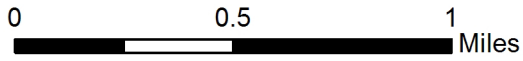

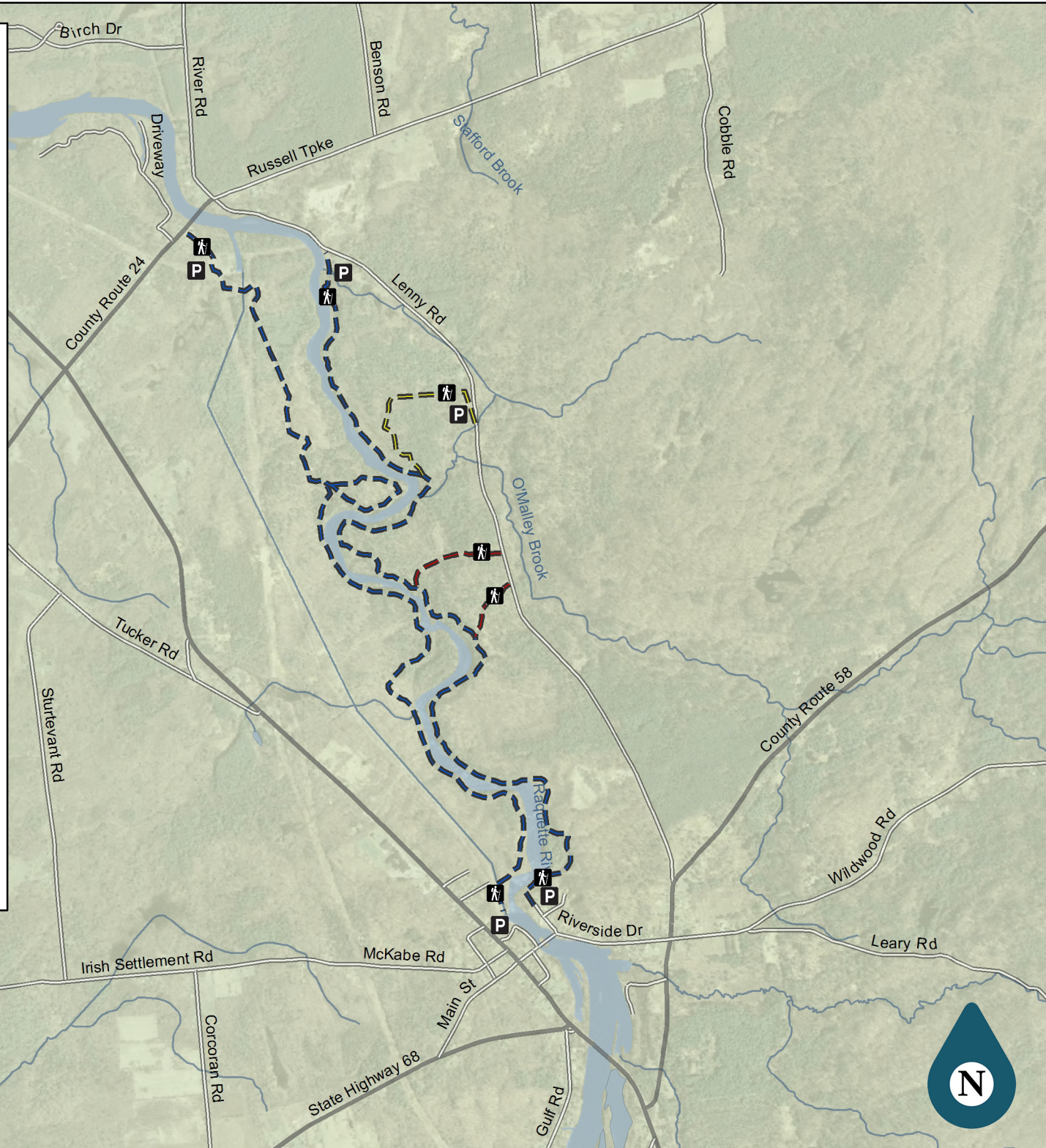


Trail Head

## Stone Valley Trail, Colton, NY

Distance: 7.5 miles round trip    Difficulty: Moderate    Dogs Allowed: Yes

### Description:

The Stone Valley Trail is a scenic trail offering great opportunities for wildlife watching, waterfall viewing, and history lessons. The 7.8 mile roundtrip trail has several informational kiosks describing the natural surroundings and the history of the Raquette River. Several iconic North Country waterfalls, including “The Tubbs,” are located along the trail. Additionally, during the summer months, white water kayakers can be seen braving the raging rapids and waterfalls as they work their way down the river.

### Directions:

**Northern Trailheads** – From Potsdam, take Hwy 56 south approximately 6 miles through Hannawa Falls. Take a left on Browns Bridge Rd. Parking for the northwest entrance will be located before the bridge on the right in half a mile. Continue on Browns Bridge Rd. and take a left onto Lenny Rd., parking for the northeast entrance will be located on the right in 0.5 miles. Continue on Lenny Rd. and additional parking will be located on the right at 1.0 miles.

**Southern Trailheads** – From the intersection of Hwy 56 and Main St. in Colton, take a left on Main St. and the first left on River St., parking for the southwest entrance will be located along the road at the intersection. Continue on Main St. and take the second left on Riverside Dr. (after crossing the bridge). Parking for the southeast entrance will be located at the end of Riverside Dr.
