You Have 8,000 Trees

300,000,000,000+

Across Canada, you'll find more than 300 Billion trees that include around 140 different species.

Who manages your trees?

7,160 of your trees are managed by your province or territory, 136 are under federal government management, 168 belong to indigenous communities, and the last 536 are looked after by private landowners.

What kind of trees do you have?

70% of your trees are in coniferous forests.

12% of your trees are in deciduous forests.

18%

of your trees are a mix of species or are in young growing forests.

How old are your trees?

600 of your trees are in young forests stands, between 1 and 40 years old. Around 2000 trees are in forests stands between 41 and 80 years old. Half of your trees, or roughly 4100 of them, are in stands aged 81-160 years, and the last 1300 are older than 161 years.

What's the plan?

With so many trees, it's difficult to plan for all of them. Roughly 5000 of your trees are subject to one or more management plans, while 3,000 of them are unmanaged.

Certified Sustainable

Of your 5000 managed trees, roughly 3,500 of them are third-party certified.

Conservation Matters!

Conservation, ecosystem preservation, and biodiversity are crucial to overall forest health. Of your 8000 trees, around 750 of them are subject to specific conservation measures, mostly for ecosystem or wilderness preservation.

Sustainable and Renewable

How many of your trees are harvested each year? 100? 500? 1000?

In reality, **fewer than 16** of your trees are going to be sustainably harvested this year!

Regenerating our Harvest

Of your 16 harvested trees, 10 will be replanted, and 6 will regrow naturally.

Here in Canada, we have stringent federal and provincial laws ensuring that every single tree harvested on public lands is regenerated!

Debunking Deforestation

1 of your trees will be permanently removed this year, mostly to allow for urban, industrial, or agriculture expansion.
Canada has one of the lowest rates of deforestation in the world!

Your trees are under threat!

Insects & Disease Nearly 400 of your trees are currently affected by insects, often defoliating, and killing them, making

them idea fuel for wildfire.



Wildfire Risks

In 2023, more than 400 of your trees have burned, which is **more than will be harvested in the next 20 years.**
