The past two years have been challenging for all of us. The COVID-19 pandemic has thrown our world into chaos. One of the less obvious—yet still heartbreaking—consequences of the pandemic has been the impact on children, especially those in poverty. According to UNICEF, “**The COVID-19 pandemic has been the biggest threat to progress for children in our 75-year history.** In less than two years, **100 million more children** have fallen into poverty.”<sup>1</sup>

Improving the quality of education in developing countries like Guatemala has never been more important. That’s why we are so incredibly thankful for all of the Rotary clubs and districts who make up the Guatemala Literacy Project (GLP) family. 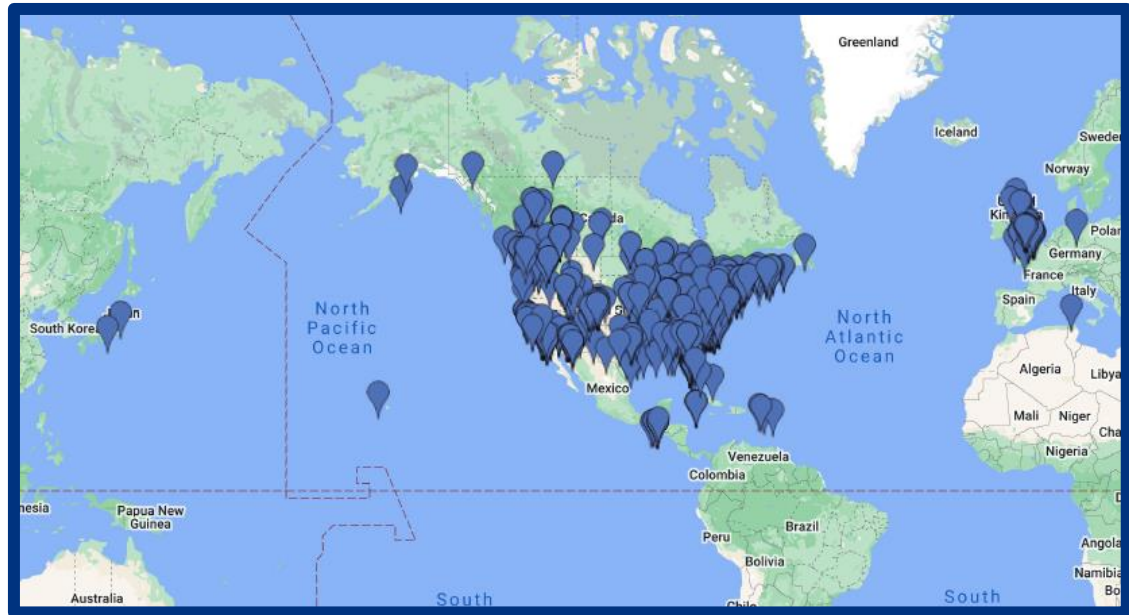

## Special Report: COVID-19's Impact on the GLP & its Programs

As the world entered the second year of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Guatemala Literacy Project (GLP) continued to meet the challenge head-on. Innovation across all four of our programs enabled the GLP to continue serving students during virtual learning, social distancing measures, and technological challenges. When the pandemic first hit, six million children in Guatemala were suddenly faced with the challenge of learning from home while in-person classes were suspended. And in the rural areas we serve, hardly *any* families have computers at home, so virtual schooling was extremely difficult. Providing quality education to students has been more challenging in the past few years than any other time in recent history. Dropout rates have surged, and the need for GLP programs is higher than it's ever been.

### Turning Obstacles into Opportunities

With schools closed, students obviously couldn't learn from in-person instruction, and the teachers couldn't attend training sessions with GLP trainers. So how did the GLP pivot to accommodate the challenges?

- Our Spark Reading Program team wrote and produced **tarjetones – portable reading cards** kids can use at home to practice reading with their parents. So far, we've distributed 52,000 *tarjetones* of 32 different books! This innovation has the added benefit of offering advice and encouragement to parents—many of whom are illiterate themselves—in how they can support their children's learning at home. It even gives their younger siblings an early introduction to reading, on a much greater scale than what Spark provided pre-pandemic.
- The Textbook Program and the Spark Reading Program launched robust **virtual platforms for training teachers**. The platforms are loaded with study materials and videos demonstrating program techniques to help teachers work through the entire curriculum independently. The platform also helps us reach teachers who are far from our normal service areas.

- Since most of our students don't have access to a computer at home, our Computer Centers Program staff and teachers created **videos and exercises** that allow the students to view and complete the curriculum at their own pace. Often, students were able to watch the videos on their family's smartphone or on printed worksheets. A comprehensive platform designed to deliver the entire curriculum in a self-paced learning format (optimized for hybrid instruction) is now installed at GLP Computer Centers throughout Guatemala.
- In our Rise Youth Development Program, local facilitators guided students through their youth development manuals from home. **Videos, group calls, and worksheets** took the place of the program's typical in-person workshops, and students submitted photos of their assignments via WhatsApp.

### Innovation for the Future of the GLP

Thanks to these new platforms, GLP programs can now be delivered primarily virtually *when needed*. However, when *in-person* activities can take place, the platforms can still give teachers and students the chance to review and engage with the material on their own like never before. This will continue to add value to our programs for many years to come, even once in-person activities can fully resume.



The platforms will also enable our programs to expand to previously-unreachable schools. Smaller schools that can't afford to hire a dedicated computer teacher may now be able to receive a GLP lab with a part-time "teacher guide" to lead students through the virtual platform. We're also looking at ways to bring Spark platform access to primary-school teachers in regions our Spark Program can't reach in person—a truly portable version of the curriculum.

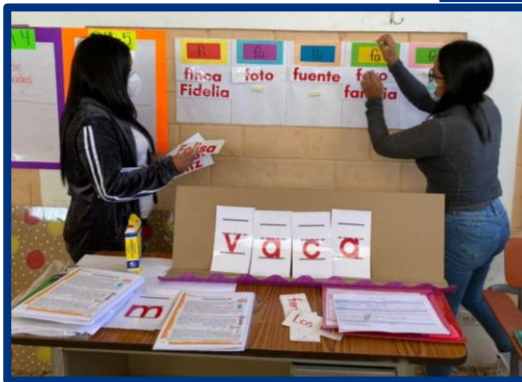

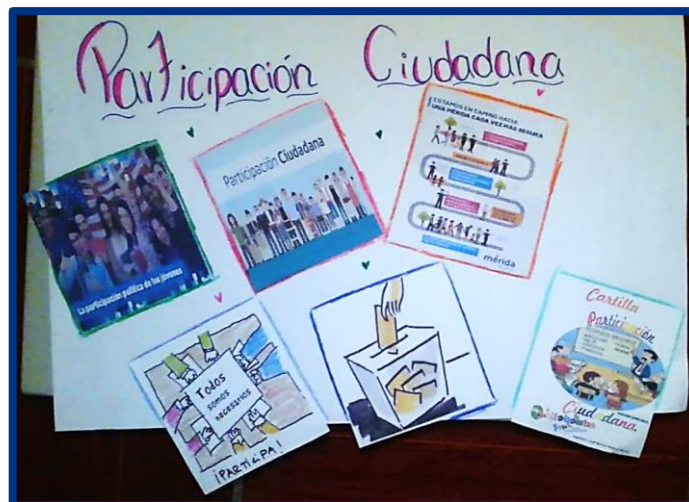
