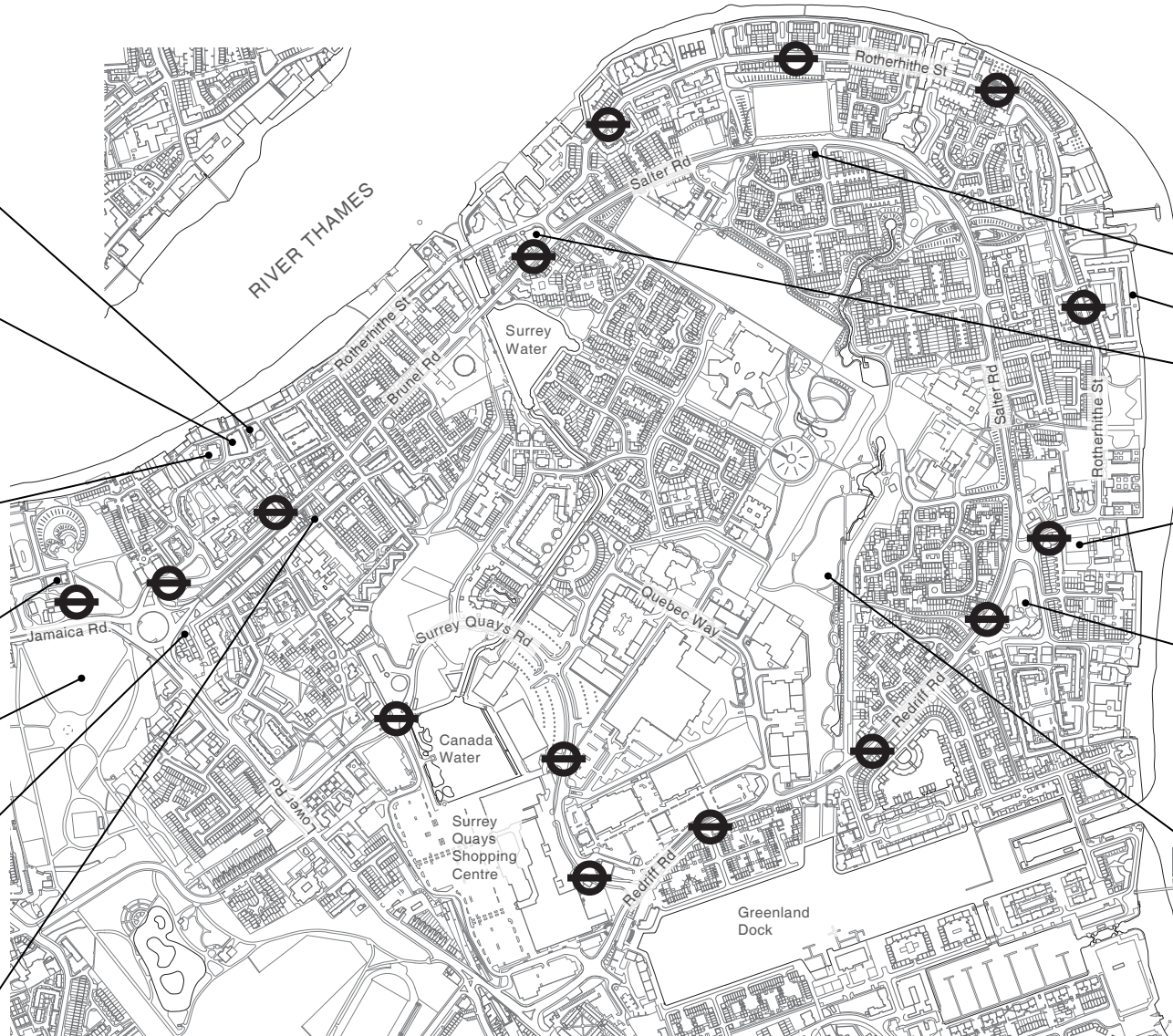

Russia Dock Woodland
35 acres of woodland, grassland, and linking ponds that runs through the spine of the Rotherhithe Peninsula. The wetland environment attracts a variety of rare birds, butterflies and insects to this part of inner London. Including Kingfishers, and reed warblers. RDW has an open green area with picnic benches where people can sit and relax in a peaceful and tranquil environment and central viewing point over docklands with sculpted map attracting rainwater into the water spaces.
