to 739 cases in 2023, averaging two theft cases every night. Additionally, 27 murders were reported in 2024, marginally lower than the 29 recorded in 2023. Ganjam police district saw a rise in thefts, with 812 cases in 2024 compared to 789 in 2023, while the number of murders dropped from 85 in 2023 to 53 in 2024. Kandhamal district recorded 307 thefts in 2024, up from 277 in 2023. Boudha district experienced an increase from 146 thefts in 2023 to 210 in 2024. Gajapati district remained an exception, reporting 119 thefts in 2024 against

notable incidents occurred on September 4, 2024, when thieves broke into Om Sai Jewellers on Tatabenj Street under the Baidyanathpur police station in Brahmapur. They stole over Rs 80 lakh worth of gold, silver jewelry, and cash by breaking through the wall. While eight suspects were arrested from Delhi and Lucknow, and the stolen items recovered, many other cases remain unresolved.

On January 3, 2025, in a shocking incident, a gang of thieves attempted to rob Debi Patnaik's house in the Kalinganagar area in the city. When they failed to steal anything, they set the house on fire, causing significant damage. Bike thefts have also surged, contributing to the growing concerns. Reports indicate that 15 percent of the total 4,995 cases registered in Brahmapur police district in 2024 were theft-related.

Despite some arrests in high-profile cases, the lack of significant progress in curbing the activities of organised gangs has raised questions about police efficiency. The rising number of thefts has instilled fear among residents, who are demanding stronger measures, increased vigilance, and quicker action to restore safety and se-

The Khariar residents raised concerns about inadequate administrative services in Khariar Tehsil during Revenue Minister Suresh Pujhari's visit to the area on Wednes-

Sanjay Tiwari, a local resident, submitted a grievance petition highlighting the neglect of revenue matters due to the dual responsibilities of the Tehsildar.

Tiwari said that the Tehsildar of Khariar also holds additional charge as the Block Development Officer (BDO) of Khariar block, which has significantly impacted the efficiency of revenue-related operations. "The dual responsibility has resulted in the Tehsildar spending most of his time at the Block Office, leaving the Tehsil office unresponsive," he stated.

Tiwari emphasized that the situation has caused delays in critical processes, such as land mutation and the issuance of final Records of Rights (RoR) to buyers who have legally purchased property. He cited a recent case where the district consumer court fined the Tehsildar Rs 25,000 for failing to issue an RoR to a land buyer in a timely manner. The court deemed the delay a deficiency in service and a cause of ha rassment for the complainant.

In response, Minister Pujhari requested Tiwari to provide specific examples of delays so that immediate action could be taken to address the issues.

It is affiliated with the Karate India Organisation (KIO), the only national federation approved by the Asian Karate Federation (AKF) and the World Karate Federation (WKF). These international organizations are globally recognized and are responsible for maintaining the standards of karate. The KIO is the sole authorized body in India affiliated with these governing organizations, it said.

Dr Hari Prasad Pattanayak, the driving force behind Utkal Karate School, is an 8th DAN Black Belt holder and a certified coach under the World Karate Federation (WKF). As a recognized representative, he has the full authority to issue certificates and promote belts to trainees in line with WKF guidelines, the release clarified.

Certificates issued by Utkal



2018-2019 bear the approval of the Karate Association of India (KAI). During that period, KAI was the National Sports Federation (NSF) for karate in India and was recognized by both the Government of India and the Indian Olympic Association (IOA). Therefore, the mention of KAI and its higher bodies on those certificates was accurate and valid, it said.

It is also important to note that the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and the Government of India recognize only National Sports Federations (NSFs). They do not directly recognize karate schools, which clarifies the authority under which Utkal Karate School operates, it said.

The State government is making concerted efforts to improve the efficiency of the Revenue and Disaster Management Department while empowering women and supporting the agricultural sector. During visit to Ganjam district, the Minister reviewed ongoing initiatives aimed at streamlining grain procurement, addressing farmer needs, and resolving administrative challenges.

Minister Pujari emphasized the importance of extending opportunities to more Self-Help Groups (SHGs) for grain transactions, alongside women-led SHGs that have already shown interest.

been arranged to process rice. As of January 16, 2025, 901,414.40 quintals of paddy have been collected from 4,079 farmers using 435 collection pads, with plans to complete the paddy purchase by the end of February.

District Collector Dibya Jyoti Parida shared that efforts are underway to enhance the grain collection process, with multiple stakeholders involved to improve efficiency.

Minister Pujari reaffirmed the government's commitment to supporting farmers, particularly those impacted by weather challenges. "The government is here to help farmers, and we will ensure they receive the necessary assistance," he assured. In response to concerns about the shortage of mandis in Ganjam district, the Minister announced plans to construct a new mandi by inviting tenders, expected to be completed by the next Kharif season. The minister also addressed

Several leaders who left the Congress and even mounted stinging attacks on it find a place in the pictorial representation of the party's history spread across the five storeys of its new 9A Kotla Road office.

Ahead of a media tour of the office, Congress treasurer Ajay Maken Saturday told reporters at the first press conference at the Indira Gandhi Bhawan that the building was built at an estimated cost of Rs 200-225 crore with some dues still left to be paid to Larsen and Toubro (L&T) construction company.

The Congress headquarters inaugurated Wednesday, as the grand old party turned a page in its history after operating from its iconic 24, Akbar Road premises for the last 47

parliamentary Congress party chief Sonia Gandhi inaugurated the plush building in the presence of party president Mallikarjun Kharge, former party chief Rahul Gandhi, and general secretaries Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, Jairam Ramesh and K C Venugopal, among other

"Today we will introduce you to a temple of democracy - Indira Bhawan, the headquarters of the largest opposition party of the country at present," Maken told the press conference along with AICC general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh and party's media and publicity department head Pawan Khera.

"The government of India allotted this land to us on November 19, 2007. Its foundation stone was laid in 2009 and finally we received tne 'completion cum occupancy certificate' on January 14, 2025, while it was inaugurated on January 15," he said. Indira Gandhi Bhawan,

Christian man unable to bury father: SC raps **Chhattisgarh Government**

The Supreme Court has slammed the Chhattisgarh Government and sought its response on a plea filed by a Christian man who said he is unable to bury his pastor father in Chhindawada village as people have aggressively objected to it and police have threatened him with legal action. A bench of Justices BV Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma expressed surprise that the body was lying in a mortuary in the district hospital and medical college, Jagdalpur since January 7, when the man died and the police have not taken any action since then.

Bench rapped the Chhattisgarh Government while seeking its response on the plea filed by the son. "Leave the village panchayat, even the High Court has passed a strange order. What is the State Government doing," the bench said while issuing notice to the pastor died due to prolonged Chhattisgarh Government. old age illness. issuing



The matter will be heard on January 20.

The top court was hearing the appeal filed by Ramesh Baghel, belonging to the Mahra caste, challenging an order of the Chhattisgarh High Court which disposed of his plea seeking burial of his father who was a pastor in the area specified for Christian persons in the village graveyard. Relying on a certificate issued by the gram panchayat's sarpanch that there are no separate burial grounds for Christians, the High Court denied him permission saying it may cause unrest and disharmony in the public at large.The



Import of refurbished medical

Tn a move aimed at curtailing I the influx of unregulated second-hand medical devices in the country, the apex drug regulator Central Drugs Control Standard Organisation (CDSCO) has informed the Customs Department that import of refurbished devices is not allowed. In a letter to the Principal Commissioner of Customs, the CDSCO said that all medical devices are regulated under the Medical Devices Rules, 2017.

"However, there is no specific provision for regulation of refurbished medical devices under the said rules. Hence, no licence is issued for import of such devices and it cannot be imported under Medical Devices Rules for sale and distribution," the CDSCO said.

Manufacturers of medical devices have welcomed the move, stating this decisive clarification reinforces the regulatory framework designed to ensure the highest standards of patient safety.

Dr Sudhir Srivastava, former Committee at PHDCCI, said that the decision by CDSCO marks a pivotal step towards reinforcing India's self-reliance in medical medical technology.

"Allowing refurbished medical devices into the would country jeopardized the quality of healthcare, disincentivized local innovation, undermined the spirit of the 'Make in India' initiative,' Srivastava said.

While it's impossible to know the exact conditions in which hostages have been held, the Health Ministry and the Hostages Family Forum, which represents families of the hostages, are preparing for several different scenarios based on information gathered from hostages previously released or rescued

Hamas militants abducted about 250 people during a cross-border attack on Oct 7, 2023, that also left 1,200 people dead. About 100 hostages are still being held, though Israel believes a third of them are no longer alive.

The war that followed the attack has killed more than 46.000 Palestinians, according to Gaza health officials, who do not distinguish between civilians and militants but say women and children make up more than half of those killed. Hagai Levine, who heads the health team at the Hostages Families Forum, said he expects the hostages to return with cardiovascular and respiratory issues due to lack of ventilation in the tunnels. Among

multiple other afflictions their first few hours, Mizrahi Levine expects are vitamin deficiencies, starvation, dramatic weight loss, vision problems due to a lack of sunlight, broken bones, cognitive impairment and mental health

As a result, doctors are expecting the hostages will require longer and more complex medical and mental health interventions than did those who returned after the last ceasefire in November 2023, said Dr Einat Yehene, a psychologist at the Hostages Families Forum who oversees the captives' reha-

COMPLEX MEDICAL CHALLENGES

Doctors are keenly aware of the challenges they face in treating the surviving hostages. One of them is "refeeding syndrome," when exposure to certain foods or too much food can lead to profound health complications and even death in those with prolonged vitamin and nutritional deficiencies, said Dr Hagar Mizrahi, head of the Ministry of Health's medical directorate.

The Red Cross team that will transfer the hostages from Gaza to Egypt and the small Israeli military medical team that will meet the hostages at the border as they cross into as stripping down the hospital Israel have strict guidelines for rooms and changing the lightwhat the hostages can eat in ing. Six hospitals are preparing to receive hostages, including two in the south, closer to Gaza, that will treat those with acute medical issues, health ministry officials said.

"Given the physical and emotional conditions, we expect emotional withdrawal symptoms, such as maybe exhaustion, fatigue — and some will probably need assistance with their mobility," she said.

Medical officials are also prepared for the possibility that returning hostages will need speech therapy, especially if they have been kept in isolation, Yehene noted. She said some might be so traumatized or in shock from the transfer to Israel that they will be unable to speak at all.

To minimise the hostages' trauma and allow them to acclimate to their new reality, officials will try to limit the number of people who interact with them and have made accommodations to lessen their sensory stimulation, such

outh Korea's impeached Spresident on Saturday argued for his release before a Seoul judge as the court reviewed whether to grant a law enforcement request for his formal arrest

Yoon, who has been in detention since he was apprehended on Wednesday in a massive law enforcement operation at his residence, faces potential rebel-lion charges linked to his declaration of martial law on December 3, which set off the country's most serious political crisis since its democratisation in the late 1980s.

The Corruption Investigation Office for High-Ranking Officials, which is leading a joint investigation with police and the military, requested the Seoul Western District Court to grant a warrant for Yoon's formal arrest.

Yoon's lawyers said he spoke for about 40 minutes to the judge during the nearly five-hour closed-door hearing. His legal team and anti-corruption agencies presented opposing arguments about whether he should be held in custody. The lawyers did not share his specific comments. The judge is expected to make a decision by late Saturday or early Sunday. Yoon's motorcade was seen leaving the court Saturday evening for the detention centre, where Yoon will await the

decision. If Yoon is arrested, investigators can extend his detention to 20 days, during which they will

The lawyer said the president was to argue that his decree was a legitimate exercise of his powers and that accusations of rebellion would not hold up before a criminal court or the Constitutional Court, which is reviewing whether to formally remove him from office or reinstate him.

Nine people, including Yoon's defence minister, police chief, and several top military commanders, have already been arrested and indicted for their roles in the enforcement of martial law. The crisis began when Yoon, in

an attempt to break through legislative gridlock, imposed military rule and sent troops to the National Assembly and election offices The standoff lasted only hours

after lawmakers who managed to get through a blockade voted to lift the measure. The opposition-dominated assembly voted to impeach him on December 14.

If Yoon is formally arrested, it could mark the beginning of an extended period in custody for him, lasting months or more. If prosecutors indict Yoon on rebellion and abuse of power charges, which are the allegations now being examined by investigators, they could keep him in custody for up to six months before trial.

Under South Korean law,

orchestrating a rebellion is punishable by life imprison-

ment or the death penalty. Yoon's lawyers have argued that there is no need to detain him during the investigation, saying he doesn't pose a threat to flee or destroy evidence. Investigators respond that Yoon ignored several requests to appear for questioning, and that the presidential security service blocked an attempt to detain him on January 3. His defiance has raised concerns about whether he would comply with criminal court pro-

Tens of thousands to converge on Washington for march days before Trump takes office

 $E_{\text{first march, the Women's}}^{\text{ight years since its historic}}$ March is returning Saturday to the nation's capital just before President-elect Donald Trump's

inauguration. Rebranded and reorganized, the rally has a new name — the People's March — as a means to broaden support, especially during a reflective moment for progressive organizing after Trump's decisive win in November. The Republican takes the oath of office Monday. Women outraged over Trump's 2016 presidential win flocked to Washington in 2017 and organized large rallies in cities throughout the country, building

the base of a grassroots movement that became known as the Women's March. Washington rally alone attracted over 500,000 marchers, and millions more participated in local marches around the country, marking one of the largest single-day demonstrations in US history. This year, the march is expected to be about one-tenth the size of the first one and comes amid a restrained moment of reflection as many progressive voters navigate feelings of exhaustion, disappointment and despair after Vice President Kamala Harris' loss. The comparative quiet contrasts sharply with the white-knuckled fury of the inaugural rally as massive crowds shouted

demands over megaphones and marched in pink pussyhats in response to Trump's first election win. "The reality is that it's just hard to capture lightning in a bottle," said Tamika Middleton, managing director at the Women's March. "It was a really particular moment. In 2017, we had not seen a Trump presidency and the kind of vitriol that that represented."

The movement fractured after that hugely successful day of protests over accusations that it was not diverse enough. This year's rebrand as a People's March is the result of an overhaul intended to broaden the group's appeal. Saturday's demonstration will promote themes related to feminism, racial justice, anti-mil-

itarization and other issues and will end with discussions hosted by various social justice organizations. The People's March is unusual in the "vast array of issues brought together under one umbrella," said Jo Reger, a sociology professor who researches social movements at Oakland University in Rochester, Michigan. Women's suffrage marches, for example, were focused on a specific goal of voting rights. For a broad-based social justice movement such as the march, conflicting visions are impossible to avoid and there is "immense pressure" for organizers to meet everyone's needs, Reger said. But she also said some discord isn't necessarily a bad thing.

TikTok users in limbo as ban looms

The US is inching closer ▲ and closer to a potential TikTok ban — with the nation's highest court upholding a law that's set to halt new downloads of the app starting Sunday.

But many questions around what exactly this ban will look like, and whether it will actually be enforced, remain.

That puts millions of users and content creators in limbo particularly influencers and small business owners who have come to rely on the megapopular social media platform as a source of income.

Among those individuals is Terrell Wade, a comedian, actor and content creator with 1.5 million followers on TikTok the handle @TheWadeEmpire. Wade, who has turned his TikTok presence PD(1283)C into a full-time job, said he ship to address national secu-

rity concerns, but signalled expects "two days of chaos" as the Sunday deadline nears. "At this point, I really don't know what to believe," Wade told The Associated Press.

In a unanimous decision on Friday, the Supreme Court upheld a federal law that will ban TikTok unless it's sold by its China-based parent company before January 19 — ruling that a risk to national security posed by the platform's ties to China overcomes First Amendment concerns about limiting free speech on and by the app.

A sale does not appear imminent, meaning the ban should go into effect Sunday. But the ruling also arrives just days before the inauguration of a new president.

The BCCI has not officially announced the guidelines but media has already reported on the 10-point diktat.

 B_{is}^{oxing} , the "sweet science", at theatre of skill, power and drama that has captivated audiences for centuries. Yet, behind the allure of championship nights and historic rivalries lies a shadow persistent controversial decisions that spark cries of "robbery". Boxing has had its fair share of

controversial decisions which continue to spark debate among fans and experts alike. While technology in sports like football and cricket has supplemented objective rules, boxing's reliance on subjective judgement leaves it uniquely vulnerable to bias and error. Isn't it time the sport caught

up?
The answer may lie in artificial intelligence (AI). Imagine a world where contentious decisions and accusations of bias become a thing of the past. Could the technology offer boxing the fairness and transparency it desperately needs?

Boxing's history is long and storied, tracing back to bareknuckle fights and evolving into the regulated, global phenomenon it is today. But some things haven't changed. Chief among them is the subjective nature of judging. Unlike football's offsides or cricket's LBW (leg before wicket) calls, boxing lacks hard and fast rules for scoring.

judges interpreting abstract criteria like effective aggression, defence and clean punching While these standards sound straightforward, their application often varies wildly, leading to unpredictable

results.

Take the infamous 2012 Olympics, which featured many scoring controversies that led to demands for reform. Manchester United and Scotland soccer great, Denis Law dies at 84 He returned from Torino in

Denis Law, the Manchester United and Scotland great, has died. He was 84. The death of Law, the only Scottish player to win the Ballon d'Or, was announced by his family through United on Friday. In 2021 he was diagnosed with dementia.

"It is with a heavy heart that we tell you our father Denis Law has sadly passed away. He fought a tough battle but finally he is now at peace," the statement read. "We would like to thank

everyone who contributed to his wellbeing and care, past and much more recently. We know how much people supported and loved him and that love was always appreciated and made the difference."

Law is forever linked with Bobby Charlton and George Best, the three-pronged strike force that led United to English league titles in 1965 and '67 and the European Cup in 1968 — a first for an English club.

Everyone at Manchester United is mourning the loss of Denis Law, the King of the Stretford End," United said in a statement. "With 237 goals in 404 appearances, he will always be celebrated as one of the club's greatest and most beloved players. The ultimate

and love for the game made him the hero of a generation.' Law, Charlton and Best would be voted as European footballer of the year and win the Ballon d'Or in a fiveseason period from 1964-68. They are united in a statue at Old Trafford. Law is the only player with two statues at the stadium: He stands solo on the Stretford End concourse, naturally. Law's 46 goals in the 1963-64

season remains a single-season record for United. His 237 goals for the club are bettered by only Charlton and Wayne Rooney, though his goals-per-game ratio However, a goal he scored against United is arguably his

most famous. In one of the last games of his career, Law was playing for Manchester City — where he had two spells — at Old Trafford in United's next-to-last game of the 1973-74 season.

His late goal, with an audacious back-heel flick he insisted was "a fluke," meant United lost 1-0 and helped to ensure its relegation to the second division just six years being European Law did not celebrate his goal

and was substituted with head bowed as United fans invaded the pitch before the game



restarted. His 30 goals for Scotland are matched by only Kenny Dalglish, though was Dalglish, achieved in just 55 games compared to Dalglish's 102. UEFA was one of many to react to Law's death. On X it wrote, "On behalf of European football we are deeply saddened to learn of the passing of Denis Law. One of Scottish football's true greats.

player who would become fondly referred to as "The Lawman," Law left his northern Scotland hometown of Aberdeen as a skinny 15-year-old with poor eyesight. He became a feared penaltyarea predator and a pioneer in modernizing world of European soccer

By the age of 22, both United and City paid English-record transfer fees to sign Law, and he had played one season in Italy — an exotic change of culture at that time, though he disliked the defensive nature

1962 to begin an 11-year stint at Old Trafford that helped reestablish United as an international power under manager Matt Busby.
Law joined a club that was still rebuilding from the airplane crash at Munich four

years earlier. It took the lives of most of Busby's thendominant team returning from a European Cup game. Law's prolific scoring helped United win the FA Cup in 1963 for its first trophy since the Munich disaster, and then two league titles in three

Redemption for Busby's United was becoming European champion a decade after the tragedy.

Though Best and Charlton scored in the final, a 4-1 extra-time win over Benfica, Law missed the game at London's Wembley Stadium due to a knee injury that persisted in his career. He had his own signature

Wembley moment one year earlier. He scored Scotland's first goal in a 3-2 victory to inflict England's first loss since winning the 1966 World Cup final nine months previously. As a proud Scot, Law refused

to watch the final on television. He went to play golf instead.
Only in one of his last games would Law finally play at the World Cup, in 1974 in West Germany

Then a 34-year-old veteran, Law was selected for Scotland's opening match, a 2-0 win against Zaire. He was not picked for subsequent drawn games against Brazil and Yugoslavia as Scotland was eliminated.

Law chose to end his career in August 1974, by which time he'd etched his name in soccer's scoring history.

After his playing career, Law worked as a TV soccer pundit and presenter and was very much in the public eye in spending some of Best's last hours next to the Northern Irishman's hospital bed before his alcohol-related death in

Law recovered from prostate cancer, and was awarded a Commander of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth II in 2016 for services to soccer and charity.

When his dementia was publicly revealed four years ago, he said, "It is an incredibly challenging and problematic disease and I have witnessed many friends go through this. I recognise how my brain is deteriorating and how my memory evades me when I don't want it to and how this causes me distress in situations that are

beyond my control.

The Power of Gratitude Journaling

ratitude is often described as the quality of being thankful and the readiness to show appreciation for and return kindness. Research indicates that gratitude journaling can reduce symptoms of depression and anxiety. A 2015 study published in the journal Psychotherapy Research found that individuals who engaged in gratitude writing reported significantly better mental health outcomes compared to those who focused on negative emotions or did not engage in any writing practice. Gratitude helps reframe thoughts, reducing rumination and encouraging a focus on the

Putting gratitude on paper- promotes emotional resilience by encouraging individuals to concentrate on their blessings rather than their shortcomings.
