UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Pamela Bondi (Cal. No. 12) (PN11-2)
Christopher Wright (Cal. No. 10) (PN11-15)
Douglas Collins (Cal. No. 7) (PN11-5)

Ordered, That at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, February 3, 2025, the Senate vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the nomination of Pamela Bondi, of Florida, to be Attorney General.

Ordered further, That cloture having been invoked on the the nominations of Christopher Wright, of Colorado, to be Secretary of Energy and Douglas Collins, of Georgia, to be Secretary of Veterans Affairs, all post-cloture time be considered expired and the votes on confirmation of the nominations occur at times to be determined by the Majority Leader in consultation with the Democratic Leader, no earlier than Monday, February 3, 2025.

Ordered further, That if any nominations are confirmed during Monday's session, the motions to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table and the President be immediately notified of the Senate's actions. (*Jan. 30, 2025.*)
