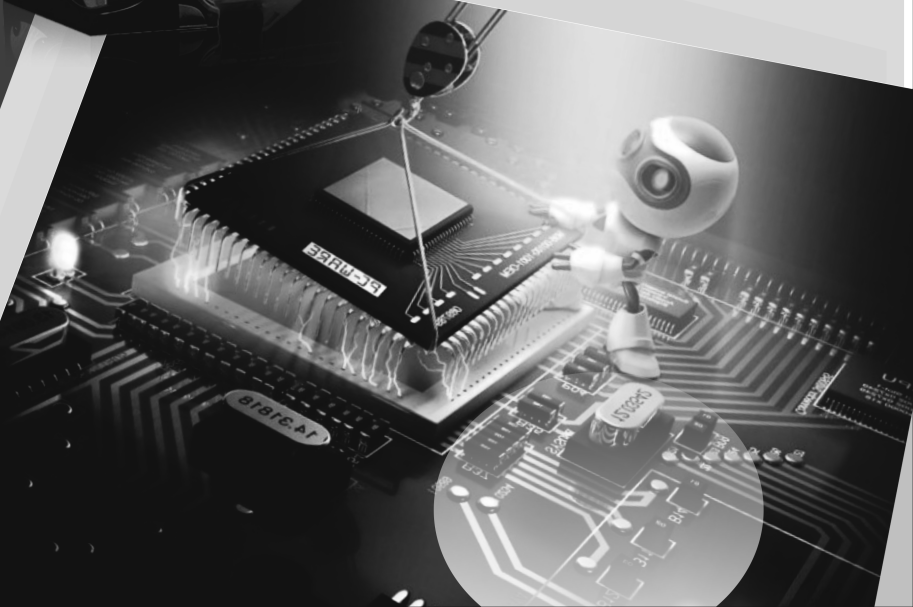
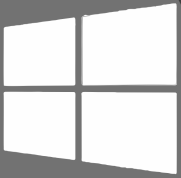

- D. 1. **Bit:** A bit is defined as a variable or computed quantity which can have only two values. A bit is the short term of binary digit. These binary digits are denoted by 0 and 1.

3. **Field:** A field is a collection of bytes which hold a single fact. For eg: Consider a data field like 24 August 2012. This data contains three fields namely date, month and year.
4. **Record:** Records are composed of fields, each of which contains one item of information. A set of records constitutes a file.

Both of them are complementary to each other. Hardware of the computer is an one-time expense of the computer while software of the computer is a continuing expense.
For example: If you buy a hard disk then you can store large amount of data in it. There is no need to buy hard disk regularly. But it is different in case of software as you need to buy various softwares to let the computer perform different tasks.
2. Computer hardwares are the parts that can be seen or touched. Without hardware a computer cannot run. All computer setups require a disk drive (like hard drive etc), monitor, keyboard, motherboard, Processor, Powersupply and video card in order to function properly. If any of these devices have any problem or are not found, an error would be encountered and the computer would not start.
3. It is possible to run a computer without a software being installed on it. But in some cases, if an operating system or an interpreter is not found on the computer then it would generate an error or show a blank screen on the monitor.

- C. 1. Disk Scanner is a utility program which can detect both physical and logical problems in the hard drive. It corrects these problems of the computer system. It also removes all the unnecessary files.
2. Disk cleanup is used to reduce the number of unnecessary files on the hard disk to free up disk space and help the computer run faster. It removes temporary files, empties the Recycle Bin and removes a variety of system files and other items that are no longer used.
3. If there is any problem in the computer system then you can use the system Restore feature. This system will be restored to the previous point after which the problem occurred.
4. Following are the steps to use Disk Scanner on the computer system:
- i) Click on start button.
 - ii) Click on computer.
The computer window will appear.
 - iii) All the hard drives will be visible. Click on the hard drive whose problems you want to check.
 - iv) Click on properties. The properties dialog box will appear.
 - v) Click on Tools tab.
 - vi) Click on check now.
When the User Account Control dialog box appears then type the administrator password and click submit or click continue.
The CheckDisk dialog box will appear.
 - vii) Click on any one of check boxes.
 1. Automatically fix file system errors:
To let check Disk fix the errors.
 2. Scan for and attempt recovery of bad sectors: To let check Disk look for bad factors.
 - viii) Click on start button
The hard drive check begins.
 - ix) After the drive check is over a dialog box will appear stating — click to schedule the scan disk when you restart windows.
