School District Discipline Matrix

This is a guideline for administrative use as the situation warrants. Based on the situation Transformative Justice strategies including mediation may be implemented.

Parent contact is required for office referrals and contact can be made by school administration, teacher, or staff member.

Discipline, suspension, or expulsion of pupils SHALL NOT be based on race, color, religion, sex, national origin, or ancestry.

Administration will communicate with parent/guardian when referrals result in consequences. Communication may be written for, held in person, or by telephone.

The discipline matrix serves as the due process notice for Behavior/Violation standards in the Tolleson Elementary School District and is a guideline for administrative use as the situation warrants.

This matrix is a range of consequences that may be imposed for Behavior/Violations and violations of student conduct rules. Consequences for offenses are listed in the matrix, but based on severity of the Behavior/Violation, consequences may also include, but are not limited to:

- Warning and informal conference with school administrator discussing acceptable school Behavior/Violation
- Warning and formal conference with school administrator discussing acceptable school Behavior/Violation, formally documenting Behavior/Violations
- Temporary removal from class. Student will complete academic assignments during this time.
- Out of class detention
- Loss of privileges
- Individual assignment that is aligned to the offense
- In-school suspension where student is removed from class but remains on campus and under staff supervision. Students receive academic assignments to complete during this time.
- Short-term out of school suspension (1-10 days). Student is removed from school and placed in the custody of parents/guardian. A student who is out of school on short-term suspension is not allowed to attend any district functions or be on school campuses. Due process must be followed.
- Transformative justice strategies including mediation
- Removal from transportation
- Alternative placement

This is a guideline for administrative use as the situation warrants. Based on the situation Transformative Justice strategies including mediation may be implemented.

Schools will use all available resources to support student Behavior/Violations and collaborate with parent/guardian on possible additional services. Special Education Students may not be suspended for a cumulative total of more than 10 days per year if their Behavior/Violations are a manifestation of their disability.
