Col Kenneth R. Burton Jr. is Pacific Air Forces Deputy Chief of Staff, Headquarters Pacific Air Forces, Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii. He oversees staff actions of 950 Component MAJCOM personnel supporting the Commander of the Pacific Air Forces and the execution of United States INDOPACOM air operations. He aides in the development of strategic direction for three Numbered Air Forces, 10 Wings, and three Joint Bases with over 46,000 Airman across 36 nations. Additionally, Col Burton serves as the Pacific Air Forces Watch Center Director, overseeing Air Component integration and Battle Staff readiness across the joint competition continuum.

Col Burton is a career Weather Officer, certified Master Meteorologist, and Senior Parachutist. He entered the Air Force in 1994 serving four years in the Colorado Air National Guard as an enlisted Aircraft Hydraulic Systems specialist. He received his commission upon graduation from Air Force Officer Training School in 1998. His leadership experience includes various positions as flight commander, director of operations, squadron commander, group commander and headquarters staff officer in direct support of joint, US Air Force, US Army, and NATO activities. WATCH and ENDURING FREEDOM. Prior to his current position, Col Burton was the Commander, Air Force Operations Group, Pentagon, Washington D.C.
