A MESSAGE FROM DR. MATTHEWS

People ask me about the Rockford Public Schools. I tell them we have a great school district.

The skeptics reply, "Well you are supposed to say that. You're the Superintendent. Give me one good reason to believe that the schools are great."

I tell them, "I'll give you a bunch of reasons."

Reason one: A recent article on mlive.com today identified the top 50 school districts in Michigan based on their M-STEP performance. As you know, the M-STEP assessment is given to students in grades 3-8 and 11. The results show Rockford did very well.

- All subjects combined: Rockford 10th in the state
- English Language Arts: Rockford 10th in the state
- Mathematics: Rockford 11th in the state
- Science: Rockford 5th in the state
- · Social Studies: Rockford 22nd in the state

There are almost 600 school districts in the state of Michigan. This performance ranks Rockford academically among the top school districts in the state of Michigan.

But, as we all know, life is about more than a test score.

Reasons two, three, four, five, and six:

- Our Rockford High School Marching Band has won the Flight One (largest school category)
 Michigan Competing Band Association state championship for the past 6 years in a row.
- In 2023, Rebecca Kilgore, band teacher at East Rockford Middle School, was named the Michigan State Band and Orchestra Association band teacher of the year.
- In 2024, Mandy Scott, choir teacher at Rockford High School, was named the Michigan State Vocal Music Association vocal music teacher of the year.
- We have the largest athletic program in the state of Michigan.
- Our Rockford High School student council competed and won recognition for Rockford High School to be named as a School of Distinction, celebrating the positive school culture and climate.



SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION

SCHOOL CLOSINGS/DELAYS

The decision to close or delay school can be a tricky one. As a Michigan resident, you know how fickle our weather is. Just as weather systems can appear without warning, there are times when weather systems predicted to appear do not. Please keep in mind that a forecast is a prediction. Even skilled meteorologists will agree that not all watches, warnings, and advisories materialize as predicted.

School personnel carefully monitor weather forecasts and road conditions. The Rockford Public Schools district spans approximately 97 square miles. Therefore, weather and road conditions can be significantly different within our school district. Ultimately, the decision to close or delay school is made by the Superintendent of Schools, with every effort to make a decision by 5:30am.

In summary, weather is unpredictable and district staff does their best to make reasonable and practical decisions with the safety of students as their top priority. In addition, please keep in mind that weather conditions can rapidly improve or decline from the time a decision is made in the early hours of the morning to the time school is scheduled to start. If at any time you feel it is unsafe to send your child(ren) to school due to the weather or road conditions, you are encouraged to exercise your right to keep them home with an excused absence.

EARLY DISMISSALS

Once students are in school, it is only in extreme cases the district would dismiss early due to weather, mainly due to the fact that many of our younger students could potentially go home to an empty house. However, in the rare case of an early dismissal, this will be posted on TV and the district website, and parents will be notified via the district's automated School Messenger system and/or the school phone tree.

Occasionally when road conditions deteriorate during the day, a decision is made to dismiss students up to one-half hour early to allow buses additional travel time so students arrive home at their regularly scheduled time. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact your school principal or the Superintendent's Office at 616.863.6557. To receive free text information about School Closings or Delays, just send a text message of "Y" or "Yes" to 67587.

Morning closings and delays are posted on the district website and local TV/radio stations, with several stations offering notification options such as text or email alerts.

The Rockford Hall of Fame recognizes those who have demonstrated exceptional achievements in their chosen field or who have made significant contributions to the schools or the Rockford community.



GREGG DONLEY: CLASS OF 1983 Academic & Career Accomplishments

Gregg Donley, a 1983 graduate of Rockford High School, has had a distinguished career in the field of computer engineering. He earned both his B.S. and M.S. degrees from the University of Michigan, which laid the foundation for his work as a Design Engineer at Unisys from 1989 to 1995. Gregg later co-founded Network Virtual Systems, where he served as Director/VP of Engineering from 1996 to 2004. For the past two decades, Gregg has been a key contributor at Advanced Micro Devices (AMD), where he is an Engineering Fellow and holds multiple industry patents. Gregg's innovative work has left a lasting impact on the field of computer engineering, demonstrating his commitment

Together, they own Le Macaron and volunteer with the Down Syndrome Association of West Michigan and CASA. Their support for the Rockford Counseling Dog Program and other community initiatives highlights their dedication to making a positive impact in Rockford and beyond.



MIKE CUNEO
Honorary Achievement

Mike Cuneo served Rockford Public Schools for over 24 years, culminating in his role as Assistant Superintendent of Finance. Honorary Achievement

Terry Konkle is a revered educator and coach who spent his entire career teaching American Literature and writing at Rockford High School. Over 41 years, Terry coached football, basketball, tennis, and softball, achieving remarkable success, including back-to-back undefeated seasons in varsity basketball and leading the tennis team to a Class B runner-up finish. He also started the softball program in 1978, guiding the team to seven straight 20-win seasons. In 1990, Terry was honored as part of the first class of the Rockford Athletic Hall of Fame. Beyond athletics, Terry served on the Rockford Housing Commission for 18 years and the Rockford City Council, where he was elected Mayor in 2022. His dedication to preserving Rockford's history is evident in his work to establish the Rockford Area Museum, earning him a Daughters of the American Revolution National Community Service Award in 2014.



SAM CUNEO: CLASS OF 2015
Athletics

Sam Cuneo, a 2015 graduate of Rockford High School, is a decorated track and field athlete who earned 11 All-State and All-Academic honors during her high school career. Sam holds the 400m dash record at Rockford High School and was the MHSAA Division 1 State Champion in the 400m dash in 2015. She also holds the 200m dash record at RHS and placed 3rd in the 200m dash state finals three consecutive years. She continued her track career at Central Michigan University, where she was the 2017 Indoor Mid American 400m Conference Champion and helped break the CMU 4x400m relay indoor record, alongside winning the 2019 Indoor MAC Track and Field Championships with her team. Sam's dedication to her sport and her achievements on the track have made her a standout athlete in Rockford's history.

DREW POWELL: CLASS OF 2003

Athletics

Drew Powell, a 2003 graduate of Rockford High School, was an integral part of the Rams' 2003 State Championship Basketball team. A standout athlete in both football and basketball, Drew's leadership and athleticism were key to the team's success. After pursuing a career in business, Drew found his true calling in education and now teaches high school Spanish in Virginia. His journey from a state champion athlete to a dedicated educator reflects his commitment to making a positive impact on the lives of young people.



ANDI RAYMOND: CLASS OF 2010 Athletics

Andi Raymond, a 2010 graduate of Rockford High School, is a celebrated athlete who made her mark at Rockford High School as a four-year letter winner in lacrosse and 3-year letter winner in basketball. She led the Rams to a state title in lacrosse as a senior and set Michigan's single-season scoring record with 197 points as a junior. At Towson University, Andi continued to excel, earning multiple All-CAA honors and being named CAA Co-Player of the Year in 2014. Andi's collegiate career was capped by her inclusion on the Tewaaraton Award Watch List, recognizing her as one of the top female lacrosse players in the nation. Her athletic achievements and leadership on and off the field have cemented her legacy as one of Rockford's greatest athletes.



JOE STALEY: CLASS OF 2003

Athletics

Joe Staley, a 2003 graduate of Rockford High School, is a celebrated athlete who achieved remarkable success in football. A four-year football and track athlete at RHS, Joe went on to play for Central Michigan University before embarking on a 13-year career in the NFL. During his professional career, Joe earned six Pro Bowl selections, played in two Super Bowls, and was inducted into the Senior Bowl Hall of Fame. Joe's accomplishments on the field are a source of pride for the Rockford community, and his legacy as a Rockford Ram continues to inspire young athletes.
