



Unity and cooperation pre-conditions for prosperity and peace, says His Majesty



His Majesty The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam addresses the nation on new year's eve, calling for the maintenance of unity and cooperation for achieving further prosperity.

Prunei Darussalam ushered in the new year with His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam urging the people to maintain unity and cooperation – which, he said, are pre-requisites for further prosperity and peace.

Addressing the nation over radio and television on new year's eve, the ruler also urged civil servants to be more innovative in carrying out their duties and to increase their productivity. His Majesty extended the call to members of the private sectors, who he said, like their counterparts in the government sector need to carry out their duties efficiently and transparently because they, too, share the responsibility in determining the progress and growth of the country.

"Prosperity and peace are priceless and can only be achieved through unity and cooperation. Neither do they come easily, hence, should not be taken for granted especially at these times of uncertainties", he asserted.

His Majesty pointed that the years immediately preceding the new century saw many countries holding high hopes for the better in the new global era. These hopes are enhanced with the United Nations convening the Millennium Summit which involved many countries.

However, this was not to be with the occurrence of events that suddenly shocked the world which subsequently resulted in war in West Asia – barely a decade after the end of the Gulf War, His Majesty lamented.

This had a sudden impact on world economy, especially on aviation and tourism-related industries. Furthermore, this further worsened the world economic situation which was already badly hit by the Asian financial crisis, the ruler went on.

Nevertheless, in spite of this some peace-loving countries including Brunei Darussalam continue the efforts in their pursuit to maintain peace and achieve further prosperity and progress.

At the same time, he added, regional and international organizations are also playing their respective roles towards achieving these goals.

Customer-focus, customer-friendly civil service

With the coming of the new year, the Prime Minister's Department has renewed its call to civil servants to be diligent and give full attention to the duties entrusted them with full commitment so as to achieve maximum productivity.

Through a circular distributed to civil servants on January 1. the Prime Minister's Department reminded that as the pillar and administrative machinery responsible for planning, policy and implementation of development projects, the civil service should be efficient, clean and dynamic, and capable of competing and facing challenges.

To fulfill these requirements, civil servants should carry out their duties wholeheartedly with diligence and wisdom so quality productivity can be benefited, the circular emphasised.

It further stated that in addition, civil servants also need to possess various disciplinary attributes such as morality, sincerity, trustworthiness and good work ethics while at all times observing the teamwork and mutual cooperation concepts in the course of conducting of their tasks.

The Prime Minister's Department, through the circular, also highlighted efforts being undertaken by the government to embody e-Government in its administration and this calls for employees to equip themselves with relevant and up-to-date know-how in the employment of information technology and also constantly keep abreast with its development.

On the continuing efforts to make the civil service a facilitator and partner to the private sector and the public at large, the Prime Minister's Department underscored the need on the part of the civil service to be sensitive to the demand of changing times by constantly revising procedures, regulations and methodologies.

"The civil service now needs to be more customer-focus and customer friendly while being sensitive to the needs of the public and government so as to enable ministries deal with their clients more accessibly. This is vital in supporting the government's aspirations to diversify the national economy and make the country a service hub for trade and tourism or ShuTT, and International Offshore Financial Centre or IOFC", asserted the circular.

All these aside, the circular continued, work productivity should be aligned to achieve the goal of creating a peaceful, prosperous, progressive and caring nation whose people are loyal to the monarch, uphold the purity of Islam and embed the Malay Muslim Monarch philosophy within them.

The circular also urged for prudent approaches to be exercised in government spending in order not only to prevent wastages, but also to enable the government carry out its programmes based on 'value for money' effectively.

Brunei Darussalam has vigorously worked towards making its civil service as one of excellence through the introduction in 2000 of the Civil Service Vision for the Twenty First Century.

For her part, His Majesty further said, Brunei Darussalam is stepping up development efforts through projects in the Five-Year Eighth National Development Plan, which apart from the establishment of the National Oil Company and formation of the Economic Development Board, will hopefully strengthen and stabilize the national economy.

In this context, said His Majesty, "I hope everyone from individuals to members of the private sectors will work together with the government in carrying out efforts towards reviving the country's economy".

He said: "At the same time, I hope efforts would also be continued by everyone to maintain peace and harmony in the country by together stamping out all social problems. Without commitment and united efforts, these problems will not be overcome".

Such efforts, His Majesty pointed, should start with the family as this is the ideal institution to bring about individuals of potentials who could become the backbone of the country and its people.

"Hence, it is of great importance for families to possess moral obligations in together bringing about young generations with high morality and faith, because it is only with these qualities can we achieve true harmony, tranquility and peace".

His Majesty makes visits to more government departments

In line with his wish to ensure that government machineries run smoothly and efficiently, His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah, The Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam has made another visit to government departments – this time to those in Belait district.

On December 26, 2001 the ruler flew by helicopter to the district to round up his visits to government departments and communities in various districts for the year, which saw him earlier making about half a dozen similar visits.

In the latest occasion, His Majesty brought under scrutiny the Kuala Belait and Seria Municipal Board, district branches of the Departments of Internal Security, Islamic Dakwah, Radio Television Brunei and Narcotics Control Bureau; and the Seria Police Station and Brunei Shell's headquarters.

First though, before touring each of the agencies, the ruler stopped at the residence of the Belait District Officer to witness the conversion ceremony to Islam of one of the district's longest-serving penghulu (village chieftain), Datu Maharaja Setia

His Highness Prince Sisowath Phandaravong and His Excellency J. Stuart Laing have been diplomats of their respective country to Brunei Darussalam since August 1999 and November 1998 respectively.

Also being granted an audience on 14 January was The Hon. Watanuki Tamisuke, Speaker of the Japanese House of Representatives. Mr. Tamisuke led a delegation of several members of the Japanese House of Representatives for a three-day visit to the country.

During the audience, His Royal Highness and Mr. Tamisuke discussed ways to further promote friendship and cooperation between Brunei Darussalam and Japan.





Sampok, aged 69 years, who is now known under his Muslim name of Muhammad Simpok and his wife, Dayang Putih binti Melingkong now known as Dayang Siti Khadijah binti Abdullah Melingkong, aged 63 years. Datu Maharaja Setia Muhammad Simpok has served as penghulu of Kampong Sukang (Sukang village) in Belait interiors for more than 30 years.

With the latest conversion, the district recorded a total of 100 people embracing the Islamic faith in the 12month period from January 2001.

Belait, which has the largest land area amongst the country's four districts with the second largest population, is home to a number of ethnic groups that compose the Brunei Malays. It is also the seat of the country's oil and gas industries.







His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah recently was given special recognition for his many contributions to the development of music in Brunei Darussalam. The presentation of the award was held during the RTB (Radio Television Brunei) Awards Night 2001, held at the Dewan Raya, Radio Television Centre in Bandar on January 6.

This is the first time that Radio Television Brunei (RTB) has held an award ceremony in recognition and appreciation of its personalities and personnel who had been working with dedication, innovation and creativity to broadcast both radio and television programmes for viewers and listeners, both within Brunei and beyond.

The Acting Director of Radio Television Brunei, Awg Haji Mohd. Yusof, presented the special recognition award to His Royal Highness Prince Haji Sufri Bolkiah.

All in, there were 20 trophies together with cash prizes and certificates presented to the best in their categories in various radio and television production.

ONE BILLION DOLLAR FUNDING

The Department of Economic Planning and Development has announced that the Government of Brunei Darussalam will spend B\$1 billion to implement development projects in the year 2002 – an 82 per cent increase compared to last year's allocation of B\$550 million.

According to a news statement from the Department of Economic Planning and Development, the funding is earmarked for industrial promotion, education, roads, electricity, telecommunication, water supply, public buildings, and State housing. 31 sectors were identified and each sector receives funds ranging from B\$50-156 million.

14 sectors, said the news statement, are given priority and therefore receive a funding increase of more than 100 per cent from the previous year. This excludes three newly introduced ones: information technology, human resources, science and technology, and Pulau Muara Besar project.

50 per cent of the B\$1 billion funding is for fresh projects to be implemented in this year. The remainder is earmarked for on-going projects including ones that have been completed and awaiting payment.

The one billion dollar injection is accompanied by investment in the oil and gas sector, designed to re-invigorate the economy. For example, more than B\$90 million is allocated for industrial promotion. This contributes to infrastructure upgrade, entrepreneurship, and employment opportunities.

The electricity sector receives B\$160 million, enabling the construction of network for power generation and distribution that is expected to meet local demand for the next five years. The road, telecommunication, and water supply sectors are also recipients of multi-million dollar funding with B\$80 million earmarked for the national housing so as to increase housing capacity.

The education, information technology and information-communication, human resources, science and technology will each receive more than B\$150 million. This enables the implementation of projects such as the e-government, awareness and development programme for science and technology, in addition to the setting up of a human resource fund.

B\$77 million is allocated for public building. A raft of new projects is designed to reactivate the building sector. The multiplier effect is expected to generate employment opportunity.

The Department of Economic Planning and Development supervises the project implementation. New approaches to project monitoring are employed to streamline the entire operation and process that promises efficient payment.



ASEAN leaders called on officials for action

A SEAN (the Association of the South East Asian nations) leaders have called on their officials for action that will bring direct benefits to their peoples through the major policy initiatives that have been approved.

These particular efforts are to promote greater economic integration, to narrow the development gap among its members and to reach levels of social and technological development that will offer exciting new opportunities for the peoples of Southeast Asia.

This was said by His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Deputy Sultan who is also Minister of Foreign Affairs, in his speech delivered by Her Royal Highness Princess Hajjah Masna, Ambassador-at-Large at the Foreign Affairs Ministry before she declared open the first meeting of the 35th ASEAN Standing Committee, at the International Convention Centre, on 9 January. His Royal Highness is the Chairman of the 35th ASEAN Standing Committee.

His Royal Highness stressed that in all these efforts the Standing Committee has a crucial role.

"You are the ones who must ensure that it produces top-class results and remain a relevant force in these times of great change throughout the region."

His Royal Highness said, ASEAN's programme would succeed or fail in proportion to the expertise and dedication of its senior officials, from Directors-General to the newest members of their team.

Phnom Penh this year," he said.

The Deputy Sultan earlier noted that the Standing Committee has an extremely challenging time ahead, especially in finding ways to implement ASEAN's Development Plan of Action and to reach its levels of integration in the region.

This is due to the new and increased awareness of the scale and scope of each member's security needs, both regionally and in internationally, and a severe economic situation in Southeast Asia and in the economies of ASEAN's major trading partners, he said.

Her Royal Highness Princess Hajjah Masna also hosted a luncheon for delegates attending the meeting.

Brunei Darussalam is currently the Chairman of the ASEAN Standing Committee until July 2002, and will host the 35th ASEAN Ministerial Meeting (AMM), Post Ministerial Conference (PMC) and 9th ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF) in July – August 2002.

e-Government website, to upgrade the capability of the core government administration

The success of every strategy and action plan depends on the commitment and presistence of every government ministry and agency because without the commitment and enthusiasm in working as a team, the efforts will not achieve success.

This was said by Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Bakti Diraja Dato Laila Utama Haji Awang Isa, Special Adviser to His Majesty at the Prime Minister's Office cum Minister of Home Affairs, who was the guest of honour at the official launch of Brunei Darussalam's e-Government website, at the Ministry of Communications on December 27.

He also said that the commitmment and persistence were critical factors in ensuring excellent public service and it was also important to bring attention to the follow-up measures to ensure that the objectives were met within the estimated period of time and cost.

'The launching of the e-Government website is a significant step in the public service, particularly for the advancement and development of information communication in upgrading the productivity and quality of the public services', he added.

A welcoming remark was also made by Dato Paduka Haji Hazair bin Haji Abdullah, Permanent Secretary at the Prime Minister's Office in his capacity as Chairman of e-Government Programme Executive Committee (EGPEC).

He said that among his committee's main initiatives was to implement strategic action plan to encourage more staff to use information technology in ministries, department and agencies beside to support the achievement of the objectives outlined in the Brunei Darussalam Public Service Vision in the 21st century.

Dato Haji Hazair further added that the flagship application that has been acknowledged by the Executive Working Committee included (TAFIS) Treasury Accounting Financial Information System that includes the project on management and procurement of human resource management, labour exchange and GITNet, BIT Centre and Common Office Environment (COE).

'In the preparation of infrastructure, hardware and software that were needed, the big challenges faced by the e-Government were the change of the mindset, attitude and working environment that includes the application of communication technology and information in the working environment of the public servants', he said.

"Various courses, training, workshops and seminars will be conducted with the aim of upgrading the skills of civil servants in different levels of ICT usage and application in

their offices.

The e-Governmennt programmes Executive Committee (EGPEC) is the advisory and consultative body to the BIT Council for the Development and Implemention of the e-Government programme listed in the e-Government Strategic Framework for Action 2001-2005.

After the ceremony, four speakers from ACCENTURE, KKIP Communications Sdn Bhd, SAPURA (B) Sdn Bhd and HAK & Telecommunications Consultants India Limited (TCIL) presented talks on customer relationship management, the overall Sabah.Net MSP Architecture, Change Management and E-Government TCIL Vision.
